

SENATE BILL NO. 920

EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

February 24, 1998, Introduced by Senators CISKY, HOFFMAN, GAST, STEIL, GOUGEON, and MC MANUS and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations for the department of state police and certain other state purposes for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1999; to provide for the expenditure of those appropriations; to provide for certain reports and the consideration of those reports; to provide for the disposition of other income received by the various state agencies; to provide testing of certain persons; to provide for certain emergency powers; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain committees, certain state agencies, and certain employees.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 101. There is appropriated for the department of state police,
2 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1999, from the funds identified
3 as follows:

16 **GENERAL SECTIONS**

17 Sec. 201. (1) Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state
18 constitution of 1963, total state spending from state sources for fiscal
19 year 1998-99 is estimated at \$297,872,200.00 in this bill and state
20 spending from state sources paid to local units of government for fiscal
21 year 1998-99 is estimated at \$16,306,900.00. The itemized statement
22 below identifies appropriations from which spending to units of local
23 government will occur:

35 (2) If it appears to the principal executive officer of a department
36 or branch that state spending to local units of government will be less

1 than the amount that was projected to be expended under subsection (1),
2 the principal executive officer shall immediately give notice of the
3 approximate shortfall to the state budget director.

4 Sec. 202. The expenditures and funding sources authorized under
5 this bill are subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL
6 18.1101 to 18.1594.

7 Sec. 203. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated in section 101,
8 there is appropriated an amount not to exceed \$4,500,000.00 for federal
9 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure until
10 they have been transferred to another line item in this bill pursuant to
11 section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL
12 18.1393.

13 (2) In addition to the funds appropriated in section 101, there is
14 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$3,500,000.00 for state restricted
15 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure until
16 they have been transferred to another line item in this bill pursuant to
17 section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL
18 18.1393.

19 (3) In addition to the funds appropriated in section 101, there is
20 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000.00 for local contingency
21 funds. These funds are not available for expenditure until they have
22 been transferred to another line item in this bill pursuant to section
23 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

24 (4) In addition to the funds appropriated in section 101, there is
25 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$200,000.00 for private contingency
26 funds. These funds are not available for expenditure until they have
27 been transferred to another line item in this bill pursuant to section
28 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

29 Sec. 204. The department of civil service shall bill departments
30 and/or agencies at the end of the first fiscal quarter for the 1%
31 charges authorized by section 5 of article XI of the state constitution
32 of 1963. Payments shall be made for the total amount of the billing by
33 the end of the second fiscal quarter.

34 Sec. 205. As used in this bill:

35 (a) "AFIS" means the automated fingerprint identification system.

36 (b) "Department" means the department of state police.

- 1 (c) "DNA" means deoxyribonucleic acid.
- 2 (d) "DOD" means the United States department of defense.
- 3 (e) "DOD-CVSA" means the DOD computerized voice stress analyzer.
- 4 (f) "DOJ" means the United States department of justice.
- 5 (g) "DOJ-BJA" means the DOJ bureau of justice assistance.
- 6 (h) "DOJ-BJS" means the United States DOJ bureau of justice
7 statistics.
- 8 (i) "DOJ-OJP" means the DOJ office of justice programs.
- 9 (j) "DOL" means the United States department of labor.
- 10 (k) "DOL-ETA" means the DOL employment and training administration.
11
- 12 (l) "DOT" means the United States department of transportation.
- 13 (m) "DOT-FHWA" means the DOT federal highway administration.
- 14 (n) "DOT-NHTSA" means DOT national highway traffic safety
15 administration.
- 16 (o) "DOT-RSPA" means the DOT research and special programs
17 administration.
- 18 (p) "EPA" means environmental protection agency.
- 19 (q) "EPA-OSWER" means the EPA office of solid waste and emergency
20 response.
- 21 (r) "FEMA" means the federal emergency management agency.
- 22 (s) "FEMA-PTED" means the FEMA preparedness, training, and
23 exercises directorate.
- 24 (t) "FTE" means full-time equated position.
- 25 (u) "IDG" means interdepartmental grant.

- 32 (bb) "MDOT" means the Michigan department of transportation.

