SUBSTITUTE FOR

HOUSE BILL NO. 4433

A bill to allow the display of the Ten Commandments and other documents with religious significance on public property under certain circumstances.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) A document or other object that may be primarily
- 2 religious in nature or origin and that has had an impact on this
- 3 state's or this country's history, including the Ten Commandments,
- 4 may be displayed on public property if all of the following
- 5 circumstances exist:
- 6 (a) It is displayed with other documents, public records, or
- 7 objects of historical significance that have formed and influenced
- 8 the legal or governmental system of the United States.
- **9** (b) It is displayed in the same manner as other documents,
- 10 public records, or objects that are displayed at the same time and

- 1 location.
- 2 (c) The display does not focus more attention on it than on
- 3 other documents, public records, or other objects that are
- 4 displayed at the same time and location.
- 5 (2) As used in this act, "public property" means a building or
- 6 land owned, possessed, or leased by this state or a county, city,
- 7 township, village, school district, or other governmental unit.
