

HOUSE BILL No. 5216

October 10, 1995, Introduced by Reps. Bush, Brewer, Jellema and McBryde and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend sections 669, 719, 721, and 722a of Act No. 300 of the Public Acts of 1949, entitled as amended "Michigan vehicle code,"

section 669 as amended by Act No. 188 of the Public Acts of 1990, section 719 as amended by Act No. 127 of the Public Acts of 1992, section 721 as amended by Act No. 75 of the Public Acts of 1990, and section 722a as amended by Act No. 249 of the Public Acts of 1993, being sections 257.669, 257.719, 257.721, and 257.722a of the Michigan Compiled Laws; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Sections 669, 719, 721, and 722a of Act No. 300
- 2 of the Public Acts of 1949, section 669 as amended by Act No. 188
- 3 of the Public Acts of 1990, section 719 as amended by Act No. 127
- 4 of the Public Acts of 1992, section 721 as amended by Act No. 75

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- 1 of the Public Acts of 1990, and section 722a as amended by Act
- 2 No. 249 of the Public Acts of 1993, being sections 257.669,
- 3 257.719, 257.721, and 257.722a of the Michigan Compiled Laws, are
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 669. (1) Except as provided in subsections (2), (3),
- 6 and (4), the driver of a motor vehicle carrying passengers for
- 7 hire OR THE DRIVER OF A MOTOR VEHICLE THAT IS REQUIRED TO BE
- 8 MARKED OR PLACARDED UNDER 49 C.F.R. PARTS 100 TO 180 before
- 9 crossing a railroad track at grade, shall stop the vehicle within
- 10 50 feet but not less than 10 feet or not less than 15 feet in
- 11 the case of a vehicle carrying hazardous materials on which a
- 12 placard is required to be posted pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 171 parts
- 13 100 to 199, from the nearest rail. and while WHILE stopped,
- 14 THE DRIVER shall listen and look in both directions along the
- 15 track for an approaching train and for signals indicating the
- 16 approach of a train, and shall not proceed until the driver can
- 17 do so safely. After stopping as required in this subsection, and
- 18 upon proceeding when it is safe to do so, the driver of the vehi-
- 19 cle shall cross only in a gear of the vehicle that does not
- 20 require changing gears while traversing the crossing. The driver
- 21 shall not shift gears while crossing the track or tracks.
- 22 (2) A stop need not be made at a railroad track grade cross-
- 23 ing where a police officer or a traffic-control signal directs
- 24 traffic to proceed.
- 25 (3) A stop need not be made at an abandoned railroad track
- 26 grade crossing. As used in this subsection, "abandoned railroad

- 1 track" means a railroad track which meets all of the following
 2 requirements:
- (i) The track has been abandoned pursuant to Act No. 56 of
- 4 the Public Acts of 1919, being sections 469.241 to 469.246 of the
- 5 Michigan Compiled Laws, section 14 of Act No. 300 of the Public
- 6 Acts of 1909, as amended, being section 462.14 of the Michigan
- 7 Compiled Laws; or federal law.
- (ii) The track has been covered or removed.
- 9 (iii) All signs, signals, and other warning devices are 10 removed.
- 11 (4) A stop shall not be made at a railroad track grade
- 12 crossing on a freeway or limited access highway where the cross
- 13 ing is protected by a clearly visible signal, crossing gate, or
- 14 barrier at a time when the signal, crossing gate, or barrier is
- 15 not activated AN INDUSTRIAL OR SPUR LINE RAILROAD GRADE CROSSING
- 16 MARKED WITH A SIGN READING "EXEMPT". EXEMPT SIGNS SHALL BE
- 17 ERECTED ONLY BY OR WITH THE CONSENT OF THE STATE TRANSPORTATION
- 18 DEPARTMENT OR THE LOCAL AUTHORITY HAVING JURISDICTION.
- 19 (5) A person who violates this section on or after August
- 20 +, 1979, is responsible for a civil infraction.
- 21 Sec. 719. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), a A
- 22 vehicle unloaded or with load shall not exceed a height of 13
- 23 feet 6 inches. The owner of a vehicle -which THAT collides with
- 24 a lawfully established bridge or viaduct -shall-be- IS liable for
- 25 all damage and injury resulting from a collision caused by the
- 26 height of the vehicle, whether the clearance of the bridge or
- 27 viaduct is posted or not.

