Analysis Summary

The bill would create a new act that would require within 3 years of the effective date of this act, health clubs to have on the premises at all times an automated external defibrillator. It would also require that with the passage of the act at least one employee who was certified in first aid and CPR. The health club management would have to develop and implement emergency plans, or face civil penalties.

Fiscal Impact

The bill would have no fiscal impact on local government.

Health clubs that violate this law may be required to pay civil fines ranging from \$250 to \$1,000, which would be deposited into the State treasury. The potential fiscal impact of this bill on State government is indeterminate as no data are available to estimate how many violations would occur.
