Analysis**Summary**

This bill would amend Section 1a of the Child Care Licensing Act, Public Act 116 of 1973 as added by Public Act 139 of 1984, to allow a child care institution to continue to receive additional children after applying for license as an adult foster care small group home. The combined licensed capacity for such homes would continue to be limited to a combination of 6 children and adults.

Fiscal Impact

There is no fiscal impact on the Family Independence Agency. There may be some systemic cost savings due to better utilization of licensed child and adult foster care institutions, but such savings are not readily determinable.
