HOUSE BILL No. 4190

February 13, 2001, Introduced by Reps. Hart and Vear and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1979 PA 94, entitled "The state school aid act of 1979,"

by amending section 96 (MCL 388.1696), as added by 2000 PA 297.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 96. (1) From the state school aid fund money appropri-

- 1 (A) THE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL HAS at least 50 pupils in
- 2 membership. and shall meet the following requirements:
- 3 (a) For 1999-2000, at least 80% of the fourth and fifth
- 4 grade pupils enrolled and in regular daily attendance in the
- 5 school on the pupil membership count day in that school year took
- 6 the applicable MEAP tests, and 1 or both of the following are

- (5) $\overline{(4)}$ Funds allocated under this section that are not
- 4 expended in the state fiscal year for which they were allocated
- 5 may be carried forward to a subsequent state fiscal year.
- (6) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, "ELEMENTARY SCHOOL" MEANS A
- 7 SCHOOL OPERATING BOTH GRADES 4 AND 5, OR A COMBINATION OF A
- 8 SCHOOL OPERATING GRADE 5 AND 1 OR MORE OTHER SCHOOLS THAT OPERATE
- 9 GRADE 4 AND PROMOTE PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL OPERATING GRADE 5.
