## SUBSTITUTE FOR

## SENATE BILL NO. 225

A bill to create an agricultural tourism advisory commission; to provide for its powers and duties; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Agricultural tourism" means the practice of visiting an
- 3 agribusiness, horticultural, or agricultural operation, including,
- 4 but not limited to, a farm or winery or a companion animal or
- 5 livestock show, for the purpose of recreation, education, or active
- 6 involvement in the operation, other than as a contractor or
- 7 employee of the operation.
- 8 (b) "Commission" means the agricultural tourism zoning
- 9 advisory commission created in section 2.

- 1 (c) "Department" means the department of agriculture.
- 2 (d) "Director" means the director of the department.
- 3 Sec. 2. (1) The agricultural tourism zoning advisory
- 4 commission is created within the department.
- 5 (2) The commission shall consist of the following members
- 6 appointed by the director:
- 7 (a) Three individuals representing agricultural tourism
- 8 enterprises.
- 9 (b) Two individuals representing local government.
- 10 (c) One individual representing the travel Michigan division
- 11 of the Michigan economic development corporation.
- 12 (d) One individual representing the department.
- 13 (3) The members first appointed to the commission shall be
- 14 appointed within 60 days after the effective date of this act.
- 15 (4) Members of the commission shall serve for the life of the
- 16 commission.
- 17 (5) If a vacancy occurs on the commission, the director shall
- 18 make an appointment to fill the vacancy.
- 19 (6) A member of the commission may be removed by the director,
- 20 for incompetency, dereliction of duty, malfeasance, misfeasance, or
- 21 nonfeasance in office, or any other good cause.
- Sec. 3. (1) The first meeting of the commission shall be
- 23 called by the director. At the first meeting, the commission shall
- 24 elect from among its members a chairperson and other officers as it
- 25 considers necessary or appropriate. After the first meeting, the
- 26 commission shall meet at least quarterly, or more frequently at the
- 27 call of the chairperson or if requested by 3 or more members.

- 1 (2) A majority of the members of the commission constitute a
- 2 quorum for the transaction of business at a meeting of the
- 3 commission. A majority of the members present and serving are
- 4 required for official action of the commission.
- 5 (3) The business that the commission may perform shall be
- 6 conducted at a public meeting of the commission held in compliance
- 7 with the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275.
- 8 (4) A writing prepared, owned, used, in the possession of, or
- 9 retained by the commission in the performance of an official
- 10 function is subject to the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442,
- 11 MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 12 (5) Members of the commission shall serve without
- 13 compensation. However, members of the commission may be reimbursed
- 14 for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance
- 15 of their official duties as members of the commission.
- 16 Sec. 4. The commission shall do all of the following:
- 17 (a) Not more than 1 year and 60 days after the effective date
- 18 of this act, submit to the governor and the committees of the
- 19 senate and house of representatives with primary responsibility for
- 20 agriculture issues, tourism issues, and local zoning issues a
- 21 report that includes all of the following:
- (i) A discussion of the effects of local zoning on agricultural
- 23 tourism.
- 24 (ii) Model local zoning ordinance provisions to promote
- 25 agricultural tourism.
- 26 (iii) Recommendations concerning the use of logo signage to
- 27 promote agricultural tourism.

- 1 (iv) Recommendations for other measures to promote and remove
- barriers to agricultural tourism. 2
- (v) Other recommendations concerning agricultural tourism. 3
- (b) Undertake studies for the purposes of the report required 4
- under subdivision (a). 5
- Sec. 5. This act is repealed effective 1 year and 90 days 6
- after the effective date of this act. 7
