## **HOUSE BILL No. 5859**

March 14, 2006, Introduced by Reps. Nitz, Schuitmaker, Proos, Baxter, Mayes, Sheltrown, Casperson and Emmons and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

A bill to amend 1988 PA 466, entitled "Animal industry act,"

by amending section 14 (MCL 287.714), as amended by 2002 PA 458.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 14. (1) If the director determines that the control or
- 2 eradication of a disease or condition of livestock warrants entry
- 3 onto property where livestock or domestic animals are located, the
- 4 director shall order the entry onto property where livestock or
- 5 domestic animals are located and authorize seizure, slaughter,
- 6 destruction, or other disposition of individual livestock or
- 7 domestic animals or the entire herd, flock, or school. If the
- 8 director has signed an order for the slaughter, destruction, or
  - other disposition of livestock or domestic animals, OR IF THE

- 1 DIRECTOR HAS SIGNED AN ORDER CONFIRMING THE LOSS OF LIVESTOCK OR
- 2 DOMESTIC ANIMALS DUE TO COUGAR DEPREDATION, the director shall
- 3 notify the attorney general and the house and senate appropriations
- 4 committees and the department of management and budget on the issue
- 5 of indemnity under this section. The director may approve
- 6 facilities and procedures for the orderly disposal of animals,
- 7 animal products, and animal feeds for the purpose of controlling or
- 8 preventing the spread of an infectious, contagious, or
- 9 toxicological disease. The director may select a site or method for
- 10 the disposal with the advice of the director of the department of
- 11 environmental quality.
- 12 (2) The director may, under rules promulgated by the
- 13 department, allow indemnification for the slaughter, destruction,
- 14 or other disposition of livestock or domestic animals due to
- 15 livestock diseases or toxicological contamination. If the director
- 16 has signed an order for the slaughter, destruction, or other
- 17 disposition of livestock or domestic animals, the owner may apply
- 18 for indemnification. The director shall appraise and inventory the
- 19 condemned livestock or domestic animals. The appraisals and
- 20 inventories shall be on forms approved by the director. The
- 21 director shall use agricultural pricing information from commercial
- 22 livestock or domestic animal auction markets and other livestock or
- 23 domestic animal market information as determined by the director to
- 24 determine the value of condemned livestock or domestic animals.
- 25 (3) THE DIRECTOR MAY, UNDER RULES PROMULGATED BY THE
- 26 DEPARTMENT, ALLOW INDEMNIFICATION FOR THE LOSS OF LIVESTOCK OR
- 27 DOMESTIC ANIMALS DUE TO COUGAR DEPREDATION. IF THE DIRECTOR HAS

- 1 SIGNED AN ORDER CONFIRMING THE LOSS OF LIVESTOCK OR DOMESTIC
- 2 ANIMALS DUE TO COUGAR DEPREDATION, THE OWNER MAY APPLY FOR
- 3 INDEMNIFICATION. THE DIRECTOR SHALL APPRAISE AND INVENTORY THE
- 4 LIVESTOCK OR DOMESTIC ANIMALS. THE APPRAISAL AND INVENTORIES SHALL
- 5 BE ON FORMS APPROVED BY THE DIRECTOR. THE DIRECTOR SHALL USE
- 6 AGRICULTURAL PRICING INFORMATION FROM COMMERCIAL LIVESTOCK OR
- 7 DOMESTIC ANIMAL MARKET INFORMATION AS DETERMINED BY THE DIRECTOR TO
- 8 DETERMINE THE VALUE OF THE LIVESTOCK OR DOMESTIC ANIMALS.
- 9 (4) -(3) Except as otherwise provided in subsection -(5)
- 10 (6), indemnification for individual livestock or domestic animals
- 11 within a herd, flock, or school shall be based upon 100% of the
- 12 fair market value of that type of livestock or domestic animal on
- 13 the date of the appraisal and marketable for the purpose for which
- 14 the livestock or domestic animal was intended, not to exceed
- 15 \$4,000.00 for each livestock or domestic animal. The appraisal
- 16 determination shall not delay the slaughter, destruction, or
- 17 disposition of the livestock or domestic animals. The
- 18 indemnification amount under this subsection shall include a
- 19 deduction for any compensation received, or to be received, from
- 20 any other source including, but not limited to, indemnification by
- 21 the United States department of agriculture, insurance, salvage
- 22 value, or any monetary value obtained to encourage disposal of
- 23 infected or exposed livestock or domestic animals in accordance
- 24 with a disease control or eradication program. The owner shall
- 25 furnish to the department all records indicating other sources of
- 26 indemnity. An affidavit signed by the owner attesting to the amount
- 27 of compensation for the livestock received or to be received from

