

HOUSE BILL No. 4966

October 7, 1999, Introduced by Rep. Stallworth and referred to the Committee on Energy and Technology.

A bill to amend 1909 PA 106, entitled

"An act to regulate the transmission of electricity through the public highways, streets and places of this state, where the source of supply and place of use are in the same or different counties; to regulate the charges to be made for electricity so transmitted; to regulate the rules and conditions of service under which said electricity shall be furnished and to confer upon the Michigan public utilities commission certain powers and duties in regard thereto,"

(MCL 460.551 to 460.559) by amending the title and by adding sections 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, and 18.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 9 TOMERS OF AN ELECTRIC UTILITY TO CHOOSE AN ALTERNATIVE ELECTRIC
- 10 SUPPLIER.
- 11 (2) AN ORDER ISSUED BY THE COMMISSION BEFORE THE EFFECTIVE
- 12 DATE OF THE AMENDATORY ACT THAT ADDED THIS SECTION THAT ALLOWS
- 13 CUSTOMERS OF AN ELECTRIC UTILITY TO CHOOSE AN ALTERNATIVE ELEC-
- 14 TRIC SUPPLIER IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH THIS ACT TO THE EXTENT THAT
- 15 THE ORDER IS CONSISTENT WITH THIS ACT.
- 16 (3) THE COMMISSION SHALL ENSURE THAT ORDERS ISSUED UNDER
- 17 THIS ACT MAXIMIZE THE BENEFITS OF A COMPETITIVE MARKETPLACE FOR
- 18 THE PROVISION OF ELECTRIC SERVICES, MAINTAIN FAIR COMPETITION
- 19 AMONG PROVIDERS OF ELECTRIC SERVICE, ENHANCE THE RELIABILITY AND
- 20 SAFETY IN THE PROVISION OF ELECTRIC SERVICES, AND PROVIDE LOWER
- 21 COSTS TO ALL MICHIGAN CUSTOMERS FOR ELECTRIC SERVICES.
- 22 SEC. 11. THE COMMISSION SHALL ESTABLISH BY ORDER A CERTIFI-
- 23 CATION PROCEDURE FOR ALTERNATIVE ELECTRIC SUPPLIERS TO ASSURE
- 24 THAT SUCH SUPPLIERS HAVE THE NECESSARY FINANCIAL, MANAGERIAL, AND
- 25 TECHNICAL CAPABILITIES TO PROVIDE ADEQUATE SERVICE TO CUSTOMERS
- 26 IN THIS STATE. THE COMMISSION SHALL ESTABLISH A TOLL-FREE
- 27 TELEPHONE NUMBER THAT WILL PROVIDE INFORMATION AND CURRENT STATUS

