SENATE BILL No. 1349

June 29, 2006, Introduced by Senators PATTERSON, BASHAM, CROPSEY, BIRKHOLZ, BARCIA, ALLEN and HARDIMAN and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," (MCL 324.101 to 324.90106) by adding part 407.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 PART 407 VEHICLE COLLISIONS INVOLVING DEER
- 2 SEC. 40701. AS USED IN THIS PART:
- 3 (A) "COMMISSION" MEANS THE COMMISSION ON VEHICLE/DEER 4 COLLISIONS CREATED IN SECTION 40702.
 - (B) "DEPARTMENT" MEANS THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES.
- (C) "DIRECTOR" MEANS THE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT.
- 7 SEC. 40702. (1) THE COMMISSION IS CREATED WITHIN THE

- 1 DEPARTMENT.
- 2 (2) THE COMMISSION SHALL CONSIST OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS,
- 3 APPOINTED AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (3):
- 4 (A) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE DEPARTMENT.
- 5 (B) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE STATE TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT.
- 6 (C) TWO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC.
- 7 (D) A REPRESENTATIVE OF AN ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION
- 8 ORGANIZATION.
- 9 (E) A REPRESENTATIVE OF A HUNTING OR OUTDOORSMAN ORGANIZATION.
- 10 (F) A REPRESENTATIVE OF AN ANIMAL RIGHTS ORGANIZATION.
- 11 (3) EACH MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE
- 12 GOVERNOR FROM A LIST OF AT LEAST 3 NOMINEES FOR THAT POSITION
- 13 SUBMITTED BY AGREEMENT OF THE SENATE MAJORITY LEADER AND THE
- 14 SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.
- 15 (4) THE MEMBERS FIRST APPOINTED TO THE COMMISSION SHALL BE
- 16 APPOINTED WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE AMENDATORY
- 17 ACT THAT ADDED THIS PART.
- 18 (5) MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION SHALL SERVE FOR TERMS OF 4 YEARS
- 19 OR UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED, WHICHEVER IS LATER, EXCEPT THAT
- 20 OF THE MEMBERS FIRST APPOINTED, THE MEMBER APPOINTED UNDER
- 21 SUBSECTION (2) (A) SHALL SERVE FOR 1 YEAR, THE MEMBER APPOINTED
- 22 UNDER SUBSECTION (2)(B) AND 1 OF THE MEMBERS APPOINTED UNDER
- 23 SUBSECTION (2) (C) SHALL SERVE FOR 2 YEARS, AND THE MEMBERS
- 24 APPOINTED UNDER SUBSECTION (2) (D) AND (E) SHALL SERVE FOR 3 YEARS.
- 25 (6) IF A VACANCY OCCURS ON THE COMMISSION, THE GOVERNOR SHALL
- 26 MAKE AN APPOINTMENT FOR THE UNEXPIRED TERM IN THE SAME MANNER AS
- 27 THE ORIGINAL APPOINTMENT.

