## SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5608

A bill to amend 2004 PA 46, entitled "Public safety officers benefit act," by amending the title and section 2 (MCL 28.632) and by adding section 4a.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

An act to provide compensation AND OTHER BENEFITS to
dependents of public safety officers who are killed or who are
permanently and totally disabled in the line of duty; to create the
public safety officers benefit fund; to prescribe the duties and
responsibilities of certain state officers; and to make an
appropriation.

Sec. 2. As used in this act:

- 1 (a) "Commission" means the commission on law enforcement
- 2 standards created under the commission on law enforcement standards
- 3 act, 1965 PA 203, MCL 28.601 to 28.616.
- 4 (b) "Dependent" means any individual who was substantially
- 5 reliant for support upon the income of the deceased public safety
- 6 officer.
- 7 (c) "Direct and proximate" means that the antecedent event is
- 8 a substantial factor in the result.
- 9 (d) "Firefighter" means a regularly employed member of a fire
- 10 department of a city, county, township, village, state university,
- 11 or community college or a member of the department of natural
- 12 resources who is employed to fight fires. Firefighter includes a
- 13 volunteer member of a fire department.
- 14 (e) "Law enforcement officer" means an individual involved in
- 15 crime and juvenile delinquency control or reduction or enforcement
- 16 of the criminal law. Law enforcement officer includes police,
- 17 corrections, probation, parole, bailiffs, or other similar court
- 18 officers.
- 19 (f) "Line of duty" means either of the following:
- (i) Any action which an officer whose primary function is crime
- 21 control or reduction, enforcement of the criminal law, or
- 22 suppression of fires is obligated or authorized by rule,
- 23 regulations, condition of employment or service, or law to perform,
- 24 including those social, ceremonial, or athletic functions to which
- 25 the officer is assigned, or for which the officer is compensated,
- 26 by the public agency he or she serves. For other officers, line of
- 27 duty means any action the officer is so obligated or authorized to

- 1 perform in the course or controlling or reducing crime, enforcing
- 2 the criminal law, or suppressing fires.
- 3 (ii) Any action which an officially recognized or designated
- 4 public employee member of a rescue squad or ambulance crew is
- 5 obligated or authorized by rule, regulation, condition of
- 6 employment or service, or law to perform.
- 7 (G) "MEDICAL BENEFIT PLAN" MEANS A PLAN THAT IS ESTABLISHED
- 8 AND MAINTAINED BY A CARRIER OR 1 OR MORE PUBLIC EMPLOYERS TO
- 9 PROVIDE FOR THE PAYMENT OF MEDICAL, OPTICAL, OR DENTAL BENEFITS,
- 10 INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, HOSPITAL AND PHYSICIAN SERVICES,
- 11 PRESCRIPTION DRUGS, AND RELATED BENEFITS, TO PUBLIC EMPLOYEES.
- 12 (H) <del>(q)</del> "Member of a rescue squad or ambulance crew" means AN
- 13 EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN, A MEDICAL FIRST RESPONDER, OR A
- 14 PARAMEDIC, AS THOSE TERMS ARE DEFINED IN SECTIONS 20904, 20906, AND
- 15 20908 OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH CODE, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.20904,
- 16 333.20906, AND 333.20908, OR an officially recognized or designated
- 17 employee or volunteer member of a rescue squad or ambulance crew.
- 18 (I) (h)—"Permanent and total disability" means medically
- 19 determinable consequences of a catastrophic, line-of-duty injury
- 20 that permanently prevent a former public safety officer from
- 21 performing any gainful work.
- 22 (J) (i) "Public safety officer" OR "OFFICER" means any
- 23 individual serving a public agency in an official capacity, with or
- 24 without compensation, as a law enforcement officer, firefighter,
- 25 rescue squad member, or ambulance crew member.OR MEMBER OF A RESCUE
- 26 SQUAD OR AMBULANCE CREW.
- 27 (K) (j) "Surviving spouse" means the husband or wife of the

- 1 deceased officer at the time of the officer's death, and includes a
- 2 spouse living apart from the officer at the time of the officer's
- 3 death for any reason.
- 4 SEC. 4A. IF A PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICER DIES IN THE LINE OF DUTY
- ON OR AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE AMENDATORY ACT THAT ADDED 5
- THIS SECTION, THIS STATE SHALL PROVIDE TO THE SURVIVING SPOUSE AND
- 7 THE DECEDENT'S DEPENDENTS A MEDICAL BENEFIT PLAN COMPARABLE TO, AND
- ON COMPARABLE TERMS TO, THE MEDICAL BENEFIT PLAN RECEIVED BY 8
- MICHIGAN STATE POLICE TROOPERS, IF THE DECEDENT HAD A MEDICAL 9
- BENEFIT PLAN FROM ANY SOURCE AT THE TIME OF HIS OR HER DEATH. 10
- 11 COVERAGE PROVIDED UNDER THIS SECTION ENDS FOR A SPOUSE IF HE OR SHE
- 12 QUALIFIES FOR AND OBTAINS A COMPARABLE MEDICAL BENEFIT PLAN FROM
- ANOTHER SOURCE. COVERAGE PROVIDED UNDER THIS SECTION ENDS FOR A 13
- NONSPOUSE DEPENDENT IF ANY OF THE FOLLOWING OCCUR: 14
- (A) THE DEPENDENT QUALIFIES FOR AND OBTAINS A COMPARABLE 15
- MEDICAL BENEFIT PLAN FROM ANOTHER SOURCE. 16
- (B) THE LATER OF THE DEPENDENT'S EIGHTEENTH BIRTHDAY OR, IF HE 17
- OR SHE IS ENROLLED AS A FULL-TIME STUDENT IN HIGH SCHOOL OR AN 18
- 19 ACCREDITED UNIVERSITY OR COLLEGE, HIS OR HER TWENTY-SIXTH BIRTHDAY.
