A bill to make appropriations for the department of military and veterans affairs for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2014; and to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations.

- 6 Sec. 204. The appropriations from part 1 for interdepartmental
- 7 grant funds received by the department from sources outside the
- 8 department consist of \$650,000.00 from the department of state
- 9 police.
- 10 Sec. 206. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1,
- 11 there is appropriated an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000.00 for
- 12 federal contingency funds. These funds are not available for
- 13 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item
- 14 in this act under section 393(2) of the management and budget act,
- 15 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.
- 16 (2) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
- 17 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000.00 for state
- 18 restricted contingency funds. These funds are not available for
- 19 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item
- 20 in this act under section 393(2) of the management and budget act,
- 21 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.
- 22 (3) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
- 23 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00 for local
- 24 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure
- 25 until they have been transferred to another line item in this act
- 26 under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,
- **27** MCL 18.1393.

- 1 (4) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
- 2 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00 for private
- 3 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure
- 4 until they have been transferred to another line item in this act
- 5 under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,
- 6 MCL 18.1393.
- 7 Sec. 207. The department shall provide the data necessary for
- 8 the department of technology, management, and budget to maintain a
- 9 searchable website that is accessible by the public at no cost that
- 10 includes, but is not limited to, all of the following:
- (a) Fiscal year-to-date expenditures by category.
- (b) Fiscal year-to-date expenditures by appropriation unit.
- (c) Fiscal year-to-date payments to a selected vendor,
- 14 including the vendor name, payment date, payment amount, and
- 15 payment description.
- 16 (d) The number of active department employees by job
- 17 classification.
- 18 (e) Job specifications and wage rates.
- 19 Sec. 208. The department shall use the Internet to fulfill the
- 20 reporting requirements of this act. This requirement may include
- 21 transmission of reports via electronic mail to the recipients
- 22 identified for each reporting requirement, or it may include
- 23 placement of reports on an Internet or Intranet site.
- Sec. 209. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used for
- 25 the purchase of foreign goods or services, or both, if
- 26 competitively priced and of comparable quality American goods or
- 27 services, or both, are available. Preference shall be given to

- 1 goods or services, or both, manufactured or provided by Michigan
- 2 businesses, if they are competitively priced and of comparable
- 3 quality. In addition, preference shall be given to goods or
- 4 services, or both, that are manufactured or provided by Michigan
- 5 businesses owned and operated by veterans, if they are
- 6 competitively priced and of comparable quality.
- 7 Sec. 210. The department shall take all reasonable steps to
- 8 ensure businesses in deprived and depressed communities compete for
- 9 and perform contracts to provide services or supplies, or both. The
- 10 director of the department shall strongly encourage firms with
- 11 which the department contracts to subcontract with certified
- 12 businesses in depressed and deprived communities for services,
- 13 supplies, or both.
- 14 Sec. 212. The department shall receive and retain copies of
- 15 all reports funded from appropriations in part 1. Federal and state
- 16 guidelines for short-term and long-term retention of records shall
- 17 be followed. The department may electronically retain copies of
- 18 reports unless otherwise required by federal and state quidelines.
- 19 Sec. 215. The department shall not take disciplinary action
- 20 against an employee for communicating with a member of the
- 21 legislature or his or her staff.
- Sec. 216. (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act,
- 23 the schedule of programs in part 1 lists programs which may, but
- 24 are not required to be, funded under this act.
- 25 (2) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this act, the
- 26 schedule of revenue sources in part 1 may or may not be received
- 27 from the funding entities listed.

- 1 (3) Any funding required by statute is not subject to funding
- 2 flexibility and shall be funded in accordance with that statute.
- 3 Sec. 217. The department shall improve its budgetary
- 4 efficiency pertaining to the delivery of core services delineated
- 5 in section 222 by doing all of the following:
- 6 (a) Prioritizing personnel over buildings in budgetary
- 7 efficiency considerations.
- 8 (b) Pursuing the physical or virtual consolidation of support
- 9 service functions such as information technology, human resources,
- 10 and accounting as a means of improving standardization and
- 11 efficiency.
- 12 (c) Seeking expenditure reductions whenever possible through
- 13 the streamlining of existing service delivery activities.
- 14 (d) Identifying efficiencies that can be gained via the
- 15 reduction or elimination of programs, policies, and practices which
- 16 have outlived their usefulness.
- Sec. 218. The department shall prepare a report on out-of-
- 18 state travel expenses not later than January 1 of each year. The
- 19 travel report shall be a listing of all travel by classified and
- 20 unclassified employees outside this state in the immediately
- 21 preceding fiscal year that was funded in whole or in part with
- 22 funds appropriated in the department's budget. The report shall be
- 23 submitted to the house and senate standing committees on
- 24 appropriations, the house and senate fiscal agencies, and the state
- 25 budget director. The report shall include the following
- 26 information:
- 27 (a) The dates of each travel occurrence.

