SUBSTITUTE FOR

SENATE BILL NO. 339

A bill to amend 1969 PA 287, entitled

"An act to regulate pet shops, animal control shelters, and animal protection shelters; to establish uniform procedures and minimum requirements for adoption of dogs, cats, and ferrets; and to prescribe penalties and civil fines and to provide remedies,"

by amending the title and sections 2 and 9 (MCL 287.332 and 287.339), the title and section 9 as amended by 1997 PA 7, and by adding section 11; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 TITLE

- 2 An act to regulate pet shops, animal control shelters, and
- 3 animal protection shelters, AND DOG BREEDING OPERATIONS; to
- 4 establish uniform procedures and minimum requirements for adoption
- 5 of dogs, cats, and ferrets; TO CREATE AN ANIMAL WELFARE COMMISSION;
- 6 TO PRESCRIBE ITS POWERS AND DUTIES; TO PRESCRIBE THE POWERS AND
- 7 DUTIES OF CERTAIN GOVERNMENTAL OFFICERS AND ENTITIES; and to

- 2 REPEAL ACTS AND PARTS OF ACTS.
- 3 Sec. 2. (1) The agriculture department shall issue SUBJECT TO
- 4 SUBSECTION (2), THE DEPARTMENT MAY PROMULGATE rules to accomplish
- 5 the purposes of this act and to establish minimum standards for THE
- 6 housing, care, and handling of animals to insure ENSURE the humane
- 7 care and handling of animals. The rules shall be promulgated in
- 8 accordance with the provisions of Act No. 88 of the Public Acts of
- 9 1943, as amended, being sections 24.71 to 24.80 of the Compiled

- 15 PROMULGATE RULES TO ESTABLISH FOR DOG BREEDING OPERATIONS MINIMUM
- 16 STANDARDS THAT ARE CONSISTENT WITH ACCEPTED ANIMAL WELFARE
- 17 STANDARDS. THE RULES SHALL NOT CONFLICT WITH THE COMMISSION'S
- 18 RECOMMENDATIONS UNDER SECTION 11(12). THE RULES MAY PROHIBIT
- 19 ACTIVITIES BY DOG BREEDING OPERATIONS, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED
- 20 TO, ACTIVITIES DESCRIBED IN SECTION 5A. THE RULES MAY REQUIRE
- 21 LICENSING AND INSPECTION OF DOG BREEDING OPERATIONS. IF LICENSING
- 22 IS REQUIRED, THE RULES SHALL PROVIDE FOR LICENSING FEES THAT DO NOT
- 23 EXCEED THE REASONABLE COSTS OF ADMINISTERING THE DEPARTMENT'S DOG
- 24 BREEDING OPERATION PROGRAM.
- 25 (3) RULES DESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION SHALL BE PROMULGATED
- 26 PURSUANT TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT OF 1969, 1969 PA 306,

- 1 (4) UNTIL THE DEPARTMENT PROMULGATES RULES UNDER SUBSECTION
- 2 (2), DOG BREEDING OPERATIONS SHALL COMPLY WITH 9 CFR 3.1 TO 3.19.
- 3 Sec. 9. (1) The licensing and registration requirements of
- 4 this act do not apply to a person ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 5 (A) AN INDIVIDUAL who breeds his or her own animals.
- 6 (B) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN RULES PROMULGATED UNDER
- 7 SECTION 2(2) or, BEFORE THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THOSE RULES, IN
- 8 REGULATIONS CITED IN SECTION 2(4), to a person subject to 1969 PA
- **9** 224, MCL 287.381 to 287.395.
- 10 (2) Subsection (1) does not create an exemption from
- 11 vaccination and licensing requirements under the dog law of 1919,
- 12 1919 PA 339, MCL 287.261 to 287.290, or from vaccination and
- 13 handling requirements under 1994 PA 358, MCL 287.891 to 287.901.
- 14 (3) This act does not require the alteration of a dog, cat, or
- 15 ferret being reclaimed from an animal control shelter or animal
- 16 protection shelter by its owner unless a local governmental
- 17 ordinance requires the alteration.
- 18 SEC. 11. (1) THE ANIMAL WELFARE COMMISSION IS CREATED WITHIN
- 19 THE DEPARTMENT. THE COMMISSION SHALL EXERCISE ITS POWERS AND DUTIES
- 20 INDEPENDENTLY OF THE DEPARTMENT, EXCEPT THAT BUDGETING,
- 21 PROCUREMENT, AND RELATED MANAGEMENT FUNCTIONS SHALL BE PERFORMED
- 22 UNDER THE DIRECTION AND SUPERVISION OF THE DIRECTOR.
- 23 (2) THE COMMISSION SHALL CONSIST OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS
- 24 APPOINTED BY THE DIRECTOR WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE

- 26 (A) TWO INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE EMPLOYEES OR BOARD MEMBERS OF AN
- 27 ANIMAL PROTECTION SHELTER THAT IS EXEMPT FROM TAXATION UNDER