- 1 any other source shall accompany the appraisal certificate before
- 2 indemnification under this section.
- 3 (5) -(4) Except as otherwise provided in subsection -(5)
- 4 (6), indemnification for entire herd, flock, or school
- 5 depopulations of livestock or domestic animals shall be based upon
- 6 100% of the fair market value of that type of animal on the date of
- 7 the appraisal and marketable for the purpose for which the
- 8 livestock or domestic animal was intended, not to exceed an average
- 9 of \$4,000.00 per animal in the flock, herd, or school. The
- 10 appraisal determination shall not delay depopulation. The
- 11 indemnification amount under this section shall include a deduction
- 12 for any compensation received, or to be received, from any other
- 13 source including, but not limited to, indemnification by the United
- 14 States department of agriculture, insurance, salvage value, or any
- 15 monetary value obtained to encourage disposal of infected or
- 16 exposed livestock or domestic animals in accordance with a disease
- 17 control or eradication program. The owner shall furnish to the
- 18 department all records indicating other sources of indemnity. An
- 19 affidavit signed by the owner attesting to the amount of
- 20 compensation for the livestock or domestic animals received, or to
- 21 be received, from any other source shall accompany the appraisal
- 22 certificate prior to indemnification under this section.
- (6)  $\overline{(5)}$  The department may provide for indemnity pursuant to
- 24 this section not to exceed \$100,000.00 per order, from any line
- 25 item in the annual budget for the department in the applicable
- 26 fiscal year. Any agreement greater than \$100,000.00 entered into
- 27 between the department and an owner of livestock shall contain a

- 1 provision indicating that, notwithstanding the terms of the
- 2 agreement, indemnification shall be subject to specific
- 3 appropriations by the legislature and not be paid from department
- 4 funds.
- 5 (7)  $\overline{(6)}$  Acceptance of compensation under this act
- 6 constitutes a full and complete release of any claim the owner has
- 7 against the state of Michigan, its departments, agencies, officers,
- 8 employees, agents, and contractors to the extent these persons were
- 9 acting on behalf of the state, within the scope of their employment
- 10 with the state or under the direction of the state, its
- 11 departments, agencies, officers, or employees, arising out of
- 12 testing, purchase, removal, slaughter, destruction, and other
- 13 disposition of the owner's animals.
- 14 (8) -(7) The right to indemnity from the state for animals
- 15 condemned and ordered slaughtered, destroyed, or otherwise disposed
- 16 of by the director, OR FOR COUGAR DEPREDATION, applies only to
- 17 native livestock and native domestic animals. Indemnification shall
- 18 not apply to livestock or domestic animals determined by the
- 19 department to be imported without meeting import requirements such
- 20 as official interstate health certificate or official interstate
- 21 certificate of veterinary inspection, required testing, required
- 22 vaccination, or for livestock or domestic animals determined by the
- 23 department to have been illegally moved within this state. An owner
- 24 is not entitled to indemnity from the state for an animal that
- 25 comes into the possession of the owner with the owner's knowledge
- 26 that the animal is diseased or is suspected of having been exposed
- 27 to an infectious, contagious, or toxicological disease. In

- 1 addition, the director shall not indemnify an owner for animals
- 2 that have been exposed to an animal that comes -in to- INTO the
- 3 possession of the owner with the owner's knowledge that the animal
- 4 is diseased or is suspected of having been exposed to an
- 5 infectious, contagious, or toxicological disease.
- 6 (9) -(8) A premises that has been depopulated shall be
- 7 cleaned and disinfected as prescribed by the director.
- 8 (10)  $\frac{(9)}{(9)}$  Repopulation of the premises, except as approved by
- 9 the director, shall not confer eligibility for future indemnity
- 10 under this section.
- 11 (11)  $\overline{(10)}$  The department may cooperate and coordinate with
- 12 the secretary of the United States department of agriculture or the
- 13 secretary's authorized representative or other governmental
- 14 departments or agencies regarding indemnification under this
- 15 section.
- 16 (12) -(11) Not less than annually, within 60 days after the
- 17 close of the fiscal year, the director shall -make a written
- 18 SUBMIT A report to the standing committees of the house of
- 19 representatives and senate having jurisdiction on agricultural and
- 20 farming issues. The report -will SHALL include the following:
- 21 (a) The amount expended by the department for bovine
- 22 tuberculosis eradication during the preceding fiscal year.
- 23 (b) An explanation of the expenditures made by the department
- 24 for bovine tuberculosis eradication during the preceding fiscal
- **25** year.
- 26 (c) The status of bovine tuberculosis eradication efforts in
- 27 Michigan.

- 1 (13)  $\frac{(12)}{(12)}$  Not less than annually, within 60 days after the
- 2 close of the fiscal year, the director of the department of natural
- 3 resources shall -make a written SUBMIT A report to the standing
- 4 committees of the house of representatives and senate having
- 5 jurisdiction on OVER agricultural and farming issues. The report
- 6 will SHALL include the following:
- 7 (a) The amount expended by the department of natural resources
- 8 for bovine tuberculosis eradication during the preceding fiscal
- 9 year.
- 10 (b) An explanation of the expenditures made by the department
- 11 of natural resources for bovine tuberculosis eradication during the
- 12 preceding fiscal year.
- 13 (14) NOT LESS THAN ANNUALLY, WITHIN 60 DAYS AFTER THE CLOSE OF
- 14 THE FISCAL YEAR, THE DIRECTOR SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE STANDING
- 15 COMMITTEES OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE HAVING
- 16 JURISDICTION OVER AGRICULTURAL AND FARMING ISSUES THAT INDICATES
- 17 THE AMOUNT EXPENDED BY THE DEPARTMENT AND ANY OTHER FEDERAL OR
- 18 STATE AGENCY OR DEPARTMENT FOR INDEMNIFICATION OF LIVESTOCK AND
- 19 DOMESTIC ANIMALS DUE TO COUGAR DEPREDATION DURING THE PRECEDING
- 20 FISCAL YEAR.
- 21 (15) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, "COUGAR" MEANS PUMA CONCOLOR AND
- 22 ANY OF ITS SUBSPECIES.
