- 9 ited in the state treasury through the department and shall be available
- 10 for expenditure. Project costs authorized by this act shall not exceed

- 12 tion and any specific work orders or projects adopted by the Michigan
- 13 veterans' memorial park commission in accordance with section 451(2)
 of
- 14 the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451, do not lapse at
- 15 the end of this fiscal year but are available for expenditure until
- 16 September 30, 2002. Expenditures shall be in accordance with methods and
