A bill to amend section 1278 of Act No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1976, entitled as amended

"The school code of 1976,"

as amended by Act No. 335 of the Public Acts of 1993, being section 380.1278 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Section 1278 of Act No. 451 of the Public Acts
- 2 of 1976, as amended by Act No. 335 of the Public Acts of 1993,
- 3 being section 380.1278 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:

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- 5 Sec. 1278. (1) Subject to subsection (12), in IN addition
- 6 to the requirements for accreditation under section 1280 speci-
- 7 fied in that section, if the board of a school district wants all
- 8 of the schools of the school district to be accredited under
- 9 section 1280, the board shall make available PROVIDE to all

- 1 pupils attending public school in the district a core academic
- 2 curriculum in compliance with subsection (3) in each of the cur-
- 3 ricular areas specified in the state board -recommended model
- 4 core academic curriculum CONTENT STANDARDS developed under sub-
- 5 section (2). The state board -model- core academic curriculum
- 6 CONTENT STANDARDS shall encompass academic and cognitive instruc-
- 7 tion only. For purposes of this -subsection- SECTION, the state
- 8 board model core academic curriculum CONTENT STANDARDS shall
- 9 not include attitudes, beliefs, or value systems that are not
- 10 essential in the legal, economic, and social structure of our
- 11 society and to the personal and social responsibility of citizens
- 12 of our society.
- 13 (2) A recommended model core CORE academic curriculum
- 14 CONTENT STANDARDS shall be developed AND PERIODICALLY UPDATED by
- 15 the state board, SHALL BE IN THE FORM OF KNOWLEDGE AND SKILL CON-
- 16 TENT STANDARDS THAT ARE STATE STANDARDS FOR ADOPTION BY PUBLIC
- 17 SCHOOLS IN LOCAL CURRICULUM FORMULATION AND ADOPTION, and SHALL
- 18 BE distributed to each school district in the state. The
- 19 -recommended core academic curriculum CONTENT STANDARDS shall
- 20 set forth desired learning objectives in math, science, reading,
- 21 history, geography, economics, American government, and writing
- 22 for all children at each stage of schooling and be based upon the
- 23 "Michigan K-12 program standards of quality" to ensure that high
- 24 academic standards, academic skills, and academic subject matters
- 25 are built into the instructional goals of all SCHOOL districts
- 26 for all children. The state board also shall ensure that the
- 27 Michigan educational assessment program and the high school

- 1 proficiency exam -, or any other statewide benchmark test is ARE
- 2 BASED ON THE STATE CORE CURRICULUM CONTENT STANDARDS, ARE testing
- 3 only for proficiency in basic academic skills and academic
- 4 subject matter, and are not used to measure pupils' values or
- 5 attitudes.
- 6 (3) Subject to subsection (12), the THE board of each
- 7 school district, considering -the- academic curricular -outcomes-
- 8 OBJECTIVES defined and recommended pursuant to subsection (2),
- 9 shall do both of the following:
- 10 (a) Establish a core academic curriculum for its pupils at
- 11 the elementary, middle, and secondary school levels. The core
- 12 academic curriculum shall AT LEAST MEET THE STATE BOARD CORE CUR-
- 13 RICULUM CONTENT STANDARDS DEVELOPED UNDER SUBSECTION (2), SHALL
- 14 define academic -outcomes OBJECTIVES to be achieved by all
- 15 pupils, and SHALL be based upon the school district's educational
- 16 mission, long-range -student PUPIL goals, and -student PUPIL
- 17 performance objectives. The core academic curriculum may vary
- 18 from the model core academic curriculum recommended by the state
- 19 board pursuant to subsection (2).
- 20 (b) After consulting with teachers and school building
- 21 administrators, determine the aligned instructional program for
- 22 delivering the core academic curriculum and identify the courses
- 23 and programs in which the core academic curriculum will be
- 24 taught.
- 25 (4) Consistent with its core academic curriculum for early
- 26 elementary school, the board of a school district shall consider
- 27 adopting early elementary school program initiatives establishing

- 1 nongraded, continuous progress programs for grades + through 4,
- 2 utilizing individualized planning, maintaining comprehensive
- 3 portfolios and narrative reports of learning progress for all
- 4 pupils, and emphasizing collegiality and collaboration among
- 5 teachers, parents, and students, all over multiple year periods.
- (4) (5) The board may supplement the core academic curric-
- 7 ulum by providing instruction through additional classes and
- 8 programs.
- 9 (5) -(6) For all pupils, the subjects or courses, and the
- 10 delivery of those including special assistance, that constitute
- 11 the curriculum the pupils engage in shall assure the pupils have
- 12 a realistic opportunity to learn all subjects and courses
- 13 required by the district's core academic curriculum in order to
- 14 give all pupils a -good and fair REASONABLE opportunity to
- 15 attain a state-endorsed diploma. A subject or course required by
- 16 the core academic curriculum pursuant to subsection (3) shall be
- 17 provided to all pupils in the school district by a school dis-
- 18 trict, a consortium of school districts, or a consortium of 1 or
- 19 more school districts and 1 or more intermediate school
- 20 districts.
- 21 (6) -(7) To the extent practicable, the state board may
- 22 adopt or develop academic -outcome based · OBJECTIVE-ORIENTED high
- 23 standards for knowledge and life skills, and A RECOMMENDED core
- 24 academic curriculum, for special education pupils for whom it may
- 25 not be realistic or desirable to expect achievement of novice
- 26 level or initial mastery of the state board recommended model

- 3 (7) $\frac{(8)}{(8)}$ The state board shall make available to all non-
- 4 public schools in this state, as a resource for their considera-
- 5 tion, the -model core academic curriculum CONTENT STANDARDS
- 6 developed for public schools pursuant to subsection (2) for the
- 7 purpose of assisting the governing body of a nonpublic school in
- 8 developing its -own core academic curriculum.
- 9 (8) $\frac{(9)}{}$ Excluding special education pupils, pupils having
- 10 a learning disability, and pupils with extenuating circumstances
- 11 as determined by school officials, a pupil who does not score
- 12 satisfactorily on the 4th or 7th grade Michigan educational
- 13 assessment program reading test shall be provided special assist-
- 14 ance reasonably expected to enable the pupil to bring his or her
- 15 reading skills to grade level within 12 months.
- 16 (9) -(+0) Any course that would have been considered a non-
- 17 essential elective course under Snyder v Charlotte Schools -
- 18 SCHOOL DIST, 421 Mich 517 (1984), on the effective date of the
- 19 amendatory act that added this section APRIL 13, 1990 shall con-
- 20 tinue to be offered to resident pupils of nonpublic schools on a
- 21 shared time basis.
- 22 -(11) Not later than September 1, 1994, the state board
- 23 shall develop and submit for public hearing under the administra-
- 24 tive procedures act of 1969, Act No. 306 of the Public Acts of
- 25 +969, being sections 24.20+ to 24.328 of the Michigan Compiled
- 26 Laws, proposed rules establishing a required core academic
- 27 curriculum for all school districts. The proposed rules may

- 1 exempt pupils described in subsection (7) and require that the
- 2 standards described in subsection (7) be implemented. Not later
- 3 than January 1, 1996, the state board shall submit the proposed
- 4 rules to the joint committee on administrative rules.
- 5 (12) Beginning in the 1997 98 school year, the board of a
- 6 school district shall provide to each pupil the core academic
- 7 curriculum required under the state board rules described in
- 8 subsection (11).
