## **SENATE BILL No. 778**

September 27, 2005, Introduced by Senators BIRKHOLZ, BRATER, JACOBS, HARDIMAN and ALLEN and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending section 2521 (MCL 324.2521), as added by 1999 PA 195.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2521. (1) The department of environmental quality, in
- 2 conjunction with the department of natural resources, shall
- 3 biennially prepare a report that assesses the status of and trends
- 4 related to the overall state of the natural environment in
- 5 Michigan. The report shall be based upon environmental indicators
- 6 identified by the departments of environmental quality and natural
- 7 resources and upon data obtained through sound scientific
- 8 methodologies and processes. The report shall be submitted to the
- 9 governor, to the standing committees of the legislature with

- 1 jurisdiction over issues primarily related to natural resources and
- 2 the environment, and to the senate and house appropriations
- 3 subcommittees on environmental quality and natural resources. [The
- 4 first report shall be submitted not later than October 1, 2001, and
- 5 subsequent reports shall be submitted not later than October 1
- 6 every other year. THE REPORT SHALL BE SUBMITTED NOT LATER THAN OCTOBER 1, 2008 AND EVERY THIRD YEAR THEREAFTER.] The reports shall also be made available to the
- 7 public electronically and, upon request, in paper format.
- **8** (2) The departments of environmental quality and natural
- 9 resources shall monitor efforts undergoing in other states and
- 10 nationally to establish uniformity among environmental indicators
- 11 that might be included within the report.
- 12 (3) All state agencies shall cooperate with the departments of
- 13 environmental quality and natural resources in carrying out their
- 14 responsibilities under this section.
- 15 (4) As used in this section, "environmental indicator" means a
- 16 measure of the state of the natural environment that can be derived
- 17 from empirical data. The department shall use the most recent data
- 18 available. If relevant data is not available, the department shall
- 19 include in the report recommendations for gathering data in the
- 20 future.
- 21 (5) This section is repealed effective December 31, 2005.