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-(2) A truck, truck tractor, semitrailer, or trailer
2 manufactured on or after July 27, 1978, shall not be used to
3 transport flammable liquids, in bulk, having a flash point at or
4 below 70 degrees Fahrenheit, if the truck, truck tractor, semi-
5 trailer, or trailer exceeds 11 feet 8 1/2 inches in height.
6 However, safety equipment and those appurtenances which are
7 required by state law, when added to a vehicle, may cause the
8 vehicle height to exceed 11 feet 8 1/2 inches, but shall not
9 cause the vehicle height to exceed 13 feet 6 inches. A person
10 who violates this subsection is quilty of a misdemeanor.
       (3) A vehicle, except a truck tractor, trailer, or semi
12 trailer, including load, or articulated buses operated by a local
13 public transit system funded by Act No. 51 of the Public Acts of
14 1951, being sections 247.651 to 247.675 of the Michigan Compiled
15 Laws, shall not exceed a total length of 40 feet. The total
16 length of a semitrailer operating in a truck tractor and semi
17 trailer combination shall not exceed 53 feet, including load.
18 All-semitrailers longer than 50 feet shall have a wheelbase of
19 40.5 feet plus or minus 0.5 feet, measured from the kingpin cou
20 pling to the center of the rear axles or to the center of the
21 tandem axle assembly if equipped with 2 axles. Articulated buses
22 operated by a local public transit system funded by Act No. 5+ of
23 the Public Acts of 1951 may operate with a maximum length of 65
24 feet. A combination of truck tractor, semitrailer, and trailer,
25 or truck and semitrailer or trailer, or a combination of truck
26 tractor and 2 semitrailers, including load, shall not exceed a
27 total overall length of 59 feet except as provided for on routes
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1 designated and approved by the state transportation department 2 and by local authorities with respect to highways under their 3 jurisdiction on which a person may operate a combination of a 4 truck tractor, semitrailer, and trailer or a truck tractor and 2 5 semitrailers with no limit on the overall combination length, if 6 the length of each semitrailer or trailer including load does not 7 exceed 28 1/2 feet or the overall length of the semitrailer and 8 trailer or 2 semitrailers as measured from the front of the first 9 towed unit to the rear of the second towed unit while the units 10 are coupled together does not exceed an overall length of 58 11 feet, including load. The state transportation department and 12 local authorities with respect to highways under their jurisdic 13 tion may designate highways where the overall length of a truck 14 and trailer or semitrailer shall not exceed 65 feet. A truck 15 tractor and semitrailer combination with a semitrailer length 16 longer than 50 feet shall not be allowed to operate with more 17 than 2 axles on the semitrailer. All truck tractor and semi 18 trailer combinations with a semitrailer length longer than 19 50 feet shall travel exclusively on highways designated by the 20 appropriate road authority. City, village, or county authorities 21 shall have the option of prohibiting stops within their jurisdic 22 tions unless the stop occurs along appropriately designated 23 routes, or is necessary for emergency purposes or to reach ship 24 pers, receivers, warehouses, and terminals along designated 25 routes. A truck tractor shall not haul more than 1 trailer and 1 26 semitrailer or more than 2 semitrailers in combination at any 1