- 34 (dd) "MLEOTC" means the Michigan law enforcement officers training
35 council.
- 36 Sec. 206. (1) Beginning October 1, 1998, there is a hiring freeze

1 imposed on the state classified civil service. State departments and
2 agencies are prohibited from hiring any new full-time state classified
3 civil service employees or prohibited from filling any vacant state
4 classified civil service positions. This hiring freeze does not apply
5 to internal transfers of classified employees from 1 position to another
6 within a department or to positions that are 80% or more federal or
7 restricted funds.

8 (2) The state budget director shall grant exceptions to this hiring
9 freeze when the state budget director believes that the hiring freeze
10 will result in the state department or agency being unable to deliver
11 basic services. The state budget director shall report by the fifteenth
12 of each month to the chairpersons of the senate and house appropriations
13 committees the number of exclusions to the hiring freeze approved during
14 the previous month and the justification for the exclusions.

15 Sec. 207. Of the state general fund/general purpose revenue
16 appropriated in section 101, \$52,941,300.00 represents a state spending
17 increase over the amount provided to the department of state police for
18 the fiscal year ending September 30, 1994, and may be used to meet state
19 match requirements of programs contained in the federal violent crime
20 control and law enforcement act of 1994, 42 U.S.C. 13701 et seq., or
21 successor grant programs, so that any additional federal money received
22 supplements funding provided to the department of state police in
23 section 101.

24 Sec. 208. (1) The department shall submit to the department of
25 management and budget, the house and senate appropriations committees,
26 the house and senate fiscal agencies, and the house and senate standing
27 committees having jurisdiction over technology issues, periodic reports
28 on the department's efforts to change the department's computer software
29 and hardware as necessary to perform properly in the year 2000 and
30 beyond. These reports shall identify actual progress in comparison to
31 the department's approved work plan for these efforts.

32 (2) The department may present progress billings to the department
33 of management and budget for the costs incurred in changing computer
34 software and hardware as necessary to perform properly in the year 2000
35 and beyond. At the time progress billings are presented for
36 reimbursement, the department shall identify and forward as appropriate

1 the funding sources that should support the work performed.

2 **DEPARTMENTWIDE APPROPRIATIONS**

3 Sec. 301. Money appropriated under this bill shall not be expended
4 by the department to hire or train an applicant for employment by the
5 department unless that applicant agrees in writing to submit to a
6 controlled substance test that is supervised by the department.

7 **HIGHWAY SAFETY PLANNING**

8 Sec. 401. In addition to the money appropriated in section 101, the
9 department may receive and expend state restricted funds for the support
10 of the secondary road patrol and traffic accident enhanced grants
11 program in accordance with section 629e of the Michigan vehicle code,
12 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.629e. Expenditures for the support of the
13 secondary road patrol and traffic accident enhanced grants program shall
14 not exceed revenues received.

15 **CRIMINAL JUSTICE DATA CENTER**

16 Sec. 501. The money appropriated in section 101 for computer
17 services shall be funded by LEIN user fees sufficient to pay 1/3 of the
18 service and contract maintenance costs of the LEIN mainframe computer
19 system.

20 Sec. 502. For the fiscal year ending September 30, 1999, the
21 department, in conjunction with the departments of transportation and
22 state, and the state budget director, shall determine a cost of
23 maintaining the traffic accident records program based on each
24 department's respective use.

25 **FORENSIC SCIENCES**

26 Sec. 601. The grant to the city of Detroit under section 101 is
27 intended to supplement the city's appropriations for the Detroit crime
28 lab and the Detroit police special events.

29 **LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS TRAINING COUNCIL**

30 Sec. 701. (1) The money appropriated to the MLEOTC for maintenance
31 and delivery of training to locals is provided in accordance with a
32 state reimbursement policy in which 100% of the determined state
33 reimbursement rate shall be distributed upon certification by the
34 MLEOTC.

35 (2) Money appropriated under this bill shall not be expended by the
36 MLEOTC for training a law enforcement officer candidate, and a candidate

1 shall not be certified by the MLEOTC, unless the candidate tests
2 negative on a test prescribed by the MLEOTC that is designed to detect
3 the illegal use of controlled substances. A test shall be conducted
4 before basic training and before application for certification. A
5 candidate who tests positive or refuses to submit to a test is not
6 eligible for MLEOTC training or certification until the expiration of 2
7 years after the positive test or the refusal to submit to the test.
8 Money shall not be expended to employ, train, or certify a candidate who
9 tests positive or who refuses a test, until the expiration of 2 years
10 after the positive test or the refusal to submit to the test.

