A bill to amend 1971 PA 140, entitled "State revenue sharing act of 1971," by amending section 14a (MCL 141.914a).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 14a. (1) If a special census of a city, village, or