27 time, except that a farm tractor may haul 2 wagons or trailers,

- 1 or garbage and refuse haulers may, during daylight hours, haul up
- 2 to 4 trailers for garbage and refuse collection purposes, not
- 3 exceeding in any combination a total length of 55 feet at a speed
- 4 of not to exceed 15 miles per hour. In determining the length of
- 5 a vehicle or a vehicle combination under this subsection, the
- 6 length shall not be considered to include safety and energy con-
- 7 servation devices including, but not be limited to, impact
- 8 absorbing bumpers, rear view mirrors, turn signals lamps, marker
- 9 lamps, steps and hand holds for entry and egress, flexible fender
- 10 extensions, mud flaps, or splash and spray suppressant devices;
- 11 load induced tire bulge; refrigeration or heating units; or air
- 12 compressors. A device shall be excluded from a determination of
- 13 length only if it is not designed or used for the carrying of
- 14 cargo. Semitrailers and trailers shall be measured from the
- 15 front vertical plane of the foremost transverse load supporting
- 16 structure to the rearmost transverse load supporting structure.
- 17 (4) If a combination of 2 semitrailers is pulled by a truck
- 18 tractor, a fifth wheel connecting assembly which conforms with
- 19 motor carrier safety rules promulgated by the department of state
- 20 police pursuant to the motor carrier safety act of 1963, Act
- 21 No. 181 of the Public Acts of 1963, as amended, being sections
- 22 480.11 to 480.21 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, shall be used on
- 23 each semitrailer.
- 24 (5) A train of vehicles or a vehicle operated alone shall
- 25 not carry a load extending more than 3 feet beyond the front of
- 26 the train of vehicles or vehicle.

(6) A truck tractor and semitrailer combination with a 2 semitrailer length longer than 50 feet shall not be operated on 3 the highways of this state at the times specified in section 684 4 unless equipped with all of the following lamps and reflectors, 5 in addition to any other lamps and reflectors required under this 6 act: (a) Two side marker lamps which display an amber light, 1 on 8 each side of the semitrailer, located at 1/2 the distance from 9 the front to the rear of the semitrailer. (b) Two reflectors which reflect an amber light, 1 on each 10 11 side of the semitrailer, located at 1/2 the distance from the 12 front to the rear of the semitrailer. 13 (c) Two clearance lamps, I on each side of the semitrailer, 14 located at 1/2 the distance from the front to the rear and as 15 near to the top of the semitrailer as practicable. 16 (7) A lamp required under subsection (6) shall be lighted at 17 the times specified in section 684 and shall be visible when 18 lighted at a distance of 500 feet from the side of the semi 19 trailer on which it is mounted. A reflector required under sub-20 section (6) shall be visible at the times specified in section 21 684 from all distances from 50 to 500 feet from the semitrailer 22 when directly in front of lawful upper beams of headlamps. 23 (8) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this section, a 24 person may operate a combination of truck tractor, semitrailer, 25 and trailer, or truck tractor and semitrailer or trailer designed

26 and used exclusively to transport assembled motor vehicles or

27 bodies, recreational vehicles, or boats, which does not exceed a

- 1 total length of 65 feet. Stinger steered combinations of truck
- 2 tractor and semitrailer shall not exceed a total length of
- 3 75 feet. The load on the combination of vehicles may extend an
- 4 additional 3 feet beyond the front and 4 feet beyond the rear of
- 5 the combination of vehicles. Retractable extensions used to sup-
- 6 port and secure the load that do not extend beyond the allowable
- 7 overhang for the front and rear shall not be included in deter-
- 8 mining the length of a loaded vehicle or combination of
- 9 vehicles. As used in this subsection, "stinger steered" means a
- 10 semitrailer combination in which the fifth wheel is located on a
- 11 drop frame located behind and below the rearmost axle of the
- 12 power unit.
- 13 (9) A combination of vehicles shall not have more than 11
- 14 axles.
- 15 (+0) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this section, a
- 16 number of motor vehicles, wholly or partially assembled, may be
- 17 transported over the highways of this state in combination, uti
- 18 lizing i tow bar or 3 saddle mounts with full mount mechanisms
- 19 and utilizing the motive power of 1 of the vehicles in
- 20 combination. The combination shall not exceed the maximum length
- 21 of 65 feet for the transportation of assembled motor vehicles,
- 22 and the vehicles in the combination shall be adequately and
- 23 securely fastened together in compliance with regulations of the
- 24 state and of any federal agency having jurisdiction over the
- 25 transportation. If motor vehicles are towed by means of triple
- 26 saddle mounts, the towed vehicles shall have brakes acting on all
- 27 wheels which are in contact with the roadway. A combination