11 Sec. 702. The money appropriated in section 101 for community
12 policing coordination shall be used by the department to work in
13 conjunction with local criminal justice agencies to identify appropriate
14 curriculum to support community policing. The department shall work as
15 a coordinator to deliver community policing training.

16 **EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT**

17 Sec. 801. (1) The state director of emergency management may expend
18 money appropriated under this act to call upon any agency or department
19 of the state or any resource of the state to protect life or property or
20 to provide for the health or safety of the population in any area of the
21 state in which the governor proclaims a state of emergency or state of
22 disaster under 1945 PA 302, MCL 10.31 to 10.33 or under the emergency
23 management act, 1976 PA 390, MCL 30.401 to 30.420. The state director
24 of emergency management may expend the amounts the director considers
25 necessary to accomplish these purposes. The director shall submit to
26 the state budget director as soon as possible a complete report of all
27 actions taken under the authority of this section. The report shall
28 contain, as a separate item, a statement of all money expended that is
29 not reimbursable from federal money. The state budget director shall
30 review the expenditures and submit recommendations to the legislature in
31 regard to any possible need for a supplemental appropriation.

32 (2) In addition to the money appropriated in section 101, the
33 department may receive and expend money from local, private, federal, or
34 state sources for the purpose of providing emergency management training
35 to local or private interests and for the purpose of supporting
36 emergency preparedness, response, recovery, and mitigation activity.

1 **UNIFORM SERVICES**

2 Sec. 901. The department shall not expend any portion of the money
3 appropriated in section 101, including any expenditure made under an
4 executive order, to plan for or to implement a roadblock or check lane
5 system that has as its primary objective the deterrence or detection of
6 intoxicated drivers in this state.

7 Sec. 902. Upon service of proper notification by the department of
8 its intent to cancel the lease at any post that is subject to
9 consolidation, money appropriated in section 101 shall not be used for
10 rent expenses at that post beyond the minimum time required for
11 cancellation of the lease.

12 Sec. 903. State police enlisted personnel who are employed to
13 enforce traffic laws as provided in section 629e of the Michigan vehicle
14 code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.629e, shall not be prohibited from responding
15 to crimes in progress or other emergency situations, and are responsible
16 for protecting every citizen of this state from harm.

17 **SPECIAL OPERATIONS**

18 Sec. 1001. (1) Money appropriated under section 101 for the
19 Michigan public safety communications system shall be expended upon
20 approval of an expenditure plan by the state budget director.

21 (2) The department of state police shall assess all subscribers of
22 the Michigan public safety communications system reasonable access and
23 maintenance fees.

24 (3) All money received by the department of state police under this
25 section shall be deposited to the state general fund pursuant to section
26 443 of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1443.

27 (4) The department of state police shall provide a report to the
28 house and senate appropriations committees, house and senate fiscal
29 agencies, and the state budget director on April 15, 1999, and on
30 October 15, 1999, indicating the amount of revenue collected under this
31 section and deposited to the state general fund for the immediately
32 preceding 6-month period.

33 Sec. 1002. In addition to the appropriations in section 101 to the
34 department of state police for the aviation program, the department is
35 authorized to sell its aircraft and the proceeds from the sale are
36 appropriated and may be applied to the renovation cost of replacement

1 aircraft.

2 **CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS**

3 Sec. 1101. (1) There is sufficient money appropriated in section
4 101 to criminal investigations to ensure that the citizens in a service
5 area of any state police post in the vicinity of a state prison do not
6 experience a downgrading of state police services in their area.
7 Criminal investigations shall be available by temporary or permanent
8 assignment of a detective when either a temporary or permanent prison
9 facility is opened.

10 (2) If the department is unable to comply with subsection (1) and
11 there is a prison scheduled to open, the department shall provide
12 troopers to serve as investigators on an interim basis.

13 **FIRE MARSHAL**

14 Sec. 1201. The fire fighters training council shall report any
15 proposed changes in educational and/or training requirements for
16 volunteer fire fighters to the state budget director and to the house
17 and senate appropriation subcommittees on state police and military
18 affairs 30 days prior to implementing the proposed changes.

19 **MOTOR CARRIER ENFORCEMENT**

20 Sec. 1301. The appropriation in section 101 for school bus
21 inspections shall be used by the department of state police to inspect
22 each school bus and pupil transportation vehicle annually, as required
23 under 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.715a, and 1990 PA 187, MCL 257.1839.