- 1 OF ANY CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO AN ALTERNATIVE ELECTRIC SUPPLIER
- 2 UNDER THIS ACT.
- 3 SEC. 12. FOR CUSTOMERS NOT CHOOSING AN ALTERNATIVE ELECTRIC
- 4 SUPPLIER, THE RATES FOR AN ELECTRIC UTILITY SERVING MORE THAN
- 5 100,000 CUSTOMERS IN THIS STATE SHALL NOT EXCEED THE RATES FOR
- 6 THAT ELECTRIC UTILITY THAT WERE IN EFFECT AS OF JANUARY 1, 1999.
- 7 ANY TRANSITION CHARGE, IMPLEMENTATION CHARGE, FEE, RATE ADJUST-
- 8 MENT, OR ANY OTHER CHARGE ALLOWED UNDER THIS ACT OR BY COMMISSION
- 9 ORDER SHALL NOT CAUSE THE LIMIT ON THE AMOUNT AN ELECTRIC UTILITY
- 10 MAY CHARGE A CUSTOMER UNDER THIS SECTION TO BE EXCEEDED.
- 11 SEC. 13. (1) THE COMMISSION SHALL ALLOW AN ELECTRIC UTILITY
- 12 TO RECOVER STRANDED COSTS.
- 13 (2) THE DETERMINATION OF STRANDED COST BY THE COMMISSION IS
- 14 SUBJECT TO AN ANNUAL ADJUSTMENT THROUGH A TRUE-UP PROCEDURE.
- 15 (3) THE COMMISSION SHALL CONSIDER INCENTIVES FOR ELECTRIC
- 16 UTILITIES TO MITIGATE STRANDED COSTS.
- 17 SEC. 14. THE COMMISSION SHALL ESTABLISH BY ORDER A CODE OF
- 18 CONDUCT TO PROHIBIT CROSS SUBSIDIZATION AND UNFAIR COMPETITION
- 19 WITH RESPECT TO THE ACTIVITIES OF ELECTRIC UTILITIES AND THEIR
- 20 AFFILIATES AS THEY RELATE TO THE SHARING OF INFORMATION, ASSETS,
- 21 AND EMPLOYEES WITH KNOWLEDGE OF CUSTOMER INFORMATION GAINED FROM
- 22 THE PROVISION OF A REGULATED SERVICE.
- 23 SEC. 15. THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT RELIABILITY STANDARDS
- 24 FOR THE TRANSMISSION AND DISTRIBUTION SYSTEMS OF ELECTRIC UTILI-
- 25 TIES SUBJECT TO THE COMMISSION'S JURISDICTION.
- 26 SEC. 16. THE COMMISSION SHALL ESTABLISH PROCEDURES TO
- 27 ENSURE THAT A CUSTOMER OF AN ELECTRIC UTILITY OR AN ALTERNATIVE

- 1 ELECTRIC SUPPLIER IS NOT SWITCHED TO ANOTHER SUPPLIER OR PROVIDED
- 2 ADDITIONAL SERVICES WITHOUT THE CUSTOMER'S AUTHORIZATION.
- 3 SEC. 17. (1) AN ELECTRIC UTILITY DELIVERING ELECTRICITY TO
- 4 RETAIL CUSTOMERS IN THIS STATE SHALL BECOME A MEMBER OF A
- 5 REGIONAL INDEPENDENT SYSTEM OPERATOR WITHIN 1 YEAR OF APPROVAL BY
- 6 THE FERC OF OPEN ACCESS TARIFFS. IF AN ELECTRIC UTILITY HAS NOT
- 7 COMPLIED WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION, THE COMMISSION
- 8 SHALL, AFTER NOTICE AND HEARING, ORDER THE UTILITY TO BECOME A
- 9 MEMBER OF AN INDEPENDENT SYSTEM OPERATOR.
- 10 (2) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A COOPERATIVE ELECTRIC
- 11 UTILITY OR AN ELECTRIC UTILITY SERVING LESS THAN 100,000 CUSTOM-
- 12 ERS UNLESS THE COMMISSION DETERMINES THAT MEMBERSHIP IN THE
- 13 SYSTEM WILL PROVIDE A MATERIAL NET BENEFIT AND THAT UTILITY IS
- 14 ORDERED TO BECOME A MEMBER AFTER NOTICE AND HEARING.
- 15 SEC. 18. AS USED IN THIS ACT:
- 16 (A) "ALTERNATIVE ELECTRIC SUPPLIER" MEANS A PERSON SELLING
- 17 ELECTRIC GENERATION SERVICE TO RETAIL CUSTOMERS IN THIS STATE BUT
- 18 NOT PHYSICALLY DELIVERING ELECTRICITY DIRECTLY TO THOSE RETAIL
- **19** CUSTOMERS.
- 20 (B) "COOPERATIVE ELECTRIC UTILITY" MEANS AN ELECTRIC UTILITY
- 21 ORGANIZED AS A COOPERATIVE CORPORATION UNDER 1931 PA 327,
- 22 MCL 450.98 TO 450.192.
- 23 (C) "FERC" MEANS THE FEDERAL ENERGY REGULATORY COMMISSION.
