**OVERVIEW**

The Department of State Police engages in a wide range of law enforcement activities—including highway patrol, criminal investigations, forensic sciences, motor carrier enforcement, emergency management, highway safety planning, fire investigation and education, criminal justice data processing, operation of the Statewide Public Safety Communications System, and various specialized law enforcement services. The department's responsibilities also include oversight of law enforcement standards in the state and administration of several grant programs for local law enforcement agencies.

**Major Boilerplate Changes from FY 2001-02:****Sec. 207. Privatization Plan**

Exec Rec removed section requiring submission of a plan prior to any privatization initiative. House restored language. Senate concurred with Exec Rec. Conf Cmte concurred with House.

**Sec. 213. Forfeiture Funds**

Exec Rec removed section granting department receive-and-expend authority for forfeiture funds. House concurred. Senate restored language. Conf Cmte concurred with House.

**Sec. 214. Citation Quota Prohibition**

Exec Rec removed section prohibiting law enforcement agencies receiving GF/GP funds from evaluating employees on the basis of motor vehicle citations issued. House restored language. Senate concurred with Exec Rec. Conf Cmte concurred with Senate.

**Secs. 221 and 221a. School Violence Hotline**

Exec Rec removed language requiring maintenance of a school violence hotline. House restored current-year language (Sec. 221) and added new language authorizing department to allocate up to \$50,000 to fund the hotline (Sec. 221a). Senate removed both sections. Conf Cmte retained Sec. 221, but not section Sec. 221a, and added language allowing department to expend funds for promotion of hotline.

**Sec. 222. At-Post Trooper Level**

Exec Rec removed language stating legislative intent for at-post trooper level of 1,349. House retained language but deleted reference to specific number, instead referencing a level "sufficient to carry out the department's statewide law enforcement responsibilities." Senate eliminated existing language and included language (1) restricting the use of funds appropriated in the At-Post Troopers line to trooper-related costs, (2) requiring the department to conduct one or more trooper schools with the goal of graduating 110 troopers, and (3) requiring the submission of a report, by November 15, 2002, on accomplishing that goal, including a plan outlining the additional funding necessary if insufficient funds exist. Conf Cmte concurred with Senate.

**Secs. 223 and 224. Post Closure or Consolidation**

House added two new sections: Sec. 223 would require the department to consult with appropriations subcommittees regarding the projected closing or consolidation of any State Police posts, and Sec. 224 would require the department to notify the subcommittees not less than 120 days before recommending to close or consolidate any post. Senate retained Sec. 224 only and lengthened notification requirement to 180 days. Conf Cmte concurred with Senate.

## **Major Boilerplate Changes from FY 2001-02:**

### ***Sec. 259. Information Technology – User Fees***

Exec Rec added new language providing that funds appropriated for Information Technology be paid as user fees to the Department of Information Technology, subject to an interagency agreement. House, Senate, and Conf Cmte concurred (Sec. 303 in conference report).

### ***Sec. 260. Information Technology – Work Projects***

Exec Rec added new language stating that funds appropriated for Information Technology may be designated as work projects under the Management and Budget Act. House, Senate, and Conf Cmte concurred (Sec. 304 in conference report).

### ***Sec. 261. Early Retirement and Budgetary Savings***

Senate added new language providing for transfer of negative appropriation for early retirement savings to line items in which savings are realized. Conf Cmte included similar language, but in reference to budgetary savings.

### ***Sec. 262. Jackson Joint Facility***

Senate added new section (1) stating legislative intent that the department engage in cooperative efforts with local law enforcement agencies and (2) requiring a feasibility study on a joint facility for the Jackson State Police Post, Jackson County Sheriff's Department, and City of Jackson Police Department. Conf Cmte concurred.

### ***Sec. 263. Assistance to City of Highland Park***

Senate added new language calling for the department to provide general law enforcement assistance, including patrol service, to the City of Highland Park until such services can be provided to the city by other means. Conf Cmte concurred, but eliminated reference to patrol service.

### ***Sec. 401. Secondary Road Patrol and Training Fund***

Exec Rec removed section granting department receive-and-expend authority for secondary road patrol and training fund revenue. House concurred. Senate included language requiring quarterly reports on Secondary Road Patrol and Training Fund collections—including comparisons to grant distribution, appropriation, and expenditure levels. Conf Cmte concurred with Senate.

