A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILL 4265 AS INTRODUCED 2-11-97

House Bill 4265 would amend the Department of Corrections act, which requires that parole orders include the proper means of supervision of paroled prisoners. Under the bill, the parole order also would include the specification of the level of supervision. The bill defines three levels of supervision for parolees: most restrictive, less restrictive, and least restrictive. "Most restrictive" supervision would require five in-person visits with a parole officer each week. "Less restrictive" supervision would require two in-person visits with a parole officer each week. Finally, "least restrictive" supervision would require one in-person visit with a parole officer each week.
