SENATE BILL No. 1021

February 1, 2006, Introduced by Senators CLARK-COLEMAN, BASHAM, SWITALSKI, CLARKE, THOMAS, JACOBS, LELAND, SCOTT, BRATER, OLSHOVE, CHERRY, SCHAUER, BARCIA and EMERSON and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code," (MCL 380.1 to 380.1852) by adding section 1278a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 1278A. (1) BEGINNING WITH PUPILS SCHEDULED TO GRADUATE
- 2 FROM HIGH SCHOOL IN 2010, AND SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (3), THE BOARD
- 3 OF A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF A PUBLIC SCHOOL
- ACADEMY SHALL NOT AWARD A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA TO A PUPIL UNLESS THE
- PUPIL MEETS ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- (A) HAS COMPLETED ALL SUBJECT AREA ASSESSMENTS UNDER SECTION
 - 1279 OR THE MICHIGAN MERIT EXAMINATION UNDER SECTION 1279G, AS
- APPLICABLE TO THE PUPIL UNDER SECTION 1279G, OR HAS PARTICIPATED IN
- THE ALTERNATIVE ASSESSMENTS OR ACCOMMODATIONS PROVIDED FOR UNDER
- 10 SECTION 1279(9) OR 1279G(10), AS APPLICABLE, FOR PUPILS NEEDING

- 1 SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES.
- 2 (B) HAS SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED THE COURSE CREDIT REQUIREMENTS
- 3 OF THE MICHIGAN MERIT CURRICULUM, AS DEVELOPED THROUGH COURSE
- 4 CONTENT REQUIREMENTS APPROVED BY THE STATE BOARD, AS PART OF HIS OR
- 5 HER HIGH SCHOOL COURSE WORK. THE COURSE CREDIT REQUIREMENTS OF THE
- 6 MICHIGAN MERIT CURRICULUM ARE AS FOLLOWS:
- 7 (i) AT LEAST 4 CREDITS IN ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS.
- 8 (ii) AT LEAST 4 CREDITS IN MATHEMATICS, INCLUDING COMPLETION OF
- 9 AT LEAST 2 ALGEBRA COURSES, GEOMETRY, AND AN ADDITIONAL COURSE FROM
- 10 AMONG COURSES APPROVED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL
- 11 ACADEMY. IF A PUPIL COMPLETED 1 OR MORE OF THESE SPECIFIED
- 12 MATHEMATICS COURSES BEFORE BEGINNING HIGH SCHOOL, THE PUPIL MAY
- 13 SUBSTITUTE ANOTHER MATHEMATICS COURSE FOR EACH OF THESE COURSES HE
- 14 OR SHE COMPLETED BEFORE HIGH SCHOOL.
- 15 (iii) AT LEAST 3 CREDITS IN SCIENCE, INCLUDING COMPLETION OF AT
- 16 LEAST BIOLOGY, CHEMISTRY OR PHYSICS, AND AN ADDITIONAL COURSE FROM
- 17 AMONG COURSES APPROVED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL
- 18 ACADEMY.
- 19 (iv) AT LEAST 3 CREDITS IN SOCIAL SCIENCE, INCLUDING COMPLETION
- 20 OF AT LEAST UNITED STATES HISTORY, WORLD HISTORY, ECONOMICS, AND
- 21 THE CIVICS OR GOVERNMENT COURSE DESCRIBED IN SECTION 1166(2). THE
- 22 HISTORY COURSES SHALL INCLUDE GEOGRAPHY.
- 23 (v) AT LEAST 2 CREDITS IN A WORLD LANGUAGE FROM AMONG COURSES
- 24 APPROVED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY.
- 25 (vi) AT LEAST 1 CREDIT IN HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION FROM
- 26 AMONG COURSES APPROVED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL
- 27 ACADEMY.

