A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled

"Michigan election law,"

by amending sections 523 and 744 (MCL 168.523 and 168.744), section 523 as amended by 1996 PA 583 and section 744 as amended by 1995 PA 261.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 523. (1) At each election, before being given a
- 2 ballot, each registered elector offering to vote shall identify
- 3 himself or herself by presenting an official state identifica-
- 4 tion card issued to that individual pursuant to Act No. 222 of
- 5 the Public Acts of 1972, being sections 28.291 to 28.295 of the
- 6 Michigan Compiled Laws, an operator's or chauffeur's license
- 7 issued to that individual pursuant to the Michigan vehicle code,
- 8 Act No. 300 of the Public Acts of 1949, being sections 257.1 to
- 9 257.923 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, or other generally

- 1 recognized picture identification card and by executing an
- 2 application showing his or her signature or mark and address of
- 3 residence in the presence of an election official. If the voter
- 4 registration cards are used in the precinct, the election offi-
- 5 cial in charge of the precinct registration file shall compare
- 6 the signature upon the application with the signature upon the
- 7 registration card. If voter registration lists are used in the
- 8 precinct, the election inspector OFFICIAL shall determine if
- 9 the name on the application to vote appears on the voter regis-

- 25 (4) AN ELECTION INSPECTOR OR OTHER INDIVIDUAL IN THE POLLING

- 27 WHICH THE POLLING PLACE IS LOCATED SHALL NOT ASK AN ELECTOR TO
