

## **HOUSE BILL No. 4610**

March 16, 1995, Introduced by Reps. Munsell, Owen, Nye, Walberg, Freeman, Whyman, Horton, Green, Geiger, Pitoniak, DeMars, Randall, Kukuk, Baade and London and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend sections 16401 and 16423 of Act No. 368 of the Public Acts of 1978, entitled as amended "Public health code," being sections 333.16401 and 333.16423 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Sections 16401 and 16423 of Act No. 368 of the
- 2 Public Acts of 1978, being sections 333.16401 and 333.16423 of
- 3 the Michigan Compiled Laws, are amended to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 16401. (1) As used in this part:
- 5 (a) "Chiropractor", "chiropractic physician", "doctor of
- 6 chiropractic", or "d.c." means an individual licensed under this
- 7 article to engage in the practice of chiropractic.
- 8 (b) "Practice of chiropractic" means that discipline within
- 9 the healing arts -which- THAT deals with the nervous system and

- I its relationship to the spinal column, WITH EXTREMITIES, and
- 2 -its WITH THEIR interrelationship with other body systems.
- 3 Practice OF CHIROPRACTIC DOES NOT INCLUDE THE PERFORMANCE OF
- 4 INCISIVE SURGICAL PROCEDURES, THE PERFORMANCE OF AN INVASIVE SUR-
- 5 GICAL PROCEDURE REQUIRING INSTRUMENTATION, OR THE DISPENSING OR
- 6 PRESCRIBING OF DRUGS OR MEDICINE. SUBJECT TO SECTION 16423,
- 7 PRACTICE of chiropractic includes:
- 8 (i) Diagnosis, including spinal analysis AND EXAMINATION, to
- 9 determine the existence of spinal subluxations or misalignments
- 10 that produce nerve interference OR OTHER HUMAN AILMENTS, indicat-
- 11 ing the necessity for chiropractic care.
- (ii) The adjustment of -spinal subluxations or misalign-
- 13 ments and related OF bones and tissues for the establishment of
- 14 neural integrity utilizing the inherent recuperative powers of
- 15 the body for restoration and maintenance of health.
- 16 (iii) The use of analytical instruments, nutritional advice,
- 17 rehabilitative exercise, and adjustment apparatus WITH OR WITH-
- 18 OUT ASSISTIVE DEVICES regulated by rules promulgated by the board
- 19 pursuant to section 16423, and the use of x-ray machines, IMAGING
- 20 TECHNOLOGY, AND BY REFERRAL OTHER TESTS in the examination of
- 21 patients. for the purpose of locating spinal subluxations or
- 22 misaligned vertebrae of the human spine. The practice of chiro
- 23 practic does not include the performance of incisive surgical
- 24 procedures, the performance of an invasive procedure requiring
- 25 instrumentation, or the dispensing or prescribing of drugs or
- 26 medicine.

- 1 (2) In addition to the definitions in this part, article 1 2 contains general definitions and principles of construction 3 applicable to all articles in this code and part 161 contains 4 definitions applicable to this part.
- Sec. 16423. (1) The board shall promulgate rules to
  6 establish criteria for the approval of analytical instruments