- 1 (b) The total transportation and related costs of each travel
- 2 occurrence, including the proportion funded with state general
- 3 fund/general purpose revenues, the proportion funded with state
- 4 restricted revenues, the proportion funded with federal revenues,
- 5 and the proportion funded with other revenues.
- 6 Sec. 219. (1) The department shall provide quarterly reports,
- 7 beginning October 1, to the senate and house appropriations
- 8 subcommittees, and the senate and house fiscal agencies, which
- 9 provide the following data:
- 10 (a) A list of all major work projects, including a status
- 11 report of each project.
- 12 (b) The department's financial status, featuring a report of
- 13 budgeted versus actual expenditures by part 1 line item including a
- 14 year-end projection of budget requirements. If projected department
- 15 budget requirements exceed the allocated budget, the report shall
- 16 include a plan to reduce overall expenses while still satisfying
- 17 specified service level requirements.
- 18 (c) Evidence of efficiencies and management of funds within
- 19 established appropriations, documented through the DTMB monthly
- 20 expenditure report as described in section 301(3) of this part.
- 21 (d) A list of projected armory closings.
- 22 (e) A list of property sales as described in section 223 of
- 23 this part.
- 24 (f) A report on the status of performance metrics cited in
- 25 this act.
- 26 (2) The department shall provide a corrective action plan
- 27 within 30 days of a quarterly report under this section for any

- 1 requirements of this part that have not been achieved. The
- 2 department shall provide a monthly status of corrective action
- 3 plans.
- 4 (3) The department shall provide a summary of fund shifts,
- 5 that have been approved by the state budget office, that have
- 6 occurred between items listed in the schedule of programs mentioned
- 7 in part 1 on a quarterly basis to the senate and house
- 8 appropriations subcommittees on state police and military and
- 9 veterans affairs, and the senate and house fiscal agencies.
- 10 (4) The Grand Rapids and D.J. Jacobetti veterans' homes shall
- 11 provide to the appropriate senate and house appropriations
- 12 subcommittees the results of the veterans' homes annual veterans'
- 13 affairs inspection and their corrective action plans.
- 14 Sec. 220. The department shall provide the following data to
- 15 the appropriate senate and house appropriations subcommittees and
- 16 the senate and house fiscal agencies on an annual basis:
- 17 (a) Using information received from the grant recipients in
- 18 section 401 of this part, a progress report on metric requirements,
- 19 copies of certified financial audits and tax reports of grant
- 20 recipients, a listing from grant recipients of expenditures by
- 21 spending category, including a listing of individual salaries of
- 22 each officer and administrative staff, a listing of volunteer hours
- 23 including the hours, series, and donations provided to residents of
- 24 the Grand Rapids veterans' home and the D.J. Jacobetti veterans'
- 25 home. The department shall provide within the report a specific
- 26 notification whether any veterans grant recipients failed to comply
- 27 with established reporting requirements.

- 1 (b) The Grand Rapids veterans' home and the D.J. Jacobetti
- 2 veterans' home shall produce a report including an accounting of
- 3 member populations and bed space available, a description and
- 4 accounting of services and activities provided to members,
- 5 financial information, and current state nursing home licensure
- 6 status.
- 7 (c) A detailed report of the Michigan veterans' trust fund
- 8 that includes information on grants provided from the emergency
- 9 grant program, including details concerning the methodology of
- 10 allocations, the selection of emergency grant program authorized
- 11 agents, and a detailed breakdown of trust fund expenditures for
- 12 that year. The report shall also provide an update on the
- 13 department's efforts to reduce program administrative costs and
- 14 maintain the Michigan veterans' trust fund corpus to its original
- 15 amount of at least \$50,000,000.00.
- 16 Sec. 222. The appropriations in part 1 are for the core
- 17 services, support services, and work projects of the department,
- 18 including, but not limited to, the following core services:
- 19 armories and joint forces readiness, maintenance and operation of
- 20 army national guard training facilities and air bases, veterans
- 21 affairs agency, administration of the veterans trust fund,
- 22 administration and oversight of veterans advice, advocacy, and
- 23 assistance grants, training support for county veterans counselors,
- 24 administration of the military family relief fund, the Michigan
- 25 youth challeNGe academy program, and the administration of the
- 26 Grand Rapids veterans' home and the D.J. Jacobetti veterans' home.
- 27 Sec. 223. Sixty days prior to the public announcement of the

