THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 5. (1) "Domestic dependent sovereign" means an Indian tribe that has been acknowledged, recognized, restored, or reaffirmed as an Indian tribe by the secretary of the interior pursuant to chapter 576, 48 Stat. 984, 25 U.S.C. UNDER THE INDIAN REORGANIZATION ACT, 25 USC 461 to 463, 464 to 465, 466 to 470, 471
