1.	<b>Across-the-Board Funding Reduction of 6.74%.</b> The Governor, House, and Senate included a 6.74% reduction for University Operations, Agricultural Experiment Station, Cooperative Extension Service, and the King-Chavez-Parks Programs.	(109,662,073)
2.	Rare Isotope Accelerator. The Governor, House, and Senate eliminated one-time funding.	(1,900,000)
3.	<b>Federal Fund Reductions.</b> The House and Senate included the Governor's recommended reductions in available Federal funds for State Competitive Scholarships (\$700,000) and the Robert Byrd Scholarship Program (\$400,000).	(1,100,000)

4.	<b>Per-Student Floor Funding.</b> The Senate included a \$4,000 per-student funding floor, funded from the Merit Award Trust Fund; the Conferees included a \$3,890 funding floor.	9,500,000
5.	Infrastructure, Technology, Equipment, and Maintenance (ITEM). The Senate appropriated \$100,000 to each of the 15 universities, and a total of \$100,000 was distributed to independent colleges through the General Degree Reimbursement Program; funding was from the Merit Award Trust Fund. The Conferees did not include ITEM funding.	0
6.	<b>Western Michigan University.</b> The Senate appropriated \$10 million for the creation of a Life Sciences Research and Commercialization Center. The Conference Report did not include this item but \$10 million was included in the FY 2002-03 Strategic Fund budget.	0
7.	<b>Japan Center.</b> The Governor and Senate eliminated funding; the House included \$150,000; Conferees concurred with the Senate.	(294,594)
8.	<b>Higher Education Database.</b> The Governor and House reduced funding to a total of \$200,000; the Senate included \$200,100; Conferees concurred with the House.	(41,200)
*9.	<b>Midwest Higher Education Compact Dues.</b> The Governor eliminated, Senate included \$100, House and Conferees retained at FY 2002-03 amount of \$82,500. <i>The Governor vetoed this funding.</i>	(82,500)
10.	<b>Grants and Financial Aid.</b> The Governor eliminated seven FY 2002-03 programs, the House eliminated three, and the Senate retained all of them. The Senate reduced these programs by 6.74% across-the-board. Neither the House nor the Senate included the Governor's proposed Michigan Opportunity Scholarship Program. The Conferees concurred with the Senate's 6.74% reduction but retained \$364,954 in GF/GP, eliminated funding for degree reimbursement and added those dollars proportionately to Competitive Scholarships and Tuition Grants. 11.	<b>Michigan Merit Awards.</b> The House and Senate did not concur with the Governor's reduction of awards from \$2,500 to \$500 beginning with the class of 2004, nor did they concur with the Governor's proposed accounting change. The Senate added \$70.7 million to the FY 2002-03 Merit Award amount of \$64.3 million, for an FY 2003-04 total of \$135 million. The Conferees included a total of \$130 million.	65,676,150
12.	<b>Tuition Incentive Program.</b> The Senate concurred with the Governor's funding level which included an increase of \$4 million due to increased caseload estimates; the House did not concur and retained FY 2002-03 funding of \$5,250,000. The Senate did not phase out the program as the Governor and House proposed. The Conferees concurred with the Senate's TIP funding of \$9,250,000.	600,000

14.	<b>FY 2002-03 Supplemental Funding.</b> \$1.5 million for Central, \$2,750,000 for 11 schools based on their proportionate share of the budget, and \$2,750,000 distributed to 11 schools in equal amounts of \$250,000.	(7,000,000)

## Changes from FY 2002-03 Year to Date:

## Items Included by House and Senate

- 1. Annual Report on Restricted Funds. Governor, House, and Senate deleted requirement.
- 2. **Capital Outlay.** Governor, House, and Senate deleted legislative intent for competitive bids for State projects since the DMB Act already requires it.
- 3. **Tuition Grant Program.** House and Senate changed application deadline from September 1 to July 15, 2003. (Sec. 302(2))
- 4. **General Degree Reimbursement Program.** Governor, House, and Senate deleted earmarks for University of Detroit-Mercy, Marygrove, and Finlandia. (Sec. 304)
- 5. **Nursing Scholarship Program.** Governor, House, and Senate included reference to enabling legislation, Public Act 591 of 2002. (Sec. 312)
- 6. **Dental Clinics Grant.** Governor, House, and Senate earmarked appropriation for the University of Detroit Mercy School of Dentistry to support services to low-income residents of southeastern Michigan. (Sec. 315)
- 7. **HEIDI Advisory Committee.** Governor, House, and Senate replaced database conversion with maintenance and enhancement. (Sec. 405(2))
- 8. **Study of Automatic Sprinklers in Dorms.** Governor, House, and Senate deleted requirement because the study has been completed.
- 9. **Tuition Restraint.** Governor, House, and Senate replaced 8.5% or \$425 limit on tuition increases with a directive to adopt reasonable tuition and fee increases. (Sec. 436)
- 10. Enrollment Policy Workgroup. Governor, House, and Senate deleted requirement.
- 11. **Michigan Public School Employees Retirement System (MPSERS).** House and Senate included legislative intent to retain FY 2002-03 contribution rate for FY 2003-04. (Sec. 437)
- 12. Report on Smoking Policies in Dorms. House and Senate added requirement. (Sec. 439)
- 13. **Report on Faculty.** Governor, House, and Senate deleted requirement due to availability of information in the Higher Education database (HEIDI).

## Conference Agreement on Items of Difference

- 14. General/Allied Health Degree Reimbursement. Conferees deleted all references to these programs.
- 15. **Per-Student Floor Funding.** Senate deleted reference to floors of \$4,600, \$4,800, \$5,800, and \$9,100 per-student and replaced with one \$4,000 per-student funding floor. Conference Report included no floor funding language.
- 16. **Textbook Purchases.** Senate added requirement for Presidents Council to report on potential for public universities to provide group purchasing for textbooks. Conferees did not include.
- 17. **Western Michigan University.** Senate included base funding allocation of \$10 million for creation of Life Sciences Research and Commercialization Center. Conferees did not include.
- 18. **New Academic Programs.** Senate added Presidents Council list of approved programs. Conferees concurred with Senate and required list of eliminated programs. (Sec. 701a)
- 19. **Performance Audits of State Universities.** Governor and House allowed three annually; Senate required three annually. Conferees concurred with House. (Sec. 708)
- 20. **FY 2002-03 Supplemental Fund Source Shift.** Senate included shift from Merit Award Trust Fund to Tobacco Settlement Trust Fund. Conferees concurred with Senate. (Sec. 1101)
- 21. **FY 2002-03 Notification Deadline.** Senate required notification by July 1, 2003, for Michigan Competitive Scholarship and Tuition Grant applicants. Conferees changed date to July 31. (Sec. 1102)
