SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4516

A bill to amend 1976 PA 220, entitled "Persons with disabilities civil rights act,"

(MCL 37.1101 to 37.1607) by adding section 102a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 102a. (1) The commission shall adopt and post on the department of civil rights' website a standardized design that is a variation of the current international symbol of access. The design must comply with all of the following:
 - (a) Depict a dynamic character leaning forward in a wheelchair with a sense of movement.
 - (b) Provide a contrasting background with either a light symbol on a dark background or a dark symbol on a light background.
 - (c) Provide substantially equivalent or greater accessibility
