CONTENT

The bill would amend the Michigan Penal Code to increase the maximum fine for various misdemeanors. Of the misdemeanors included in the bill, the lowest current maximum fine is \$100 and the highest is \$1,000. Under the bill, the lowest maximum fine would be \$500 and the highest would be \$1,500.

Also, it currently is a misdemeanor, with no specified penalty, to assemble, march, or parade on any street, highway, or public place while wearing a mask or covering that conceals the face of the wearer. (A misdemeanor for which no penalty is specified is punishable by up to 90 days' imprisonment and/or a maximum fine of \$100.) The bill, instead, would make it a misdemeanor, punishable by up to 93 days' imprisonment and/or a maximum fine of \$500, for a person intentionally to conceal his or her identity by wearing a mask or other face covering to facilitate the commission of a crime.
