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## **HOUSE BILL No. 5255**

September 29, 2005, Introduced by Reps. Gaffney, Hune, Hildenbrand and Mortimer and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 2843 (MCL 333.2843), as amended by 2002 PA 691.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2843. (1) A funeral director who first assumes custody of
- 2 a dead body, either personally or through his or her authorized
- 3 agent, shall report the death. For purposes of this subsection,
- 4 "dead body" includes, but is not limited to, the body of an infant
  - who survived an attempted abortion as described in the born alive
  - infant protection act, 2002 PA 687, MCL 333.1071 TO 333.1073, and
  - who later died. The funeral director or the authorized agent shall
  - obtain the necessary personal data from the next of kin or the best

- 1 qualified individual or source available and shall obtain medical
- 2 certification as follows:
- 3 (a) If the death occurred outside an institution, the medical
- 4 certification portion of the death record shall be completed and
- 5 certified not later than 48 hours after death by the attending
- 6 physician; or in the absence of the attending physician, by a
- 7 physician acting as the attending physician's authorized
- 8 representative; or in the absence of an authorized representative,
- 9 by A CERTIFIED NURSE PRACTITIONER OR the county medical examiner;
- 10 or in the absence of A CERTIFIED NURSE PRACTITIONER OR the county
- 11 medical examiner, by the county health officer or the deputy county
- 12 medical examiner. If the death occurred in an institution, the
- 13 medical certification shall be completed and signed not later than
- 14 48 hours after death by the attending physician; or in the absence
- 15 of the attending physician, by a physician acting as the attending
- 16 physician's authorized representative; or in the absence of an
- 17 authorized representative, by A CERTIFIED NURSE PRACTITIONER OR the
- 18 chief medical officer of the institution in which death occurred,
- 19 after reviewing pertinent records and making other investigation as
- 20 considered necessary, or by a pathologist.
- 21 (b) A physician, as AN INDIVIDUAL described in subdivision
- 22 (a), who for himself or herself or as an agent or employee of
- 23 another individual neglects or refuses to certify a death record
- 24 properly presented to him or her for certification by a funeral
- 25 director or who refuses or neglects to furnish information in his
- 26 or her possession, is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by
- 27 imprisonment for not more than 60 days, or a fine of not less than

- 1 \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00, or both.
- 2 (2) The medical certification shall be provided not later than
- 3 48 hours after the death by the -physician- INDIVIDUAL, as
- 4 described in subsection (1)(a).
- 5 (3) A death record shall be certified by a funeral director
- 6 licensed under article 18 of the occupational code, 1980 PA 299,
- 7 MCL 339.1801 to 339.1812, and shall be filed with the local
- 8 registrar of the district where the death occurred not later than
- 9 72 hours after the death.
- 10 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the death
- 11 of an infant who was born alive following an attempted abortion and
- 12 was surrendered to an emergency service provider under the safe
- 13 delivery of newborns law, sections 1 to 20 of chapter XII of the
- 14 probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL 712.1 to 712.20, and then
- 15 died shall be reported in the same manner as for any death.
- 16 However, the deceased infant shall be listed as "Baby Doe" and no
- 17 information that would directly identify the deceased infant or the
- 18 deceased infant's parents shall be reported, including, but not
- 19 limited to, the following information:
- 20 (a) The name of the mother or father.
- 21 (b) The address of the mother or father.
- (c) The name of the informant.
- (d) The address of the informant.