- 1 exceeding 55 feet in length may be operated only on highways and
- 2 routes approved and designated for that operation by the state
- 3 transportation department and by local authorities with respect
- 4 to highways under their jurisdiction.
- 5 (11) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this section, a
- 6 person may operate a truck and semitrailer or trailer designed
- 7 and used to transport saw logs, pulpwood, and tree length poles
- 8 that does not exceed an overall length of 70 feet including
- 9 load. These combinations of vehicles shall only be operated upon
- 10 highways designated by the state transportation department or
- 11 local authorities with respect to highways under their
- 12 jurisdiction.
- 13 (2) THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE KNOWN AS THE NORMAL LENGTH
- 14 MAXIMUM. EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (3), THE FOLLOWING
- 15 VEHICLES AND COMBINATIONS OF VEHICLES SHALL NOT BE OPERATED ON A
- 16 HIGHWAY IN THIS STATE IN EXCESS OF THESE LENGTHS:
- 17 (A) ANY SINGLE VEHICLE: 40 FEET.
- 18 (B) ARTICULATED BUSES: 65 FEET.
- 19 (C) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS SECTION, A
- 20 COMBINATION OF A TRUCK AND SEMITRAILER OR TRAILER, OR A TRUCK
- 21 TRACTOR, SEMITRAILER, AND TRAILER, OR TRUCK TRACTOR AND SEMI-
- 22 TRAILER OR TRAILER, DESIGNED AND USED EXCLUSIVELY TO TRANSPORT
- 23 ASSEMBLED MOTOR VEHICLES OR BODIES, RECREATIONAL VEHICLES, OR
- 24 BOATS, WHICH DOES NOT EXCEED A LENGTH OF 65 FEET.
- 25 STINGER-STEERED COMBINATIONS SHALL NOT EXCEED A LENGTH OF 75
- 26 FEET. -THE LOAD ON THE COMBINATIONS OF VEHICLES DESCRIBED IN THIS
- 27 SUBDIVISION MAY EXTEND AN ADDITIONAL 3 FEET BEYOND THE FRONT AND

- 1 4 FEET BEYOND THE REAR OF THE COMBINATIONS OF VEHICLES.
- 2 RETRACTABLE EXTENSIONS USED TO SUPPORT AND SECURE THE LOAD THAT
- 3 DO NOT EXTEND BEYOND THE ALLOWABLE OVERHANG FOR THE FRONT AND
- 4 REAR SHALL NOT BE INCLUDED IN DETERMINING LENGTH OF A LOADED
- 5 VEHICLE OR VEHICLE COMBINATION.
- 6 (D) TRUCK TRACTOR AND SEMITRAILER COMBINATIONS: NO OVERALL
- 7 LENGTH, IF THE SEMITRAILER DOES NOT EXCEED 50 FEET.
- 8 (E) TRUCK AND SEMITRAILER OR TRAILER: 59 FEET.
- 9 (F) TRUCK TRACTOR, SEMITRAILER, AND TRAILER, OR TRUCK TRAC-
- 10 TOR AND 2 SEMITRAILERS: 59 FEET.
- 11 (G) MORE THAN 1 MOTOR VEHICLE, WHOLLY OR PARTIALLY ASSEM-
- 12 BLED, IN COMBINATION, UTILIZING 1 TOW BAR OR 3 SADDLE MOUNTS WITH
- 13 FULL MOUNT MECHANISMS AND UTILIZING THE MOTIVE POWER OF 1 OF THE
- 14 VEHICLES IN COMBINATION, NOT TO EXCEED 55 FEET.
- 15 (3) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (2), THE FOLLOWING VEHICLES
- 16 AND COMBINATIONS OF VEHICLES SHALL NOT BE OPERATED ON A DESIG-
- 17 NATED HIGHWAY OF THIS STATE IN EXCESS OF THESE LENGTHS:
- 18 (A) TRUCK TRACTOR AND SEMITRAILER COMBINATIONS: NO OVERALL
- 19 LENGTH LIMIT, IF THE SEMITRAILER DOES NOT EXCEED 53 FEET. ALL
- 20 SEMITRAILERS LONGER THAN 50 FEET SHALL HAVE A WHEELBASE OF 40.5
- 21 FEET PLUS OR MINUS 0.5 FEET, MEASURED FROM THE KINGPIN COUPLING
- 22 TO THE CENTER OF THE REAR AXLE OR THE CENTER OF THE TANDEM AXLE
- 23 ASSEMBLY IF EOUIPPED WITH 2 AXLES. A SEMITRAILER WITH A LENGTH
- 24 LONGER THAN 50 FEET SHALL NOT OPERATE WITH MORE THAN 2 AXLES ON
- 25 THE SEMITRAILER. CITY, VILLAGE, OR COUNTY AUTHORITIES MAY PRO-
- 26 HIBIT STOPS OF VEHICLES WITH A SEMITRAILER LONGER THAN 50 FEET
- 27 WITHIN THEIR JURISDICTION UNLESS THE STOP OCCURS ALONG

