SUBSTITUTE FOR

SENATE BILL NO. 579

A bill to amend 1998 PA 58, entitled "Michigan liquor control code of 1998," by amending section 233 (MCL 436.1233).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 233. (1) The commission shall establish uniform prices
- 2 for the sale of alcoholic liquor in state liquor stores and by
- 3 specially designated distributors. The EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED
- 4 IN THIS SUBSECTION, THE prices shall MUST return a gross profit to
- 5 the commission of not less than 51% and not greater than 65%. If
- 6 alcoholic liquor purchased by the commission has not met sales
- 7 standards established by the commission for a period of 6 months,
- 8 the commission may sell the alcoholic liquor at a price to be
- 9 approved by the state administrative board. EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE

- 1 PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION AND SUBJECT TO PRICES APPROVED BY THE
- 2 STATE ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, THE COMMISSION
- 3 SHALL ESTABLISH UNIFORM PRICES UNDER THIS SUBSECTION THAT WILL
- 4 RETURN A GROSS PROFIT TO THE COMMISSION AS FOLLOWS:
- 5 (A) FOR 2018, NOT GREATER THAN 65%.
- 6 (B) FOR 2019, NOT GREATER THAN 64.5%.
- 7 (C) FOR 2020, NOT GREATER THAN 64.5% UNLESS THE 2019 TOTAL
- 8 SALES OF SPIRITS IN THIS STATE INCREASED BY AT LEAST 2% FROM THE
- 9 2018 SALES. IF THE 2019 TOTAL SALES OF SPIRITS IN THIS STATE
- 10 INCREASED AS DESCRIBED IN THIS SUBDIVISION, BEGINNING WITH THE
- 11 SECOND QUARTERLY PRICE FOR 2020, THE COMMISSION SHALL ESTABLISH
- 12 UNIFORM PRICES THAT WILL RETURN A PROFIT OF 64%.
- 13 (D) FOR 2021, NOT GREATER THAN THE PERCENTAGE ESTABLISHED BY
- 14 THE COMMISSION FOR 2020 UNLESS THE 2020 SALES OF SPIRITS IN THIS
- 15 STATE INCREASED BY AT LEAST 2% FROM THE 2019 SALES. IF THE 2020
- 16 SALES OF SPIRITS IN THIS STATE INCREASED AS DESCRIBED IN THIS
- 17 SUBDIVISION, BEGINNING WITH THE SECOND QUARTERLY PRICE FOR 2021,
- 18 THE COMMISSION SHALL ESTABLISH UNIFORM PRICES THAT WILL REDUCE THE
- 19 PERCENTAGE OF GROSS PROFIT BY 0.5 FROM THE PREVIOUS YEAR.
- 20 (E) FOR 2022, NOT GREATER THAN THE PERCENTAGE ESTABLISHED BY
- 21 THE COMMISSION FOR 2021 UNLESS THE 2021 SALES OF SPIRITS IN THIS
- 22 STATE INCREASED BY AT LEAST 2% FROM THE 2020 SALES. IF THE 2021
- 23 SALES OF SPIRITS IN THIS STATE INCREASED AS DESCRIBED IN THIS
- 24 SUBDIVISION, BEGINNING WITH THE SECOND QUARTERLY PRICE FOR 2022,
- 25 THE COMMISSION SHALL ESTABLISH UNIFORM PRICES THAT WILL REDUCE THE
- 26 PERCENTAGE OF GROSS PROFIT BY 0.5 FROM THE PREVIOUS YEAR.
- 27 (F) FOR 2023 AND EACH YEAR THEREAFTER, THE PERCENTAGE

- 1 ESTABLISHED IN SUBDIVISION (E).
- 2 (2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), the commission may
- 3 establish by rule prices for the sale of alcoholic liquor to
- 4 hospitals, charitable institutions, and military establishments
- 5 located in this state.
- 6 (3) There shall be allowed a discount of 17% deducted from the
- 7 sale price established by the commission on the sale of SPECIALLY
- 8 DESIGNATED DISTRIBUTORS AND ON-PREMISES LICENSEES ARE ENTITLED TO A
- 9 17% DISCOUNT FROM THE UNIFORM PRICE DESCRIBED UNDER SUBSECTION (1)
- 10 ON alcoholic liquor made by the PURCHASED FROM THIS state. liquor
- 11 stores to specially designated distributors and establishments
- 12 licensed to sell for consumption on the premises.
- 13 (4) NOT LATER THAN FEBRUARY 1, 2019 AND EACH FEBRUARY 1
- 14 THEREAFTER, A SMALL DISTILLER MAY FILE AN APPLICATION WITH THE
- 15 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT TO BE CERTIFIED AS
- 16 A QUALIFIED SMALL DISTILLER. AN APPLICATION UNDER THIS SUBSECTION
- 17 MUST BE ON A FORM PRESCRIBED AND FURNISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF
- 18 AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT. THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
- 19 AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT MAY CHARGE A REASONABLE CERTIFICATION FEE.
- 20 (5) BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2020, FOR EACH BOTTLE OF SPIRITS
- 21 PRODUCED BY A QUALIFIED SMALL DISTILLER, THE PRICE FOR EACH BOTTLE
- 22 MUST RETURN A GROSS PROFIT TO THE COMMISSION OF 32.5%.
- 23 (6) THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT SHALL
- 24 CERTIFY THAT AN APPLICANT UNDER SUBSECTION (4) IS A QUALIFIED SMALL
- 25 DISTILLER IF THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT
- 26 DETERMINES THAT AT LEAST 40% OF THE SMALL DISTILLER'S BASE
- 27 DISTILLATE IS DISTILLED FROM DISTILLED GRAIN GROWN AND HARVESTED IN