- 1 (7) THE GOVERNOR MAY REMOVE A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION FOR
- 2 INCOMPETENCY, DERELICTION OF DUTY, MALFEASANCE, MISFEASANCE, OR
- 3 NONFEASANCE IN OFFICE, OR ANY OTHER GOOD CAUSE.
- 4 SEC. 40703. (1) THE FIRST MEETING OF THE COMMISSION SHALL BE
- 5 CALLED BY THE DIRECTOR AND HELD WITHIN 60 DAYS AFTER THE COMMISSION
- 6 IS APPOINTED. AT THE FIRST MEETING, THE COMMISSION SHALL ELECT FROM
- 7 AMONG ITS MEMBERS A CHAIRPERSON AND OTHER OFFICERS AS IT CONSIDERS
- 8 APPROPRIATE. AFTER THE FIRST MEETING, THE COMMISSION SHALL MEET AT
- 9 LEAST QUARTERLY, OR MORE FREQUENTLY AT THE CALL OF THE CHAIRPERSON
- 10 OR IF REQUESTED BY 2 OR MORE MEMBERS.
- 11 (2) A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION CONSTITUTE A
- 12 OUORUM FOR THE TRANSACTION OF BUSINESS AT A MEETING OF THE
- 13 COMMISSION. A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS PRESENT AND SERVING ARE
- 14 REQUIRED FOR OFFICIAL ACTION OF THE COMMISSION.
- 15 (3) THE BUSINESS THAT THE COMMISSION MAY PERFORM SHALL BE
- 16 CONDUCTED AT A PUBLIC MEETING OF THE COMMISSION HELD IN COMPLIANCE
- 17 WITH THE OPEN MEETINGS ACT, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 TO 15.275.
- 18 (4) A WRITING PREPARED, OWNED, USED, IN THE POSSESSION OF, OR
- 19 RETAINED BY THE COMMISSION IN THE PERFORMANCE OF AN OFFICIAL
- 20 FUNCTION IS SUBJECT TO THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT, 1976 PA 442,
- 21 MCL 15.231 TO 15.246.
- 22 (5) MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION REPRESENTING A STATE DEPARTMENT
- 23 SHALL SERVE WITHOUT ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION. OTHER MEMBERS OF THE
- 24 COMMISSION SHALL SERVE WITHOUT COMPENSATION. HOWEVER, MEMBERS OF
- 25 THE COMMISSION MAY BE REIMBURSED FOR THEIR ACTUAL AND NECESSARY
- 26 EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR OFFICIAL DUTIES AS
- 27 MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION.

- 1 SEC. 40704. THE COMMISSION SHALL DO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING IN
- 2 CONSULTATION WITH FEDERAL AND LOCAL OFFICIALS AND AGENCIES:
- 3 (A) STUDY THE PROBLEM OF COLLISIONS BETWEEN VEHICLES AND DEER,
- 4 ESPECIALLY THOSE COLLISIONS OCCURRING BETWEEN SEPTEMBER 15 AND
- 5 DECEMBER 15.
- 6 (B) IDENTIFY AREAS WHERE A HIGH NUMBER OF COLLISIONS BETWEEN
- 7 VEHICLES AND DEER OR OTHER ANIMALS OCCUR.
- 8 (C) IDENTIFY WAYS TO REDUCE THE NUMBER OR SEVERITY OF
- 9 COLLISIONS BETWEEN VEHICLES AND DEER, INCLUDING ALL OF THE
- 10 FOLLOWING:
- 11 (i) FENCING.
- 12 (ii) TUNNELS OR OVERPASSES.
- 13 (iii) RELOCATING DEER.
- 14 (iv) REDUCING SPEED LIMITS IN CERTAIN AREAS.
- 15 (v) REPELLENTS.
- 16 (vi) ROADSIDE VEGETATION MANAGEMENT.
- 17 (vii) ROADSIDE REFLECTORS AND MIRRORS.
- 18 (viii) ROADWAY LIGHTING.
- 19 (ix) IN-VEHICLE COUNTERMEASURES.
- 20 (x) DEER WHISTLES.
- 21 (xi) HUNTING AND OTHER METHODS OF REDUCING DEER POPULATIONS.
- 22 (xii) PUBLIC INFORMATION AND EDUCATION PROGRAMS.
- 23 (D) IDENTIFY FUNDING SOURCES TO IMPLEMENT SOLUTIONS
- 24 RECOMMENDED UNDER SUBDIVISION (C).
- 25 (E) SUBMIT REPORTS TO THE DIRECTOR, THE DIRECTOR OF THE STATE
- 26 TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT, AND THE LEGISLATURE ON ITS FINDINGS AND
- 27 RECOMMENDATIONS UNDER SUBDIVISIONS (A) TO (D). THE FIRST REPORT

- 1 SHALL BE SUBMITTED WITHIN 6 MONTHS AFTER THE FIRST MEETING OF THE
- 2 COMMISSION.