- 1 intention to sell any department property, the department shall
- 2 submit notification of that intent to the appropriate senate and
- 3 house appropriations subcommittees and the senate and house fiscal
- 4 agencies.
- 5 Sec. 225. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used by
- 6 the department to hire a person to provide legal services that are
- 7 the responsibility of the attorney general. This prohibition does
- 8 not apply to legal services for bonding activities and for those
- 9 activities that the attorney general authorizes.
- 10 Sec. 226. The department shall seek partnerships with United
- 11 States armed forces reserve units for the colocation of activities,
- 12 including sharing in the acquisition and costs for facilities.
- 13 Sec. 227. Bids for contract services shall not exclude public
- 14 employee unions from the bid process.
- 15 Sec. 228. Not later than November 15, the department shall
- 16 prepare and transmit a report that provides for estimates of the
- 17 total general fund/general purpose appropriations lapses at the
- 18 close of the fiscal year. This report shall summarize the projected
- 19 year-end general fund/general purpose appropriations lapses by
- 20 major departmental program or program areas. The report shall be
- 21 transmitted to the office of the state budget, the chairpersons of
- 22 the senate and house standing committees on appropriations, the
- 23 senate and house appropriations subcommittees, and the senate and
- 24 house fiscal agencies.
- 25 Sec. 229. Within 14 days after the release of the executive
- 26 budget recommendation, the department shall provide the state
- 27 budget director, the senate and house appropriations chairs, the

- 1 senate and house appropriations subcommittees on state police and
- 2 military and veterans affairs, and the senate and house fiscal
- 3 agencies with an annual report on estimated state restricted fund
- 4 balances, state restricted fund projected revenues, and state
- 5 restricted fund expenditures for the fiscal years ending September
- 6 30, 2013 and September 30, 2014.
- 7 Sec. 230. The department shall maintain, on a publicly
- 8 accessible website, a department scorecard that identifies, tracks,
- 9 and regularly updates key metrics that are used to monitor and
- 10 improve the agency's performance.

### 11 MILITARY

- Sec. 300. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
- 13 funding to support unclassified employee positions as authorized by
- 14 section 5 of article XI of the state constitution of 1963. These
- 15 positions include the following: department director, the adjutant
- 16 general for Michigan; assistant adjutant general army; assistant
- 17 adjutant general installations; assistant adjutant general air;
- 18 director, veterans affairs directorate; deputy director,
- 19 installations command; director, strategy and policy; director,
- 20 public safety project; and director, Michigan veterans affairs
- 21 agency.
- 22 (2) Not less than 30 days prior to the department submitting a
- 23 request for an additional unclassified employee position from the
- 24 civil service commission, or for any substantive change to the
- 25 duties of an existing unclassified employee position, the
- 26 department shall notify the senate and house appropriations

- 1 subcommittees on state police and military affairs and the senate
- 2 and house fiscal agencies.
- 3 Sec. 301. (1) The department shall provide administrative
- 4 support for department operations.
- 5 (2) The department shall maintain the staffing and resources
- 6 necessary to ensure proper accountability of state funds.
- 7 (3) The department shall maintain the staffing and resources
- 8 necessary to adhere to the state of Michigan financial management
- 9 guide for accounting, contracting, purchasing, budgeting, and
- 10 financial reporting and the administrative guide to state
- 11 government.
- 12 (4) The department shall ensure fiscal controls relating to
- 13 procurement of goods and services and other expenditures.
- Sec. 302. (1) The department shall operate and maintain
- 15 national quard armories.
- 16 (2) The department shall provide resources necessary to ensure
- 17 that armories are maintained in accordance with army regulations.
- 18 (3) The department shall evaluate armories for consolidation,
- 19 energy, and utility efficiency and identify work projects that
- 20 would improve this efficiency and submit a quarterly report on the
- 21 status and activities of the armories as provided in section 219.
- 22 (4) The department shall establish a system that measures the
- 23 condition and adequacy of armory facilities using both quality and
- 24 functionality criteria based off the installation status report-
- 25 infrastructure inspections that are conducted annually as a
- 26 requirement set forth by the national guard.
- 27 Sec. 304. (1) The department shall operate and maintain army

