

HOUSE BILL No. 4382

February 9, 1995, Introduced by Reps. McNutt, Bush, Profit, Dalman, Porreca and Galloway and referred to the Committee on Higher Education.

A bill to provide for a waiver of tuition at state public institutions of higher education for children and surviving spouses of Michigan police officers killed in the line of duty; and to provide for an appropriation.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the 2 "police officer's survivor tuition act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Child" means an individual who is a natural or adopted
- 5 child of a deceased Michigan police officer and who was under the
- 6 age of 21 at the time of the Michigan police officer's death.
- 7 (b) "Department" means the department of education.
- 8 (c) "Killed" means that the Michigan police officer's death
- 9 is the direct and proximate result of a traumatic injury or a

- 1 disease or condition caused by or resulting from a traumatic
 2 injury.
- 3 (d) "Line of duty" means an action that a Michigan police
- 4 officer is obligated or authorized to perform by rule, regula-
- 5 tion, condition of employment or service, or law, including, but
- 6 not limited to, a social, ceremonial, or athletic function that
- 7 the Michigan police officer is assigned to or compensated for by
- 8 the public agency he or she serves.
- 9 (e) "Michigan police officer" means a sheriff or sheriff's
- 10 deputy of a sheriff's department in this state; village or town-
- 11 ship marshal of a village or township in this state; officer of
- 12 the police department of any city, village, or township in this
- 13 state; officer of the Michigan state police; or any other police
- 14 officer or law enforcement officer trained and certified pursuant
- 15 to the Michigan law enforcement officers training council act of
- 16 1965, Act No. 203 of the Public Acts of 1965, being sections
- 17 28.601 to 28.616 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- (f) "Occupational disease" means a disease that routinely
- 19 constitutes a special hazard in, or is commonly regarded as con-
- 20 comitant of, the Michigan police officer's occupation.
- 21 (g) "State institution of higher education" means a public
- 22 community or junior college established under section 7 of arti-
- 23 cle VIII of the state constitution of 1963 or part 25 of the
- 24 school code of 1976, Act No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1976,
- 25 being sections 380.1601 to 380.1607 of the Michigan Compiled
- 26 Laws, or a state university described in section 4, 5, or 6 of
- 27 article VIII of the state constitution of 1963.

- (h) "Traumatic injury" means a wound or the condition of the
- 2 body caused by external force, including, but not limited to, an
- 3 injury inflicted by bullet, explosive, sharp instrument, blunt
- 4 object or other physical blow, chemical, electricity, climatic
- 5 condition, infectious disease, radiation, or bacteria, but
- 6 excluding an injury resulting from stress, strain, or occupa-
- 7 tional disease.
- 8 Sec. 3. (1) Subject to the limitations in subsections (2)
- 9 and (3), a state institution of higher education shall waive
- 10 tuition for each child and surviving spouse of a Michigan police
- 11 officer who has been or is killed in the line of duty if the
- 12 child or surviving spouse meets all of the following
- 13 requirements:
- (a) Applies, qualifies, and is admitted as a full-time,
- 15 part-time, or summer school student.
- (b) Is a legal resident of the state for at least the 12
- 17 consecutive months immediately preceding his or her application.
- 18 (c) Applies to the department for tuition waiver under this
- 19 act and provides evidence satisfactory to the department that he
- 20 or she is the child or the surviving spouse of a Michigan police
- 21 officer who was killed in the line of duty, that the course or
- 22 courses for which he or she is seeking a tuition waiver meet the
- 23 requirements of subsection (2), and that he or she meets the
- 24 other requirements of this section.
- 25 (d) For a child of a Michigan police officer who was killed
- 26 in the line of duty, applies under subdivision (c) for the first
- 27 time before the age of 21.

- 1 (e) Is certified by the financial aid officer at the state
- 2 institution of higher education as needing the tuition waiver in
- 3 order to meet recognized educational expenses. If the child's or
- 4 surviving spouse's family income, excluding any income from death
- 5 benefits attributable to the police officer's death, is below
- 6 400% of poverty level under federal poverty guidelines published
- 7 by the United States department of health and human services,
- 8 income from any death benefits accruing to the child or surviving
- 9 spouse as a result of the police officer's death shall not be
- 10 counted as family income in determining financial need under this
- 11 subdivision.
- 12 (2) A state institution of higher education shall waive
- 13 tuition under this act only for courses that are applicable
- 14 toward the degree or certificate requirements of the program in
- 15 which the child or surviving spouse is enrolled.
- 16 (3) A child or surviving spouse of a Michigan police officer
- 17 who was killed in the line of duty is eligible for tuition waiver
- 18 under this section for not more than a total of 11 semesters or
- 19 the equivalent number of terms or quarters.
- 20 Sec. 4. (1) Upon receiving an application under
- 21 section 3(c), the department shall determine whether the appli-
- 22 cant and the courses for which tuition waiver is sought meet the
- 23 requirements of section 3 and, if so, shall approve the applica-
- 24 tion and notify the state institution of higher education that
- 25 the application has been approved.
- 26 (2) Upon application by the state institution of higher
- 27 education, the department annually shall reimburse each state

- 1 institution of higher education for the total amount of tuition
- 2 waived during the immediately preceding fiscal year under
- 3 section 3. The department annually shall report to the legisla-
- 4 ture the number of individuals for whom tuition has been waived
- 5 at each state institution of higher education and the total
- 6 amounts to be paid under this act for that fiscal year.
- Sec. 5. The department shall provide the necessary forms
- 8 and applications and shall cooperate with the state institutions
- 9 of higher education in developing efficient procedures for imple-
- 10 menting the purposes of this act.
- 1! Sec. 6. The legislature annually shall appropriate the
- 12 funds necessary to implement this act.