- 1 APPROPRIATELY DESIGNATED ROUTES, OR IS NECESSARY FOR EMERGENCY
- 2 PURPOSES OR TO REACH SHIPPERS, RECEIVERS, WAREHOUSES, AND TERMI-
- 3 NALS ALONG DESIGNATED ROUTES.
- 4 (B) TRUCK AND SEMITRAILER OR TRAILER COMBINATIONS: 65 FEET,
- 5 EXCEPT THAT A PERSON MAY OPERATE A TRUCK AND SEMITRAILER OR
- 6 TRAILER DESIGNED AND USED TO TRANSPORT SAW LOGS, PULPWOOD, AND
- 7 TREE LENGTH POLES THAT DOES NOT EXCEED AN OVERALL LENGTH OF 70
- 8 FEET.
- 9 (C) TRUCK TRACTOR AND 2 SEMITRAILERS, OR TRUCK TRACTOR,
- 10 SEMITRAILER, AND TRAILER COMBINATIONS: NO OVERALL LENGTH LIMIT,
- 11 IF THE LENGTH OF EACH SEMITRAILER OR TRAILER DOES NOT EXCEED
- 12 28-1/2 FEET EACH, OR THE OVERALL LENGTH OF THE SEMITRAILER AND
- 13 TRAILER, OR 2 SEMITRAILERS AS MEASURED FROM THE FRONT OF THE
- 14 FIRST TOWED UNIT TO THE REAR OF THE SECOND TOWED UNIT WHILE THE
- 15 UNITS ARE COUPLED TOGETHER DOES NOT EXCEED 58 FEET.
- 16 (D) MORE THAN 1 MOTOR VEHICLE, WHOLLY OR PARTIALLY ASSEM-
- 17 BLED, IN COMBINATION, UTILIZING 1 TOW BAR OR 3 SADDLE MOUNTS WITH
- 18 FULL MOUNT MECHANISMS AND UTILIZING THE MOTIVE POWER OF 1 OF THE
- 19 VEHICLES IN COMBINATION, NOT TO EXCEED 65 FEET.
- 20 (4) THE FOLLOWING COMBINATIONS AND MOVEMENTS ARE
- 21 PROHIBITED:
- 22 (A) A TRUCK SHALL NOT HAUL MORE THAN | TRAILER OR SEMITRAIL-
- 23 ER, AND A TRUCK TRACTOR SHALL NOT HAUL MORE THAN 2 SEMITRAILERS
- 24 OR 1 SEMITRAILER AND 1 TRAILER IN COMBINATION AT ANY 1 TIME,
- 25 EXCEPT THAT A FARM TRACTOR MAY HAUL 2 WAGONS OR TRAILERS, OR GAR-
- 26 BAGE AND REFUSE HAULERS MAY, DURING DAYLIGHT HOURS, HAUL UP TO 4
- 27 TRAILERS FOR GARBAGE AND REFUSE COLLECTION PURPOSES, NOT

