## **HOUSE BILL No. 4219**

February 8, 2005, Introduced by Reps. Vagnozzi, Spade, Sheltrown, Kehrl, Gleason, Plakas, Gonzales, Polidori, Leland, Donigan, Hopgood and Condino and referred to the Committee on Higher Education and Career Preparation.

A bill to amend 1996 PA 195, entitled "Police officer's and fire fighter's survivor tuition act," by amending the title and sections 1, 2, and 3 (MCL 390.1241, 390.1242, and 390.1243).

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

TITLE

An act to provide for a waiver of tuition at state public
institutions of higher education for children and surviving spouses
of Michigan police officers and fire fighters FIRST RESPONDERS
killed in the line of duty; and to provide for an appropriation.
Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
"police officer's and fire fighter's "FIRST RESPONDER'S survivor

- 1 tuition act".
- 2 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 3 (a) "Child" means an individual who is a natural or adopted
- 4 child of a deceased Michigan police officer or deceased Michigan
- 5 fire fighter FIRST RESPONDER and who was under the age of 21 at the
- 6 time of the Michigan police officer's or Michigan fire fighter's
- 7 FIRST RESPONDER'S death.
- 8 (b) "Department" means the department of state police.
- 9 (C) "FIREFIGHTER" MEANS A MEMBER, INCLUDING VOLUNTEER MEMBERS
- 10 AND MEMBERS PAID ON CALL, OF A FIRE DEPARTMENT, OR OTHER
- 11 ORGANIZATION THAT PROVIDES FIRE SUPPRESSION AND OTHER FIRE-RELATED
- 12 SERVICES, OF A CITY, TOWNSHIP, VILLAGE, OR COUNTY WHO IS
- 13 RESPONSIBLE FOR OR IS IN A CAPACITY THAT INCLUDES RESPONSIBILITY
- 14 FOR THE EXTINGUISHMENT OF FIRES. FIREFIGHTER DOES NOT INCLUDE A
- 15 PERSON WHOSE JOB DESCRIPTION, DUTIES, OR RESPONSIBILITIES DO NOT
- 16 INCLUDE DIRECT INVOLVEMENT IN FIRE SUPPRESSION.
- 17 (D) "FIRST RESPONDER" MEANS A POLICE OFFICER, FIREFIGHTER, OR
- 18 MEDICAL FIRST RESPONDER.
- 19 (E) -(c) "Killed" means that the Michigan police officer's or
- 20 Michigan fire fighter's FIRST RESPONDER'S death is the direct and
- 21 proximate result of a traumatic injury incurred in the line of
- **22** duty.
- 23 (F) -(d) "Line of duty" means an action that a Michigan
- 24 police officer or Michigan fire fighter FIRST RESPONDER is
- 25 obligated or authorized to perform by rule, regulation, condition
- 26 of employment or service, or law, including, but not limited to, a
- 27 social, ceremonial, or athletic function that the Michigan police

- 1 officer or Michigan fire fighter FIRST RESPONDER is assigned to or
- 2 compensated for by the public agency he or she serves.
- 3 (e) "Michigan police officer" means a sheriff or sheriff's
- 4 deputy of a sheriff's department in this state; village or township
- 5 marshal of a village or township in this state; officer of the
- 6 police department of any city, village, or township in this state;
- 7 officer of the Michigan state police; or any other police officer
- 8 or law enforcement officer trained and certified pursuant to the
- 9 Michigan law enforcement officers training council act of 1965, Act
- 10 No. 203 of the Public Acts of 1965, being sections 28.601 to 28.616
- 11 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 12 (f) "Michigan fire fighter" means a member including volunteer
- 13 members and members paid on call of a fire department, or other
- 14 organization that provides fire suppression and other fire-related
- 15 services, of a city, township, village, or county who is
- 16 responsible for or is in a capacity that includes responsibility
- 17 for the extinguishment of fires. Michigan fire fighter does not
- 18 include a person whose job description, duties, or responsibilities
- 19 do not include direct involvement in fire suppression.
- 20 (G) "MEDICAL FIRST RESPONDER" MEANS A MEDICAL FIRST RESPONDER,
- 21 AS THAT TERM IS DEFINED IN SECTION 20906 OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH CODE,
- 22 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.20906, IN THIS STATE.
- 23 (H)  $\frac{(g)}{(g)}$  "Occupational disease" means a disease that
- 24 routinely constitutes a special hazard in, or is commonly regarded
- 25 as concomitant of, the Michigan police officer's or Michigan fire
- 26 fighter's FIRST RESPONDER'S occupation.
- 27 (I) "POLICE OFFICER" MEANS A SHERIFF OR SHERIFF'S DEPUTY OF A

