## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 405. (1) In the case of a member of a -full FULLY paid

fire department of an airport run by a county -road commission in

counties of 1,000,000 population or more—OR A PUBLIC AIRPORT

AUTHORITY, or by a state university or college; —, or of a -full

FULLY paid fire or police department of a city, township, or

incorporated village employed and compensated upon a full-time

basis; —, a county sheriff and the deputies of the county sheriff;

members—A MEMBER of the state police; —, conservation

- 1 officers; -, and AN OFFICER OF THE motor carrier -inspectors of
- 2 the Michigan public service commission ENFORCEMENT DIVISION OF THE
- 3 DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE, "personal injury" shall be construed

- 14 (3) (2) Such respiratory RESPIRATORY and heart diseases or
- 15 AND illnesses resulting therefrom, AND RESPIRATORY TRACT, BLADDER,
- 16 SKIN, BRAIN, KIDNEY, BLOOD, AND LYMPHATIC CANCERS are -deemed
- 17 CONSIDERED to arise out of and in the course of employment in the
- 18 absence of evidence to the contrary. RESPIRATORY TRACT, BLADDER,
- 19 SKIN, BRAIN, KIDNEY, BLOOD, AND LYMPHATIC CANCERS OF A MEMBER OF A
- 20 FULLY PAID FIRE DEPARTMENT ARE NOT CONSIDERED TO ARISE OUT OF AND
- 21 IN THE COURSE OF EMPLOYMENT IF EVIDENCE IS SHOWN THAT THE MEMBER OF
- 22 THE FULLY PAID FIRE DEPARTMENT WAS A CONSISTENT SMOKER OF
- 23 CIGARETTES OR OTHER TOBACCO PRODUCTS WITHIN THE 5 YEARS IMMEDIATELY
- 24 PRECEDING THE DATE OF FILING A CLAIM UNDER THIS ACT.
- 25 (4) -(3) As a condition precedent to filing an application
- 26 for benefits, the claimant, if he or she is one of those enumerated
- 27 in subsection (1) OR (2), shall first make application for, and do

- 1 all things necessary to qualify for any pension benefits which he
- 2 or she, or his or her decedent, may be entitled to. If a final
- 3 determination is made that pension benefits shall not be awarded,
- 4 then the presumption of "personal injury" as provided in this
- 5 section shall apply APPLIES. The employer or employee may request
- 6 2 copies of the determination denying pension benefits, 1 copy of
- 7 which may be filed with the bureau WORKERS' COMPENSATION AGENCY.
- 8 (5) THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION AGENCY SHALL RESEARCH THE
- 9 FINANCIAL AND PROCEDURAL IMPLICATIONS OF APPLYING A CANCER
- 10 PRESUMPTION TO VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS. THE STUDY SHALL INCLUDE A
- 11 DESCRIPTION OF THE NECESSARY AMENDMENTS TO THIS ACT IN ORDER TO
- 12 APPLY A CANCER PRESUMPTION ON AN EQUAL BASIS TO ALL CLASSIFICATIONS
- 13 OF FIREFIGHTERS. THE REPORT SHALL BE PROVIDED TO THE CHAIR AND
- 14 VICE-CHAIR OF THE SENATE AND HOUSE COMMITTEES THAT CONSIDER
- 15 WORKER'S COMPENSATION LEGISLATION BY JUNE 30, 2006.