- 1 THIS STATE.
- 2 (7) NOT LATER THAN OCTOBER 1, 2019 AND EACH OCTOBER 1
- 3 THEREAFTER, THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT
- 4 SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE COMMISSION. A REPORT UNDER THIS
- 5 SUBSECTION MUST INCLUDE THE NAME OF EACH QUALIFIED SMALL DISTILLER
- 6 CERTIFIED UNDER SUBSECTION (6).
- 7 (8) A QUALIFIED SMALL DISTILLER CERTIFICATE EXPIRES ON
- 8 FEBRUARY 1 FOLLOWING THE DATE OF ISSUANCE.
- 9 (9) A SMALL DISTILLER THAT SUPPLIES FALSE INFORMATION TO THE
- 10 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT OR THE COMMISSION
- 11 UNDER THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR PUNISHABLE BY
- 12 IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN 1 YEAR OR A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN
- 13 \$3,000.00, OR BOTH. A SMALL DISTILLER THAT SUPPLIES FALSE
- 14 INFORMATION AS DESCRIBED IN THIS SUBSECTION SHALL PAY THE
- 15 COMMISSION THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE GROSS PROFIT THE COMMISSION
- 16 WOULD HAVE RECEIVED UNDER SUBSECTION (1) IF THE SMALL DISTILLER WAS
- 17 NOT A QUALIFIED SMALL DISTILLER, AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION.
- 18 (10) A QUALIFIED SMALL DISTILLER SHALL KEEP A COMPLETE AND
- 19 ACCURATE SET OF RECORDS AND ACCOUNTS OF ALL TRANSACTIONS PERTAINING
- 20 TO THE OPERATION OF ITS DISTILLERY, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO,
- 21 RECORDS AND ACCOUNTS OF ALL DISTILLED GRAIN RECEIVED IN OR
- 22 WITHDRAWN FROM THE DISTILLERY, ALL ACKNOWLEDGMENT FORMS AND
- 23 MICHIGAN CERTIFICATION OF ORIGINATION STATEMENTS IN THE QUALIFIED
- 24 SMALL DISTILLER'S POSSESSION, COPIES OF ALL CONTRACTS, AND
- 25 ACKNOWLEDGMENT FORMS RETURNED TO AND SETTLED BY THE QUALIFIED SMALL
- 26 DISTILLER. THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT AND
- 27 THE COMMISSION MAY EXAMINE THE RECORDS AND ACCOUNTS PERTAINING TO

- 1 THE QUALIFIED SMALL DISTILLER'S DISTILLED GRAIN HANDLING BUSINESS
- 2 AT ANY TIME DURING NORMAL BUSINESS HOURS.
- 3 (11) AS USED IN THIS SECTION:
- 4 (A) "ACKNOWLEDGMENT FORM" MEANS A SCALE WEIGHT TICKET, A LOAD
- 5 SLIP, OR ANY OTHER EVIDENCE OF DEPOSIT ISSUED BY A SMALL DISTILLER
- 6 OR THE SMALL DISTILLER'S AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE TO A DEPOSITOR
- 7 THAT IDENTIFIES THE DISTILLED GRAIN BEING TRANSFERRED FROM
- 8 POSSESSION OF THE DEPOSITOR TO THE POSSESSION OF THE SMALL
- 9 DISTILLER.
- 10 (B) "DEPOSITOR" MEANS EITHER OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 11 (i) A PERSON THAT DELIVERS DISTILLED GRAIN TO A SMALL
- 12 DISTILLER FOR STORAGE, PROCESSING, SHIPMENT, OR SALE AND THAT HAS
- 13 TITLE TO DISTILLED GRAIN AT THE TIME OF DELIVERY.
- 14 (ii) A PERSON THAT OWNS OR THAT IS THE LEGAL HOLDER OF AN
- 15 ACKNOWLEDGMENT FORM ISSUED BY A DEPOSITOR FOR DISTILLED GRAIN.
- 16 (C) "DISTILLED GRAIN" MEANS ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 17 (i) DRY BARLEY.
- 18 (ii) MALTED BARLEY.
- 19 (iii) OATS.
- 20 (iv) A SMALL GRAIN.
- 21 (v) A CEREAL GRAIN.
- vi) POTATO.
- (vii) CORN.
- 24 (viii) FRUIT.
- 25 (D) "MICHIGAN CERTIFICATION OF ORIGINATION STATEMENT" MEANS A
- 26 SIGNED STATEMENT FROM A DEPOSITOR OR PRODUCER ON AN ACKNOWLEDGEMENT
- 27 FORM THAT DEPOSITED DISTILLED GRAIN WAS GROWN AND HARVESTED IN THIS

- 1 STATE.
- 2 (E) "QUALIFIED SMALL DISTILLER" MEANS A SMALL DISTILLER
- 3 CERTIFIED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT
- UNDER THIS SECTION AS HAVING AT LEAST 40% OF THE SMALL DISTILLER'S
- 5 BASE DISTILLATE DISTILLED FROM DISTILLED GRAIN GROWN AND HARVESTED
- 6 IN THIS STATE.
