

SENATE BILL NO. 1150

May 20, 1998, Introduced by Senators BOUCHARD, GEAKE, STILLE, BENNETT, STEIL, GOUGEON, ROGERS, SCHUETTE, MC MANUS, EMMONS, NORTH, VAN REGENMORTER, SHUGARS, DUNASKISS, SCHWARZ, JAYE and HOFFMAN and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to require the attorney general to take legal action to challenge any federal mandate for the state to obtain or disclose an individual's social security number for purposes unrelated to social security or federal taxation.

**THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:**

1       Sec. 1. It is the legislature's intent that the attorney  
2       general initiate and litigate a  
3       civil action to challenge any federal mandate for the state to  
4       obtain or disclose an individual's social security number for a  
5       purpose unrelated to social security or federal taxation. As  
6       used in this section, "federal mandate" includes both of the  
7       following:

7       (a) A requirement of federal law.

8       (b) A condition imposed by federal law that affects the  
9       state's qualification to receive federal funds.
