Budget Overview

The Department of Agriculture promotes Michigan agricultural products and protects public from disease and unsanitary conditions in food production and handling. It regulates product labeling and producer practices for dairy products, animals, and plants, as well as enforcing consumer protection laws in food, standard weights/measures, animal health, plant pests and diseases.

Summary of Major Budget Issues

Major Conference Committee Changes- No funding from the Agricultural Enhancement Fund for has been included. A contingency appropriation is provided for marketing, animal health, and local grant programs if the necessary legislation passes before September 30, 2004. Federal funds were included to contain the Emerald Ash Borer.

Funding shifts and user fee increases – Restricted funds, fees, inspection fees and testing revenues are increased. The Conference Committee did not concur with the Executive recommendation to shift more than \$2.0 million in Equine Industry Development Fund revenue into department administrative and program support line items. Instead, a fund transfer to the General Fund is made.

Fund Shifts and Transfers – Restricted funding shifts replacing GF/GP funds are made. These adjustments allows the transfer of \$773,300 to the Bovine TB program.

3. Restricted Fund Shifts

Restricted fund increases would be made in programs where similar General Fund savings could be realized. License and inspection fees would save \$100,000 in the Food/Dairy and Pesticide/Plant Pest Management programs. The Laboratory would save \$100,000 through testing and weights/measures fees. Groundwater/Freshwater Fund and Agriculture Equine Industry Development Fund increases (\$75,000) would be made in the Environmental Stewardship and Animal Industry, respectively. Building Occupancy Charges would include \$200,000 (Federal) as well, replacing reduced General Funds.

6. Elimination of the Regulatory Seed Program

The Seed Inspection & Testing Program would be eliminated. This program was established to assure that seed for sowing meets label guarantees and is weed free. This program is an "item of difference" with the Senate.

inspections would be reduced. Increased reliance would be placed on buyer/seller quality control and assurance efforts.

8. Local Conservation District Grants

Grants to soil conservation districts would be reduced. The Executive recommendation would reduce funds used for training, and formula grants provided in boilerplate. Each district would receive the basic \$20,000 grant. Conference Committee reduced the amount for training grants from \$130,000 to \$81,200. This savings would be provided to Districts through the department's distribution formula.

The House added \$200,000, Agric. Enhancement Fund (see Item 1 above) bringing total funding to \$1,861,200.

9. Agricultural Development Program Reduction

The Conference Committee consolidated the two line items for Marketing and Agricultural Development. A \$100,000 reduction was made, reflecting administrative efficiencies possible through a reorganization of these two divisions.

Major Boilerplate Changes from FY 2002-03:

Sec. 211. Restricted Revenue Carryforward – DELETED

This section would prohibit the lapse of restricted fund revenue to the General Fund.

Sec. 223. Incentive for Administrative Efficiencies – NEW

Funds may be spent from General Fund lapse from FY 2002-2003 administrative efficiencies. Funds could be spent if the proposed spending plan is approved by the State Budget Director and the Legislative appropriations committees.

Sec. 224 Agricultural Enhancement Funding Priorities – NEW

Priority for revenue distribution pursuant to the appropriation is provided. Funds would be appropriated from the Agricultural Enhancement Fund if revenue is available.

Sec. 301. Commissions and Boards -- Changed by the Conference Committee

The **Executive** deleted authorization to make per diem payments to members of Department commissions and boards. The House authorized payments to department commodity committees.

Sec. 702. Food Bank-- Changed by the Conference Committee

The **Executive** removed authorization to expend unused funds for direct food purchases.