- 1 EXCEEDING IN ANY COMBINATION A TOTAL LENGTH OF 55 FEET AND AT A
- 2 SPEED LIMIT NOT TO EXCEED 15 MILES PER HOUR.
- 3 (B) A COMBINATION OF VEHICLES OR A VEHICLE SHALL NOT HAVE
- 4 MORE THAN 11 AXLES, EXCEPT WHEN OPERATING UNDER A VALID PERMIT
- 5 ISSUED BY THE STATE TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT OR A LOCAL AUTHOR-
- 6 ITY WITH RESPECT TO A HIGHWAY UNDER ITS JURISDICTION.
- 7 (C) ANY COMBINATION OF VEHICLES NOT SPECIFICALLY AUTHORIZED
- 8 UNDER THIS SECTION IS PROHIBITED.
- 9 (D) A COMBINATION OF 2 SEMITRAILERS PULLED BY A TRUCK TRAC-
- 10 TOR, UNLESS EACH SEMITRAILER USES A FIFTH WHEEL CONNECTING ASSEM-
- 11 BLY WHICH CONFORMS TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE MOTOR CARRIER
- 12 SAFETY ACT, ACT NO. 181 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF 1963, BEING
- 13 SECTIONS 480.11 TO 480.21 OF THE MICHIGAN COMPILED LAWS.
- 14 (E) A VEHICLE OR A COMBINATION OF VEHICLES SHALL NOT CARRY A
- 15 LOAD EXTENDING MORE THAN 3 FEET BEYOND THE FRONT OF THE LEAD
- 16 VEHICLE.
- (F) A VEHICLE DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTIONS (2)(E) AND (3)(D)
- 18 EMPLOYING TRIPLE SADDLE MOUNTS UNLESS ALL WHEELS WHICH ARE IN
- 19 CONTACT WITH THE ROADWAY HAVE OPERATING BRAKES.
- 20 (5) ALL COMBINATIONS OF VEHICLES UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL
- 21 EMPLOY CONNECTING ASSEMBLIES AND LIGHTING DEVICES THAT ARE IN
- 22 COMPLIANCE WITH ACT NO. 181 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF 1963 AND THIS
- 23 ACT.
- 24 (6) -(12) The total gross weight of a truck tractor, semi-
- 25 trailer, and trailer combination or a truck tractor and 2 semi-
- 26 trailers combination which exceeds 59 feet in length shall not
- 27 exceed a ratio of 400 pounds per engine net horsepower delivered

- 1 to clutch or its equivalent specified in the -SAE handbook
- 2 published by the society of automotive engineers, inc. (SAE),
- 3 (1977) 1977 EDITION.
- 4 (7) -(13) Except as provided in subsection (2), a A person
- 5 who violates this section is responsible for a civil infraction.
- 6 The owner of the vehicle may be charged with a violation of this 7 section.
- 8 (8) AS USED IN THIS SECTION:
- 9 (A) "ARTICULATED BUSES" MEANS ARTICULATED BUSES OPERATED BY
- 10 A LOCAL PUBLIC TRANSIT SYSTEM FUNDED BY ACT NO. 51 OF THE PUBLIC
- 11 ACTS OF 1951, BEING SECTIONS 247.651 TO 247.675 OF THE MICHIGAN
- 12 COMPILED LAWS.
- 13 (B) "DESIGNATED HIGHWAY" MEANS A HIGHWAY APPROVED BY THE
- 14 STATE TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT OR A LOCAL AUTHORITY WITH RESPECT
- 15 TO A HIGHWAY UNDER ITS JURISDICTION.
- 16 (C) "LENGTH" MEANS THE TOTAL LENGTH OF A VEHICLE, OR COMBI-
- 17 NATION OF VEHICLES, INCLUDING ANY LOAD THE VEHICLE IS CARRYING.
- 18 LENGTH SHALL NOT INCLUDE SAFETY AND ENERGY CONSERVATION DEVICES
- 19 INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, IMPACT ABSORBING BUMPERS, REAR
- 20 VIEW MIRRORS, TURN SIGNAL LAMPS, MARKER LAMPS, STEPS AND HAND
- 21 HOLDS FOR ENTRY AND EGRESS, FLEXIBLE FENDER EXTENSIONS, MUD
- 22 FLAPS, OR SPLASH AND SPRAY SUPPRESSANT DEVICES; LOAD INDUCED TIRE
- 23 BULGE; REFRIGERATION OR HEATING UNITS; OR AIR COMPRESSORS
- 24 ATTACHED TO THE VEHICLE. A DESCRIBED SAFETY OR ENERGY CONSERVA-
