HOUSE BILL No. 4802

May 17, 2005, Introduced by Reps. Anderson, Miller, Tobocman, Gillard, Stakoe, Gleason, Kathleen Law, Hune and Lemmons, III and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 627 (MCL 257.627), as amended by 2004 PA 62.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 627. (1) A person driving OPERATING a vehicle on a
- 2 highway shall drive at a careful and prudent speed not greater than
- 3 nor less than is reasonable and proper, having due regard to the
- 4 traffic, surface, and width of the highway and of any other
- 5 condition then existing. A person shall not -drive- OPERATE a
- 6 vehicle upon a highway at a speed greater than that which will
- 7 permit a stop within the assured, clear distance ahead.
 - (2) Subject to subsection (1) and except in those instances
 - where a lower speed is specified in this chapter, it is prima facie

- 1 lawful for the driver of a vehicle to drive at a speed not
- 2 exceeding the following, except when this speed would be unsafe:
- 3 (a) 25 miles an hour on all highways in a business or
- 4 residence district as defined in this act.
- 5 (b) 25 miles an hour in public parks unless a different speed
- 6 is fixed and duly posted.
- 7 (3) It is prima facie unlawful for a person to exceed the
- 8 speed limits prescribed in subsection (2), except as provided in
- **9** section 629.
- 10 (4) The driver of a vehicle in a mobile home park as defined
- 11 in section 2 of the mobile home commission act, 1987 PA 96, MCL
- 12 125.2302, shall drive at a careful and prudent speed, not greater
- 13 than a speed which is reasonable and proper, having due regard for
- 14 the traffic, surface, width of the roadway, and all other
- 15 conditions existing, and not greater than a speed which will permit
- 16 a stop within the assured clear distance ahead. It is prima facie
- 17 unlawful for the driver of a vehicle to drive at a speed exceeding
- 18 15 miles an hour in a mobile home park as defined in section 2 of
- 19 the mobile home commission act, 1987 PA 96, MCL 125.2302.
- 20 (4) A PERSON, WHILE OPERATING A VEHICLE IN A MOBILE HOME PARK AS
- 21 DEFINED IN SECTION 2 OF THE MOBILE HOME COMMISSION ACT, 1987 PA 96,
- 22 MCL 125.2302, OR IN A CONDOMINIUM PROJECT ESTABLISHED FOR RESIDENTIAL
- 23 PURPOSES UNDER THE CONDOMINIUM ACT, 1978 PA 59, MCL 559.101 TO
- 24 559.276, SHALL NOT EXCEED THE FOLLOWING SPEEDS:
- 25 (A) FIFTEEN MILES PER HOUR IN A MOBILE HOME PARK.
- 26 (B) IN A CONDOMINIUM PROJECT, A SPEED POSTED BY THE ASSOCIATION
- 27 OF CO-OWNERS USING SIGNS THAT COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS ACT

- 1 AND ARE PURCHASED BY THE ASSOCIATION AT ITS OWN EXPENSE. THE SPEED
- 2 POSTED UNDER THIS SUBDIVISION SHALL NOT BE LESS THAN 15 MILES PER
- 3 HOUR. AS USED IN THIS SUBDIVISION, "ASSOCIATION OF CO-OWNERS" MEANS
- 4 THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN SECTION 3 OF THE CONDOMINIUM ACT, 1978 PA 59,
- 5 MCL 559.103.
- 6 (C) A CAREFUL AND PRUDENT SPEED, NOT GREATER THAN A SPEED THAT IS
- 7 REASONABLE AND PROPER, HAVING DUE REGARD FOR THE TRAFFIC, SURFACE,
- 8 WIDTH OF THE ROADWAY, AND ALL OTHER CONDITIONS EXISTING AND NOT
- 9 GREATER THAN A SPEED THAT WILL PERMIT A STOP WITHIN THE ASSURED CLEAR
- 10 DISTANCE AHEAD.
- 11 (5) IT IS PRIMA FACIE UNLAWFUL FOR THE DRIVER OF A VEHICLE TO
- 12 EXCEED THE SPEED LIMITS SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (4)(A) OR (B).
- 13 (6) (5)— A person driving— OPERATING a passenger vehicle
- 14 drawing another vehicle or trailer shall not exceed a speed of 55
- 15 miles per hour, unless the vehicle or trailer has 2 wheels or less
- 16 and does not exceed the combined weight of 750 pounds for the
- 17 vehicle or trailer and load, or a trailer coach of not more than 26
- 18 feet in length with brakes on each wheel and attached to the
- 19 passenger vehicle with an equalizing or stabilizing coupling unit.
- 20 (7) -(6) A PERSON OPERATING A truck with a gross weight of
- 21 10,000 pounds or more, a truck-tractor with a trailer, or a
- 22 combination of these vehicles shall not exceed a speed of 55 miles
- 23 per hour on highways, streets, or freeways and shall not exceed a
- 24 speed of 35 miles per hour during the period when reduced loadings
- 25 are being enforced in accordance with this chapter.
- 26 (8) $\overline{(7)}$ A person $\overline{\text{driving}}$ OPERATING a school bus shall not
- 27 exceed the speed of 50 miles per hour.

- 1 (9) -(8) The maximum -rates of speeds allowed -pursuant to
- 2 UNDER this section are subject to the maximum rate established
- 3 pursuant to UNDER section 629b.
- 4 (10) -(9) A person operating a vehicle on a highway, when
- 5 entering and passing through a work zone -described in section
- 6 79e(a), or, beginning April 8, 2004, described in section 79d(a),
- 7 where a normal lane or part of the lane of traffic has been closed
- 8 due to highway construction, maintenance, or surveying activities,
- 9 shall not exceed a speed of 45 miles per hour unless a different
- 10 speed limit is determined for that work zone by the state
- 11 transportation department, a county road commission, or a local
- 12 authority. The state transportation department, a county road
- 13 commission, or a local authority shall post speed limit signs in
- 14 each work zone described in section 79e(a), or, beginning April 8,
- 15 2004, described in section 79d(a), that indicate the speed limit
- 16 in that work zone and shall identify that work zone with any other
- 17 traffic control devices necessary to conform to the Michigan manual
- 18 of uniform traffic control devices. A person shall not exceed a
- 19 speed limit established under this section or a speed limit
- 20 established under section 628 or 629.
- 21 (11) -(10)— A person who violates this section is responsible
- 22 for a civil infraction.
