A bill to amend 1939 PA 280, entitled
"The social welfare act,"
by amending sections 1 and 6 (MCL 400.1 and 400.6), as amended by
1995 PA 223.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1. (1) A department of state government is created that
shall be known and designated as the <u>family independence agency</u>,

DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES and that shall possess the powers
granted and perform the duties imposed in this act. The <u>family</u>
independence agency DEPARTMENT shall consist of a director and the
assistants and employees appointed or employed in the <u>family</u>
independence agency DEPARTMENT.

- 1 (2) The <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT** is responsible
- 2 for the operation and supervision of the institutions and
- 3 facilities established within the <u>family independence agency</u>
- 4 DEPARTMENT. The institutions and facilities may be operated on a
- 5 coeducational basis. The <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT**
- 6 shall make and enforce its own rules, not inconsistent with the law
- 7 governing the institutions or facilities under its control,
- 8 respecting the conduct of the institutions and facilities,
- 9 discipline in the institutions and facilities, the care of
- 10 property, and the welfare of the residents.
- 11 (3) The <u>family independence agency shall be</u> **DEPARTMENT IS**,
- 12 in all respects, the legal successor to the powers, duties, and
- 13 responsibilities of the juvenile institute commission.
- 14 (4) A reference in this act to "the state department of social
- 15 services", "the state department", -or "department", -means OR
- 16 "the family independence agency" MEANS THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN
- 17 SERVICES.
- 18 (5) A RULE PROMULGATED UNDER THIS ACT OR AN EXCEPTION TO A
- 19 RULE PROMULGATED UNDER THIS ACT SHALL NOT DISCRIMINATE IN FAVOR OF
- 20 OR AGAINST ANY PROVIDER, FACILITY, OR EMPLOYER LICENSED UNDER THIS
- 21 ACT BASED ON THE PRESENCE OF, OR LACK OF, A COLLECTIVE BARGAINING
- 22 AGREEMENT WITH EMPLOYEES.
- 23 Sec. 6. (1) The <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT** may
- 24 promulgate all rules necessary or desirable for the administration
- 25 of programs under this act. Rules shall be promulgated under the
- 26 administrative procedures act of 1969, Act No. 306 of the Public
- 27 Acts of 1969, being sections 24.201 to 24.328 of the Michigan

- 1 Compiled Laws 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 TO 24.328. Beginning 2
- 2 years after the effective date of subsection (2), if the Michigan
- 3 supreme court rules that sections 45 and 46 of Act No. 306 of the
- 4 Public Acts of 1969, being sections 24.245 and 24.246 of the
- 5 Michigan Compiled Laws, are unconstitutional and a statute
- 6 requiring legislative review of administrative rules is not enacted
- 7 within 90 days after the Michigan supreme court ruling, this
- 8 subsection does not apply.
- 9 (2) The <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT** may develop
- 10 regulations to implement the goals and principles of assistance
- 11 programs created under this act, including all standards and
- 12 policies related to applicants and recipients that are necessary or
- 13 desirable to administer the programs. These regulations are
- 14 effective and binding on all those affected by the assistance
- 15 programs. Except for policies described in subsections (3) and (4),
- 16 regulations described in this subsection, setting standards and
- 17 policies necessary or desirable to administer the programs, are
- 18 exempt until -the expiration of 12 months after the effective date
- 19 of this subsection MARCH 28, 1997 from the rule promulgation
- 20 requirements of the administrative procedures act of 1969, Act No.
- 21 306 of the Public Acts of 1969, being sections 24.201 to 24.328 of
- 22 the Michigan Compiled Laws 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 TO 24.328. Upon
- 23 the expiration of 12 months after the effective date of this
- 24 subsection MARCH 28, 1997, regulations described in this
- 25 subsection are not effective and binding unless processed as
- 26 emergency rules under section 48 of Act No. 306 of the Public Acts
- 27 of 1969, being section 24.248 of the Michigan Compiled Laws THE

- 1 ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT OF 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.248, or
- 2 promulgated in accordance with Act No. 306 of the Public Acts of
- 3 1969 THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT OF 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL
- 4 24.201 TO 24.328.
- 5 (3) The <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT** may develop
- 6 policies to establish income and asset limits, types of income and
- 7 assets to be considered for eligibility, and payment standards for
- 8 assistance programs administered under this act. Policies developed
- 9 under this subsection are effective and binding on all those
- 10 affected by the assistance programs. Policies described in this
- 11 subsection are exempt from the rule promulgation requirements of
- 12 Act No. 306 of the Public Acts of 1969 THE ADMINISTRATIVE
- 13 PROCEDURES ACT OF 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 TO 24.328. Not less
- 14 than 30 days before policies developed under this subsection are
- 15 implemented, they shall be submitted to the senate and house
- 16 standing committees and appropriation subcommittees with oversight
- 17 of human services.
- 18 (4) The <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT** may develop
- 19 policies to implement requirements that are mandated by federal
- 20 statute or regulations as a condition of receipt of federal funds.
- 21 Policies developed under this subsection are effective and binding
- 22 on all those affected by the programs. Policies described in this
- 23 subsection are exempt from the rule promulgation requirements of
- 24 Act No. 306 of the Public Acts of 1969 THE ADMINISTRATIVE
- 25 PROCEDURES ACT OF 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 TO 24.328.
- 26 (5) All rules, regulations, and policies established by the
- 27 family independence agency DEPARTMENT shall be in writing, shall

- 1 be provided to the legislature, and shall be made available for
- 2 inspection by any member of the public at all **DEPARTMENT** offices
- 3 of the family independence agency during regular business hours.
- 4 (6) Until the expiration of 12 months after the effective
- 5 date of this subsection MARCH 28, 1997, a bipartisan task force of
- 6 legislators appointed in the same manner as members are appointed
- 7 to standing committees of the legislature shall meet regularly with
- 8 the <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT** to review proposed
- 9 policies and regulations for the family independence program.
- 10 Meetings of the bipartisan task force are subject to the open
- 11 meetings act, Act No. 267 of the Public Acts of 1976, being
- 12 sections 15.261 to 15.275 of the Michigan Compiled Laws 1976 PA
- 13 267, MCL 15.261 TO 15.275.
- 14 (7) Subsection (2) does not apply to standards and policies
- 15 related to the providers of services which— THAT have a written
- 16 contractual relationship or are an enrolled medicaid provider with
- 17 the <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT**.
- 18 (8) A RULE PROMULGATED UNDER THIS ACT OR AN EXCEPTION TO A
- 19 RULE PROMULGATED UNDER THIS ACT SHALL NOT DISCRIMINATE IN FAVOR OF
- 20 OR AGAINST ANY PROVIDER, FACILITY, OR EMPLOYER LICENSED UNDER THIS
- 21 ACT BASED ON THE PRESENCE OF, OR LACK OF, A COLLECTIVE BARGAINING
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