- 1 national guard training facilities, including Fort Custer and Camp
- 2 Grayling.
- 3 (2) The department shall maintain a system that measures the
- 4 condition and adequacy of air facilities using both quality and
- 5 functionality criteria.
- 6 (3) The department shall operate and maintain air national
- 7 guard air bases, including Selfridge air national guard base,
- 8 Battle Creek air national guard base, and Alpena combat readiness
- 9 training center.
- 10 Sec. 306. The department shall provide army and air national
- 11 guard forces, when directed, for state and local emergencies and in
- 12 support of national military requirements.
- Sec. 307. (1) The department shall maintain the Michigan youth
- 14 challeNGe academy to provide values, skills, education, and self-
- 15 discipline instruction for at-risk youth.
- 16 (2) The department shall provide the staffing and resources
- 17 necessary to train 144 cadets simultaneously at the Michigan youth
- 18 challeNGe academy.
- 19 (3) The department shall ensure that the average grade level
- 20 increase for Michigan youth challeNGe academy graduates is 2 years
- 21 as measured with the test adult basic education (TABE) metrics.
- 22 Sec. 308. (1) The department shall provide grants for
- 23 disbursement from the military family relief fund.
- 24 (2) The department shall provide quarterly reports to the
- 25 senate and house appropriations subcommittees quarterly of the fund
- 26 balance of the Michigan military family relief fund management.
- 27 (3) The department shall provide for the applications received

- 1 for assistance under the Michigan military family relief fund
- 2 management and report to the senate and house appropriations
- 3 subcommittees quarterly.
- 4 (4) The department shall provide sufficient staffing and other
- 5 resources to support the processing and approval of at least 60
- 6 grant applications for fiscal year 2013-2014 under the Michigan
- 7 military relief fund and report those applications at quarterly
- 8 senate and house appropriations subcommittee hearings.

# MICHIGAN VETERANS AFFAIRS AGENCY

- 10 Sec. 401. (1) The Michigan veterans affairs agency shall
- 11 provide outreach services to Michigan veterans that advise them on
- 12 the benefits to which they are entitled.
- 13 (2) The agency shall provide the percentage of Michigan
- 14 veterans contacted with a goal of 35% and report upon those
- 15 outreach findings at quarterly legislative hearings to the senate
- 16 and house appropriations subcommittees.
- 17 (3) The agency shall maintain the staffing partnerships and
- 18 other resources necessary to develop and operate an outreach
- 19 program that will communicate benefit eligibility information to
- 20 75% of the Michigan veterans population as determined by most
- 21 recent census data.
- 22 (4) The agency shall communicate veteran benefit information
- 23 pertaining to the Michigan military family relief fund, Michigan
- 24 veterans' trust fund, and United States department of veterans
- 25 affairs health, financial, and memorial benefits to which they are
- 26 entitled.

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- 1 (5) The agency shall provide sufficient staffing and other
- 2 resources to approve at least 5,295 requests for military discharge
- 3 certificates (DD-214) for fiscal year 2013-2014 and report to the
- 4 senate and house appropriations subcommittees quarterly.
- 5 (6) The agency shall provide claims processing services to
- 6 Michigan veterans in support of benefit claims submitted to the
- 7 United States department of veteran affairs for the health,
- 8 financial, and memorial benefits for which they are eligible.
- 9 (7) The agency shall maintain the staffing and resources
- 10 necessary to process a minimum of 500 claims per year.
- 11 (8) The agency shall ensure that a minimum of 20% of the
- 12 claims submitted by agency personnel are fully developed claims as
- 13 tracked by the United States department of veterans affairs and
- 14 report on this effort at quarterly legislative hearings to the
- 15 senate and house appropriations subcommittees.
- 16 (9) The agency shall provide training support for county
- 17 veterans counselors.
- 18 (10) The agency shall provide resources necessary to train
- 19 county veterans counselors per year to provide quality benefit
- 20 counseling services to veterans.
- 21 (11) The Michigan veterans affairs agency and the Michigan
- 22 veterans' trust fund administration shall take steps to assist the
- 23 county veterans counselors of this state to obtain training
- 24 necessary for the execution of their duties.
- 25 (12) The agency shall provide the percentage of county
- 26 counselors trained by the department at quarterly legislative
- 27 hearings to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees.

- 1 (13) The agency shall provide the percentages of fully
- 2 developed claims submitted by county counselors trained by the
