



SENATE BILL No. 1191

October 1, 1996, Introduced by Senator VAN REGENMORTER
and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend section 1 of Act No. 223 of the Public Acts
of 1976, entitled

"An act to create the crime victims compensation board; to pre-
scribe its powers and duties; to provide compensation to certain
victims of crimes; to provide for the promulgation of rules; and
to provide for penalties,"

as amended by Act No. 348 of the Public Acts of 1993, being sec-
tion 18.351 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Act No. 223 of the Public Acts of
2 1976, as amended by Act No. 348 of the Public Acts of 1993, being
3 section 18.351 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to read
4 as follows:

5 Sec. 1. As used in this act:

6 (a) "Board" means the crime victims compensation board.

1 (b) "Claimant" means a victim or intervenor who is injured,
2 or any other person eligible for an award ~~pursuant to~~ UNDER
3 section 4(1) or 5(1), who files a claim ~~pursuant to~~ UNDER this
4 act.

5 (c) "Crime" means an act that ~~constitutes a~~ IS 1 OF THE
6 FOLLOWING:

7 (i) A crime ~~pursuant to~~ UNDER the laws of this state or
8 the United States ~~, or an~~ THAT CAUSES AN INJURY WITHIN THIS
9 STATE.

10 (ii) AN act committed in another state that if committed in
11 this state would constitute a crime ~~pursuant to~~ UNDER the laws
12 of this state or the United States ~~, and~~ that causes an injury
13 within this state ~~, or~~ that causes an injury to a resident of
14 this state within a state that does not have a victim compensa-
15 tion program eligible for funding from the victims of crime act
16 of 1984, chapter XIV of title II of THE COMPREHENSIVE CRIME CON-
17 TROL ACT OF 1984, Public Law 98-473, 98 Stat. 2170.

18 (iii) AN ACT OF INTERNATIONAL TERRORISM AS DEFINED IN SEC-
19 TION 2331 OF TITLE 18 OF THE UNITED STATES CODE, 18 U.S.C. 2331,
20 COMMITTED OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES THAT CAUSES AN INJURY TO A
21 RESIDENT OF THIS STATE.

22 (d) "Intervenor" means a person who goes to the aid of one
23 who has become a victim of a crime and who suffers personal phys-
24 ical injury.

25 (e) "Out-of-pocket loss" means the unreimbursed and unreim-
26 bursable expenses or indebtedness reasonably incurred for medical
27 care, psychological counseling, replacement services, ~~including,~~

1 ~~but not limited to, homemaking and child care services,~~ any
2 nonmedical remedial treatment rendered in accordance with a rec-
3 ognized religious method of healing, or other services necessary
4 as a result of the injury upon which a claim is based.

5 (f) "Personal physical injury" means actual bodily harm and
6 includes pregnancy.

7 (g) "Replacement services" means homemaking tasks, child
8 care, transportation, and other services previously performed by
9 the victim that, because of the victim's injury, must temporarily
10 or permanently be performed by a person other than the victim.

11 (h) "Support" means actual monetary payments made by a
12 victim or intervenor to ~~—~~ or for ~~—~~ a person principally
13 dependent on the victim or intervenor.

14 (i) "Victim" means a person who suffers a personal physical
15 injury as a direct result of a crime.
