"An act to authorize the director of the department of state police to promulgate a uniform traffic code; to authorize a city, township, or village to adopt the uniform traffic code by reference without publication in full; and to prescribe criminal penalties and civil sanctions for violation of the code,"

by amending section 1 (MCL 257.951), as amended by 1998 PA 69.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) A city, township, or village may adopt by
- 2 reference a code or ordinance for the regulation of traffic
- 3 within cities, townships, and villages that has been promulgated
- 4 by the director of the department of state police. The director

- 6 traffic code -pursuant to- in compliance with the administrative