### ***Secs. 503 and 1303. Fee-Related Restricted Revenue***

House added language to appropriate \$2.8 million in restricted funds if Senate Bill 928 is enacted (Sec. 503) and \$250,000 in restricted funds if Senate Bills 425 and 929 are enacted (Sec. 1303). As introduced, Senate Bill 928 would increase the fee charged by the department for a state-level fingerprint-based background check from \$15 to \$30, and Senate Bills 425 and 929 would increase licensing fees for private security guard companies, alarm system contractors, and private detective companies. Senate removed language. (See Item 17 above for associated appropriation changes.) Conf Cmte concurred with Senate.

### ***Sec. 604. Access to Probation Information***

Exec Rec removed section requiring a feasibility study on providing law enforcement officers with access to probation information. House concurred. Senate included language requiring placement of such information on the Law Enforcement Information Network, as well as submission to subcommittees of any amendments to statute necessary to accomplish this goal. Conf Cmte concurred with Senate (Sec. 307 in conference report).

### ***Sec. 701. Grant to City of Detroit***

Exec Rec removed language allocating grant in conjunction with elimination of appropriation. House restored language in conjunction with restoration of appropriation. Senate concurred and added language stating legislative intent that the city's crime lab become accredited by the American Society of Crime Laboratory Directors and qualified to input data into the Combined DNA Identification System within three years. Conf Cmte included language appropriating GF/GP grant at current-year level (\$431,400 for crime lab; \$289,700 for special events account) if tax on cigarettes is increased by 30 cents per pack or more by September 30, 2002 and included versions of both current-year language requiring an annual report and Senate-passed language regarding accreditation.

### ***Sec. 703. Evidence Collection by Health Care Providers***

Exec Rec removed language requiring study on evidence collection by health care providers in sexual assault cases. House concurred. Senate included language requiring department to work with various health organizations to ensure that specified evidence collection recommendations are followed. Conf Cmte concurred with Senate.

### ***Sec. 902. Fire Fighter Training***

Senate added section allocating \$400,000 for fire fighter training programs provided by the Michigan State University School of Labor and Industrial Relations (see Item 4 above for associated appropriation change). Conf Cmte did not include this language.

### ***Sec. 1202. Aeronautics Safety Officer***

Senate added section requiring department to fund 1/3 the cost of an aeronautics safety officer position within the Department of Transportation (similar section in current-year budget bill was vetoed by governor). Conf Cmte concurred.

### ***Sec. 1203. Recovery Boats***

Senate added new section requiring department to station at least one recovery boat within the Upper Peninsula. Conf Cmte concurred.

## **Major Boilerplate Changes from FY 2001-02:**

### ***Sec. 1302. Licensing Fee Revenue***

Exec Rec removed section granting department receive-and-expend authority for private security guard and detective licensing fee revenue. House, Senate, and Conf Cmte concurred.

### ***Sec. 1401. School Bus Inspections***

Exec Rec removed language providing for the annual inspection of school buses in state. House included language requiring a report on such inspections conducted in calendar year 2002 under statutory requirements. Senate concurred with House and retained language requiring certificates to be awarded to school systems with 100% successful inspections. Conf Cmte concurred with Senate.

### ***Sec. 1402. Motor Carrier Enforcement***

Conf Cmte added new language stating legislative intent that funds appropriated for Motor Carrier Enforcement Division be used to the maximum extent possible and requiring a report on the allocation of funds appropriated for the division, including funds appropriated above the Exec Rec by the Legislature.

### ***Various Sections Removed***

Various other sections were removed by the Exec Rec, with concurrence by the House. Senate and Conf Cmte concurred with removal unless otherwise noted.

Sec. 215. Provides for maintenance of sex offenders registry website.

Sec. 217. Requires coordination of state aircraft plans.

Sec. 251. Provides for expenditure for rental costs at State Police post in Marshall. Restored by Senate/Conf Cmte (Sec. 264).

Sec. 501. Requires report on Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN) policies. Restored by Senate/Conf Cmte (Sec. 305).

Sec. 502. Requires report if LEIN abuse is suspected. Restored by Senate/Conf Cmte (Sec. 306).

Sec. 702. Requires distribution of DNA protocol to police agencies. Restored by Senate/Conf Cmte.

Sec. 802. Provides for implementation and update of community policing curriculum.

Sec. 803. Provides for training of new law enforcement officers regarding federal firearm laws. Restored by Senate/Conf Cmte.

Sec. 1101. Prohibits expenditure of funds for alcohol check lanes.

Sec. 1102. States legislative intent for department to maintain maximum number of troopers from funds appropriated.
