A bill to amend 1973 PA 186, entitled "Tax tribunal act,"

by amending section 62 (MCL 205.762), as amended by 1995 PA 232.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 62. (1) The residential property and small claims 2 division created in section 61 has jurisdiction over a proceeding, otherwise cognizable by the tribunal, in which residential property 3 4 is exclusively involved. Property other than residential property 5 may be included in a proceeding before the residential property and 6 small claims division — if the amount of that property's taxable 7 value or state equalized valuation in dispute is not more than \$100,000.00. The residential property and small claims division 8 also has jurisdiction over a proceeding involving an appeal of any 10 other tax over which the tribunal has jurisdiction if the amount of

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- 1 the tax in dispute is $\frac{$6,000.00}{}$ \$20,000.00 or less.
- 2 NOTWITHSTANDING THE JURISDICTIONAL LIMIT OF THE RESIDENTIAL
- 3 PROPERTY AND SMALL CLAIMS DIVISION, BY LEAVE OF THE TRIBUNAL AND
- 4 WITH THE CONSENT OF THE PARTIES, A PROCEEDING BEFORE THE ENTIRE
- 5 TRIBUNAL MAY BE HEARD IN THE RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY AND SMALL CLAIMS
- 6 DIVISION.
- 7 (2) For purposes of this chapter, "residential property" means
- 8 a homestead or other residential or agricultural real property
- 9 including less than 4 rental units.
- 10 (2) -(3) A person or legal entity entitled to proceed under
- 11 section 31, and whose proceeding meets the jurisdictional
- 12 requirements of subsection (1), may elect to proceed before either
- 13 the residential property and small claims division or the ENTIRE
- 14 tribunal. A formal record of residential property and small claims
- 15 division proceedings is not required. Within 20 days after a
- 16 hearing OFFICER OR referee issues -an A PROPOSED order, -by leave
- 17 of the tribunal and for good cause, a party may request a rehearing
- 18 by a tribunal member A PARTY MAY FILE EXCEPTIONS TO THE PROPOSED
- 19 ORDER. THE TRIBUNAL SHALL REVIEW THE EXCEPTIONS TO DETERMINE IF THE
- 20 PROPOSED ORDER SHALL BE ADOPTED AS A FINAL ORDER. UPON A SHOWING OF
- 21 GOOD CAUSE OR AT THE TRIBUNAL'S DISCRETION, THE TRIBUNAL MAY MODIFY
- 22 THE PROPOSED ORDER AND ISSUE A FINAL ORDER OR HOLD A REHEARING BY A
- 23 TRIBUNAL MEMBER. A rehearing is not limited to the evidence
- 24 presented before the hearing OFFICER OR referee.
- 25 (3) -(4) The EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SUBSECTION,
- 26 THE residential property and small claims division shall meet in
- 27 the county in which the property in question is located or in a

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- 1 county contiguous to the county in which the property in question
- 2 is located. A petitioner-appellant shall not be required to travel
- 3 more than 100 miles from the location of the property in question
- 4 to the hearing site, except that a rehearing by a tribunal member
- 5 shall be at a site determined by the tribunal. BY LEAVE OF THE
- 6 TRIBUNAL AND WITH THE MUTUAL CONSENT OF ALL PARTIES, A RESIDENTIAL
- 7 PROPERTY AND SMALL CLAIMS DIVISION PROCEEDING MAY TAKE PLACE AT A
- 8 LOCATION MUTUALLY AGREED UPON BY ALL PARTIES OR MAY TAKE PLACE BY
- 9 THE USE OF AMPLIFIED TELEPHONIC OR VIDEO CONFERENCING EQUIPMENT.
- 10 (4) $\overline{(5)}$ The tribunal shall make a short form for the
- 11 simplified filing of residential PROPERTY AND SMALL CLAIMS appeals.
- 12 (5) -(6) In a proceeding before the residential property and
- 13 small claims division for property other than -homestead
- 14 residential property, if the amount of taxable value or state
- 15 equalized valuation in dispute is greater than \$20,000.00, or in
- 16 nonproperty matters if the amount in dispute is greater than
- 17 \$1,000.00, the filing fee is the amount that would have been paid
- 18 if the proceeding was brought before the ENTIRE tribunal and not
- 19 the residential property and small claims division.
- 20 (6) AS USED IN THIS CHAPTER, "RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY" MEANS ALL
- 21 OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 22 (A) REAL PROPERTY EXEMPT UNDER SECTION 7CC OF THE GENERAL
- 23 PROPERTY TAX ACT, 1893 PA 206, MCL 211.7CC.
- 24 (B) REAL PROPERTY CLASSIFIED AS RESIDENTIAL REAL PROPERTY
- 25 UNDER SECTION 34C OF THE GENERAL PROPERTY TAX ACT, 1893 PA 206, MCL
- 26 211.34C.
- 27 (C) REAL PROPERTY WITH LESS THAN 4 RENTAL UNITS.

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- 1 (D) REAL PROPERTY CLASSIFIED AS AGRICULTURAL REAL PROPERTY
- 2 UNDER SECTION 34C OF THE GENERAL PROPERTY TAX ACT, 1893 PA 206, MCL