- 1 SECTION 501(C)(3) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, 26 USC 501,
- 2 IS REGISTERED UNDER SECTION 6, AND ANNUALLY CARES FOR MORE THAN
- 3 2,000 DOGS.
- 4 (B) AN INDIVIDUAL MEMBER OF AN ANIMAL RESCUE ORGANIZATION THAT
- 5 IS EXEMPT FROM TAXATION UNDER SECTION 501(C)(3) OF THE INTERNAL
- 6 REVENUE CODE OF 1986, 26 USC 501.
- 7 (C) A LICENSED VETERINARIAN WHO IS ACCREDITED BY THE UNITED
- 8 STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND HAS EXPERIENCE IN ANIMAL
- 9 POPULATION HEALTH.
- 10 (D) TWO INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE INVOLVED IN ANIMAL CONTROL FOR
- 11 DIFFERENT LOCAL UNITS OF GOVERNMENT AND WHO ARE MEMBERS OF AN
- 12 ASSOCIATION OF ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICERS.
- 13 (E) AN INDIVIDUAL FROM ACADEMIA WHO SPECIALIZES IN ANIMAL
- 14 WELFARE.
- 15 (F) A MEMBER OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC.
- 16 (G) THREE DOG BREEDERS WHO ARE MEMBERS OF A NATIONAL
- 17 ORGANIZATION OF DOG BREEDERS AND OWNERS.
- 18 (H) THE DIRECTOR, WHO SHALL SERVE WITHOUT VOTE.
- 19 (3) THE MEMBERS FIRST APPOINTED TO THE COMMISSION SHALL BE
- 20 APPOINTED WITHIN 90 DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE 2016
- 21 AMENDATORY ACT THAT ADDED THIS SECTION.
- 22 (4) IF A VACANCY OCCURS ON THE COMMISSION, THE DIRECTOR SHALL
- 23 MAKE AN APPOINTMENT TO FILL THE VACANCY FOR THE BALANCE OF THE LIFE
- 24 OF THE COMMISSION IN THE SAME MANNER AS THE ORIGINAL APPOINTMENT.
- 25 (5) THE DIRECTOR MAY REMOVE A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION FOR
- 26 INCOMPETENCE, DERELICTION OF DUTY, MALFEASANCE, MISFEASANCE, OR
- 27 NONFEASANCE IN OFFICE, OR ANY OTHER GOOD CAUSE.

- 1 (6) THE FIRST MEETING OF THE COMMISSION SHALL BE CALLED BY THE
- 2 DIRECTOR. AT THE FIRST MEETING, THE COMMISSION SHALL ELECT FROM
- 3 AMONG ITS MEMBERS A CHAIRPERSON AND VICE-CHAIRPERSON AND OTHER
- 4 OFFICERS AS IT CONSIDERS APPROPRIATE. AFTER THE FIRST MEETING, THE
- 5 COMMISSION SHALL MEET AT LEAST QUARTERLY. A SPECIAL MEETING SHALL
- 6 BE HELD AT THE CALL OF THE CHAIRPERSON OR IF REQUESTED BY 5 OR MORE
- 7 MEMBERS. NOTICE OF A SPECIAL MEETING SHALL BE GIVEN TO MEMBERS AT
- 8 LEAST 3 BUSINESS DAYS IN ADVANCE.
- 9 (7) A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION CONSTITUTE A
- 10 QUORUM FOR THE TRANSACTION OF BUSINESS AT A MEETING OF THE
- 11 COMMISSION. APPROVAL OF A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS APPOINTED AND
- 12 SERVING IS REQUIRED FOR OFFICIAL ACTION OF THE COMMISSION. A
- 13 COMMISSION MEMBER SHALL NOT VOTE BY PROXY.
- 14 (8) THE BUSINESS THAT THE COMMISSION MAY PERFORM SHALL BE
- 15 CONDUCTED AT A PUBLIC MEETING OF THE COMMISSION HELD IN COMPLIANCE
- 16 WITH THE OPEN MEETINGS ACT, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 TO 15.275. A
- 17 WRITING PREPARED, OWNED, USED, IN THE POSSESSION OF, OR RETAINED BY
- 18 THE COMMISSION IN THE PERFORMANCE OF AN OFFICIAL FUNCTION IS
- 19 SUBJECT TO THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231
- 20 TO 15.246.
- 21 (9) WITHIN 45 DAYS AFTER APPOINTMENT AND CONFIRMATION OF ALL
- 22 MEMBERS, THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT BYLAWS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE
- 23 COMMISSION. THE BYLAWS SHALL INCLUDE VOTING PROCEDURES AND MINIMUM
- 24 REQUIREMENTS FOR ATTENDANCE AT MEETINGS.
- 25 (10) THE LEGISLATURE SHALL SET THE PER DIEM COMPENSATION FOR
- 26 MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION. EXPENSES OF MEMBERS INCURRED IN THE
- 27 PERFORMANCE OF OFFICIAL DUTIES SHALL BE REIMBURSED AS PROVIDED BY

- 1 LAW FOR STATE EMPLOYEES.
- 2 (11) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- (A) FURNISH ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES TO THE COMMISSION. 3
- 4 (B) PROVIDE SECRETARIAL AND OTHER STAFF NECESSARY FOR THE
- PROPER EXERCISE OF THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE COMMISSION. 5
- (C) PROVIDE ADEQUATE OFFICE SPACE TO THE COMMISSION. 6
- (D) GIVE NOTICE OF THE TIMES AND PLACES OF COMMISSION 7
- 8 MEETINGS.
- (E) KEEP MINUTES OF COMMISSION MEETINGS. 9
- (12) BY 9 MONTHS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE 2016 10
- 11 AMENDATORY ACT THAT ADDED THIS SECTION, THE COMMISSION SHALL SUBMIT
- 12 TO THE DEPARTMENT RECOMMENDATIONS FOR RULES DEFINING AND REGULATING
- DOG BREEDERS. 13
- (13) THE COMMISSION IS DISSOLVED 30 DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE 14
- DATE OF THE RULES PROMULGATED UNDER SECTION 2(2). 15
- (14) THIS SECTION IS REPEALED 2 YEARS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE 16
- OF THE AMENDATORY ACT THAT ADDED THIS SECTION. 17
- 18 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 19 unless House Bill No. 4898 of the 98th Legislature is enacted into
- 20 law.
