A bill to prohibit governmental entities from requiring individuals to reside within certain geographic areas or specified distances or travel times from their place of employment as a condition of employment or promotion.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. As used in this act, "public employer" means this
- 2 state or a county, township, village, city, authority, or other

- 4 entered into, renewed, or renegotiated after the effective date

- 6 ment of contracts provided by section 10 of article I of the
- 7 state constitution of 1963.