- 1 SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT IN THIS STATE; VILLAGE OR TOWNSHIP MARSHAL OF
- 2 A VILLAGE OR TOWNSHIP IN THIS STATE; OFFICER OF THE POLICE
- 3 DEPARTMENT OF ANY CITY, VILLAGE, OR TOWNSHIP IN THIS STATE; OFFICER
- 4 OF THE MICHIGAN STATE POLICE; OR ANY OTHER POLICE OFFICER OR LAW
- 5 ENFORCEMENT OFFICER TRAINED AND CERTIFIED PURSUANT TO THE
- 6 COMMISSION ON LAW ENFORCEMENT STANDARDS ACT, 1965 PA 203, MCL
- 7 28.601 TO 28.616.
- **8** (J) —(h)— "State institution of higher education" means a
- 9 public community or junior college established under section 7 of
- 10 article VIII of the state constitution of 1963 or part 25 of the
- 11 revised school code, Act No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1976, being
- 12 sections 380.1601 to 380.1607 of the Michigan Compiled Laws 1976 PA
- 13 451, MCL 380.1601 TO 380.1607, or a state university described in
- 14 section 4, 5, or 6 of article VIII of the state constitution of
- **15** 1963.
- 16 (K) -(i) "Traumatic injury" means a wound or the condition
- 17 of the body caused by external force, including, but not limited
- 18 to, an injury inflicted by bullet, explosive, sharp instrument,
- 19 blunt object or other physical blow, fire, smoke, chemical,
- 20 electricity, climatic condition, infectious disease, radiation, or
- 21 bacteria, but excluding an injury resulting from stress, strain, or
- 22 occupational disease.
- 23 (l) -(j) "Tuition" means tuition at the rate charged for
- 24 residents of this state.
- 25 Sec. 3. (1) Beginning in the 1996-1997 academic year, and
- 26 subject to the limitations in subsections (2), (3), and (4), a
- 27 state institution of higher education shall waive tuition for each

- 1 child and surviving spouse of a Michigan police officer or Michigan
- 2 fire fighter FIRST RESPONDER who has been or is killed in the line
- 3 of duty if the child or surviving spouse meets all of the following
- 4 requirements:
- 5 (a) Applies, qualifies, and is admitted as a full-time, part-
- 6 time, or summer school student in a program of study leading to a
- 7 degree or certificate.
- **8** (b) Is a legal resident of the state for at least the 12
- 9 consecutive months immediately preceding his or her application.
- 10 For an individual who is a dependent of his or her parent,
- 11 residency status shall be determined by the parent's residency. For
- 12 an individual who is not a dependent, residency status shall be
- 13 determined in the same manner as under title IV of the higher
- 14 education act of 1965, Public Law 89-329, 79 Stat. 1232 20 USC 1070
- 15 TO 1099C-2.
- 16 (c) Applies to the department for tuition waiver under this
- 17 act and provides evidence satisfactory to the department that he or
- 18 she is the child or the surviving spouse of a Michigan police
- 19 officer or Michigan fire fighter FIRST RESPONDER who was killed in
- 20 the line of duty, that the course or courses for which he or she is
- 21 seeking a tuition waiver meet the requirements of subsection (2),
- 22 and that he or she meets the other requirements of this section.
- 23 (d) For a child of a Michigan police officer or Michigan fire
- 24 fighter FIRST RESPONDER who was killed in the line of duty, applies
- 25 under subdivision (c) for the first time before the age of 21.
- 26 (e) Is certified by the financial aid officer at the state
- 27 institution of higher education as needing the tuition waiver in

- 1 order to meet recognized educational expenses. If the child's or
- 2 surviving spouse's family income, excluding any income from death
- 3 benefits attributable to the Michigan police officer's or Michigan
- 4 fire fighter's FIRST RESPONDER'S death, is below 400% of poverty
- 5 level under federal poverty guidelines published by the United
- 6 States department of health and human services, income from any
- 7 death benefits accruing to the child or surviving spouse as a
- 8 result of the Michigan police officer's or Michigan fire fighter's
- 9 FIRST RESPONDER'S death shall not be counted as family income in
- 10 determining financial need under this subdivision.
- 11 (f) Maintains satisfactory academic progress, as defined by
- 12 the state institution of higher education, for each term or
- 13 semester in which he or she is enrolled. The satisfactory progress
- 14 definition used by an institution for federal student assistance
- 15 programs under title IV of the higher education act of 1965, 20 USC
- 16 1070 TO 1099C-2, is acceptable for the purposes of this act.
- 17 (g) Has not achieved a bachelor's degree and has received
- 18 tuition reimbursement under this act for less than 124 semester
- 19 credits or 180 term credits at an institution of higher education.
- 20 (2) A state institution of higher education shall waive
- 21 tuition under this act only for courses that are applicable toward
- 22 the degree or certificate requirements of the program in which the
- 23 child or surviving spouse is enrolled.
- 24 (3) A child or surviving spouse of a Michigan police officer
- 25 or Michigan fire fighter FIRST RESPONDER who was killed in the line
- 26 of duty is eligible for tuition waiver under this section for not
- 27 more than a total of 9 semesters or the equivalent number of terms

- 1 or quarters.
- 2 (4) Tuition shall be waived only to the extent that the
- 3 tuition is not covered or paid by any scholarship, trust fund,
- 4 statutory benefit, or any other source of tuition coverage
- 5 available to the person eligible for a waiver under this act.
