HOUSE BILL No. 5525

December 14, 2005, Introduced by Reps. Caswell and Hildenbrand and referred to the Committee on House Oversight, Elections, and Ethics.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled

"Michigan election law,"

by amending section 499 (MCL 168.499), as amended by 2004 PA 92.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 499. (1) An elector entitled to registration in an
- 2 election precinct may become registered in the precinct by applying
- 3 in person and signing the registration application before the clerk
- 4 or assistant clerk of the township, city, or village in which the
- 5 precinct is located. For the performance of his or her duties under
- 6 this act, each clerk and assistant clerk has the power to
- 7 administer oaths and to swear persons as to the truth of statements
- 8 contained in an application. For a better examination of the
- applicant, a clerk may employ and swear an interpreter to interpret
- all questions put to applicants and the answers to those questions.

- 1 If the applicant, in answer to a question or in the registration
- 2 application, makes a material statement that is false, the
- 3 applicant is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- 4 (2) A clerk or assistant clerk shall not accept a fee from an
- 5 elector applying for registration, either for the registering of
- 6 the elector or for the taking of the acknowledgment on the
- 7 application. A person who violates this subsection is guilty of a
- 8 misdemeanor.
- 9 (3) The clerk, immediately after receiving the registration or
- 10 change of address of an elector, shall prepare a voter
- 11 identification card for the elector. The clerk shall also prepare
- 12 and send a corrected voter identification card to an elector
- 13 affected by a change in United States representative, state
- 14 senatorial, state representative, or county commissioner district
- 15 or precinct. The clerk shall forward by first-class mail the voter
- 16 identification card to the elector at the elector's registration
- 17 address. HOWEVER, A CLERK MAY FORWARD BY FIRST-CLASS MAIL THE VOTER
- 18 IDENTIFICATION CARD, UPON REQUEST OF THE ELECTOR, TO A POST OFFICE
- 19 BOX IF THE POST OFFICE BOX IS WHERE THE ELECTOR NORMALLY RECEIVES
- 20 PERSONAL MAIL AND THE ELECTOR DOES NOT RECEIVE MAIL AT HIS OR HER
- 21 REGISTRATION ADDRESS. The voter identification card shall contain
- 22 the name and address of the registrant and the United States
- 23 representative, state senatorial, state representative, or county
- 24 commissioner district and precinct in which the registrant is an
- 25 elector. If the original voter identification card is returned to
- 26 the clerk by the post office as nondeliverable, the clerk shall
- 27 reject the registration and send the individual a notice of

- 1 rejection. If a duplicate voter identification card is returned to
- 2 the clerk by the post office, the clerk shall accept this as
- 3 information that the elector has moved and the clerk shall proceed
- 4 in conformity with section 509aa.