- 1 (vii) AT LEAST 1 CREDIT IN FINE ARTS OR MUSIC FROM AMONG
- 2 COURSES APPROVED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY.
- 3 (C) HAS SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED ELECTIVE COURSES DEVELOPED AND
- 4 OFFERED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY. THESE
- 5 ELECTIVE COURSES SHALL BE ALIGNED WITH THE FOLLOWING 21ST CENTURY
- 6 SKILLS:
- 7 (i) GLOBAL LITERACY.
- 8 (ii) CIVIC LITERACY.
- 9 (iii) FINANCIAL, ECONOMIC, AND ENTREPRENEURIAL LITERACY.
- 10 (iv) INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY LITERACY.
- 11 (v) TWENTY-FIRST CENTURY LEARNING SKILLS, FOCUSED ON WORK-
- 12 BASED INSTRUCTION.
- 13 (vi) ACCELERATED LEARNING.
- 14 (D) HAS SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED AT LEAST 1 COURSE OR LEARNING
- 15 EXPERIENCE THAT IS PRESENTED ONLINE. THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS
- 16 SUBDIVISION MAY BE MET BY COMPLETING AN ACCREDITED ONLINE COURSE,
- 17 CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION WITH ONLINE TEXTBOOKS, AN ONLINE CAREER
- 18 EXPLORATION COURSE, AN ONLINE PREPARATION COURSE FOR AN ADVANCED
- 19 PLACEMENT TEST OR THE ACT OR SAT TEST, OR A CAREER AND TECHNICAL
- 20 PREPARATION ONLINE COURSE.
- 21 (2) FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DO
- 22 ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 23 (A) DEVELOP CONTENT EXPECTATIONS FOR ALL PARTS OF THE MICHIGAN
- 24 MERIT CURRICULUM REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (1).
- 25 (B) PROVIDE GUIDANCE TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND PUBLIC SCHOOL
- 26 ACADEMIES REGARDING ELECTIVE COURSES AND THE 21ST CENTURY SKILLS
- 27 LISTED IN SUBSECTION (1)(C).

- 1 (C) DEVELOP GUIDELINES FOR ALTERNATIVE INSTRUCTIONAL DELIVERY
- 2 METHODS AS DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (4) AND A PROCESS FOR APPROVAL
- 3 OF THESE ALTERNATIVE INSTRUCTIONAL DELIVERY METHODS.
- 4 (3) THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (1) ARE SUBJECT TO BOTH OF
- 5 THE FOLLOWING:
- 6 (A) A PUPIL WHO IS IN AT LEAST GRADE 11 AND WHO HAS COMPLETED
- 7 AT LEAST 3 YEARS OF THE MICHIGAN MERIT CURRICULUM MAY REQUEST A
- 8 MODIFICATION OF HIS OR HER INDIVIDUAL HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION
- 9 REQUIREMENTS. IF A PUPIL REQUESTS MODIFICATION UNDER THIS
- 10 SUBDIVISION, THE PUPIL'S SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY
- 11 SHALL WORK WITH THE PUPIL'S PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN TO DEVELOP AN
- 12 INDIVIDUALIZED LEARNING PLAN FOR THE PUPIL. THE PUPIL MAY THEN
- 13 COMPLETE A CURRICULUM DESIGNED THROUGH THIS PROCESS AND SPECIFIED
- 14 IN THE INDIVIDUALIZED LEARNING PLAN EVEN IF IT DOES NOT MEET THE
- 15 REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (1).
- 16 (B) IF A PUPIL RECEIVES SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES, THE
- 17 PUPIL'S INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION PLAN SUPERSEDES THE REQUIREMENTS
- 18 OF SUBSECTION (1).
- 19 (4) A SCHOOL DISTRICT, INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL DISTRICT, OR PUBLIC
- 20 SCHOOL ACADEMY SHALL ENSURE THAT THE CONTENT EXPECTATIONS FOR THE
- 21 CURRICULAR REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (1) ARE MET BY PROVIDING THE
- 22 COURSE WORK SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (1) OR BY USING ALTERNATIVE
- 23 INSTRUCTIONAL DELIVERY METHODS SUCH AS ALTERNATIVE COURSE WORK,
- 24 CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION, OR HUMANITIES COURSE SEQUENCES, IF
- 25 THESE ALTERNATIVE DELIVERY METHODS ARE APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
- 26 (5) IF A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY IS UNABLE TO
- 27 IMPLEMENT ALL OF THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION FOR PUPILS

- 1 SCHEDULED TO GRADUATE IN 2010, THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL
- 2 ACADEMY MAY APPLY TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR PERMISSION TO PHASE IN THE
- 3 REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION. TO APPLY, THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR
- 4 PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY SHALL SUBMIT A PROPOSED PHASE-IN PLAN TO THE
- 5 DEPARTMENT. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL APPROVE A PHASE-IN PLAN IF THE
- 6 DEPARTMENT DETERMINES THAT THE PLAN WILL RESULT IN THE SCHOOL
- 7 DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY MAKING SATISFACTORY PROGRESS
- 8 TOWARD FULL IMPLEMENTATION OF THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION. IF
- 9 THE DEPARTMENT DISAPPROVES A PROPOSED PHASE-IN PLAN, THE DEPARTMENT
- 10 SHALL WORK WITH THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY TO
- 11 DEVELOP A SATISFACTORY PLAN THAT MAY BE APPROVED.
- 12 (6) FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, A PUPIL IS CONSIDERED TO
- 13 HAVE COMPLETED A 1-CREDIT COURSE IF THE PUPIL SUCCESSFULLY
- 14 COMPLETES ALL OF THE COURSE CONTENT EXPECTATIONS FOR THE COURSE AS
- 15 APPROVED BY THE STATE BOARD.
