SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 277

A bill to provide definitions for the forensic science commission act.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) This act shall be known and may be cited as the 2 "forensic science commission definitions act".
 - (2) As used in the forensic science commission act:
 - (a) "Commission" means the forensic science commission created in section 3 of the forensic science commission act.
 - (b) "Corrective action" means an action taken to control and correct issues of and address the consequences of nonconformance.
- 8 (c) "Forensic analysis" means a medical, chemical,
 9 toxicological, ballistic, or other expert examination or test
 10 performed on physical evidence, including DNA evidence, for the



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- purpose of determining the connection of the evidence to a criminal 1
- action. Forensic analysis includes an examination or test requested 2
- by a law enforcement agency, prosecuting attorney, criminal suspect 3
- or defendant, or court in a criminal action. Forensic analysis does 4
- not include an expert examination or test, including, but not 5
- 6 limited to, a statistical or engineering analysis, conducted for
- 7 the purpose of opining on a specific aspect of the forensic
- evidence or the type of forensic test utilized, or an expert 8
- 9 examination or test conducted principally for the purpose of
- 10 scientific research, medical practice, civil or administrative
- 11 litigation, or other purpose unrelated to determining the
- connection of physical evidence to a criminal action. 12
- (d) "Forensic analyst" means an individual who technically 13
- 14 reviews or performs a forensic analysis or draws conclusions from
- 15 or interprets a forensic analysis.
- (e) "Forensic laboratory" includes a public or private 16
- laboratory or other entity that conducts a forensic analysis. 17
- (f) "Forensic medical service provider" means a forensic 18
- 19 medicine agency or forensic medicine practitioner providing
- 20 forensic medicine services.
- (g) "Forensic medicine" means the application of medical 21
- 22 knowledge and practices to the investigation of the medicolegal
- 23 aspects of death, injury, neglect, or behavior in a criminal
- 24 prosecution.
- 25 (h) "Forensic medicine agency" means an entity, or an agency
- 26 of this state, that employs forensic medicine practitioners and
- 27 issues reports prepared by forensic medicine practitioners.
- (i) "Forensic science" means the field of study of medical, 28
- 29 chemical, toxicological, ballistic, or other expert examinations or

- 1 tests performed on physical evidence, including DNA evidence, for
- 2 the purpose of determining the connection of the evidence to a
- 3 criminal action, except that forensic science does not include the
- 4 study of the portion of an autopsy conducted by a medical examiner
- 5 or other forensic pathologist who is a licensed physician.
- 6 (j) "Forensic science agency" means an entity, or an agency of
- 7 this state, that employs forensic science practitioners and issues
- 8 reports prepared by forensic science practitioners.
- 9 (k) "Forensic science service provider" means a forensic
- 10 science agency or forensic science practitioner providing forensic
- 11 science services.
- 12 (l) "Nonconformance" means a mistake in the course of the
- 13 forensic science process that has affected the accuracy and
- 14 reliability of the work of forensic science service providers.
- 15 Enacting section 1. This act takes effect 90 days after the
- 16 date it is enacted into law.
- 17 Enacting section 2. This act does not take effect unless
- 18 Senate Bill No. 276 of the 100th Legislature is enacted into law.
