CHANGE OF NAME AFTER DIVORCE: MAKE GENDER NEUTRAL

A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILL 5513 AS INTRODUCED 12-4-07

Currently, after a divorce is granted by a court, the court may restore a woman's maiden name or her legal surname prior to the marriage. If a man, however, had taken all or a part of his wife's name, he must complete a formal court procedure at an additional cost to restore his prior surname.

<u>House Bill 5513</u> would amend Public Act 299 of 1905, which provides for changing and determining the names of divorced <u>women</u>, to instead provide for changing and determining the names of divorced <u>individuals</u>. The bill would revise the current law to be gender neutral, applying to either or both parties in a divorce action.
