THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 561. (1) The governor shall establish a government efficiency task force to survey, examine, and evaluate the budget and spending of each state agency to minimize overspending and to ensure greater program efficiency and economy.
 - (2) The government efficiency task force shall submit a comprehensive annual report to the governor summarizing the budget and spending activity of each state agency. The report shall also include recommendations that will minimize spending and provide for a more efficient and economical program. The governor shall submit the recommendations of the task force to the legislature.

- 1 (3) The government efficiency task force shall consist of at
- 2 least 15 but not more than 20 members, each appointed by the
- 3 governor. The governor shall select members who are experienced
