## **HOUSE BILL No. 4508**

March 21, 2007, Introduced by Reps. Ward, Rocca, Wenke and LaJoy and referred to the Committee on Ethics and Elections.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled

"Michigan election law,"

by amending sections 758 and 764b (MCL 168.758 and 168.764b), as amended by 1996 PA 207, and by adding section 763.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 758. (1) For the purposes of this act, "absent voter"
- 2 means EITHER A QUALIFIED AND REGISTERED ELECTOR WHO MEETS THE
- 3 REQUIREMENTS UNDER SECTION 763 OR a qualified and registered
- 4 elector who meets 1 or more of the following requirements:
- (a) On account of physical disability, cannot withoutanother's assistance attend the polls on the day of an election.
  - (b) On account of the tenets of his or her religion, cannot attend the polls on the day of election.

- 1 (c) Cannot attend the polls on the day of an election in the
- 2 precinct in which he or she resides because of being an election
- 3 precinct inspector in another precinct.
- **4** (d) Is 60 years of age or older.
- (e) Is absent or expects to be absent from the township or
- 6 city in which he or she resides during the entire period the polls
- 7 are open for voting on the day of an election.
- 8 (f) Cannot attend the polls on election day because of being
- 9 confined in jail awaiting arraignment or trial.
- 10 (2) Subsection (1) does not apply to a person who has moved
- 11 outside of this state, regardless of length of his or her residence
- 12 outside of this state, and who no longer maintains an actual
- 13 residence in this state. The storage of personal effects or
- 14 household goods, the ownership of property that is rented or leased
- 15 to others, or occasional brief visits to a former domicile in this
- 16 state while residing outside of this state for most of the year
- 17 does DO not constitute a residence for voting purposes in this
- 18 state, except for each of the following:
- 19 (a) A person described in section 1 of article II of the state
- 20 constitution of 1963 and statutes enacted under that section.
- 21 (b) A person described in section 759a.
- 22 SEC. 763. (1) A QUALIFIED AND REGISTERED ELECTOR WHO APPEARS
- 23 AT THE CITY, TOWNSHIP, OR VILLAGE CLERK'S OFFICE AT ANY TIME DURING
- 24 THE 7 DAYS PRECEDING AN ELECTION BUT NOT LATER THAN 4 P.M. OF THE
- 25 DAY PRECEDING THE ELECTION EXCEPT SUNDAY OR A LEGAL HOLIDAY MAY
- 26 REOUEST AND COMPLETE AN ABSENT VOTER BALLOT APPLICATION AS SET
- 27 FORTH IN SUBSECTION (2). AN APPLICANT WHO COMPLETES AND SIGNS THE

1	ABSENT VOTER BALLOT APPLICATION UNDER SUBSECTION (2) SHALL RECEIVE
2	HIS OR HER ABSENT VOTER BALLOT AND VOTE THE BALLOT IN THE CLERK'S
3	OFFICE WITHOUT HAVING TO PROVIDE A REASON IF HE OR SHE PRESENTS TO
4	THE CLERK A MICHIGAN OPERATOR'S OR CHAUFFEUR'S LICENSE, DEPARTMENT
5	OF STATE ISSUED PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION CARD, OTHER GOVERNMENT
6	ISSUED PHOTO IDENTIFICATION CARD, OR A PHOTO IDENTIFICATION CARD
7	ISSUED BY AN INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN THIS STATE
8	DESCRIBED IN SECTION 6 OF ARTICLE VIII OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION OF
9	1963 OR A JUNIOR COLLEGE OR COMMUNITY COLLEGE ESTABLISHED UNDER
10	SECTION 7 OF ARTICLE VIII OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION OF 1963 TO
11	ESTABLISH HIS OR HER IDENTITY. THE INSTRUCTIONS FOR AN ABSENT VOTER
12	AS SET FORTH IN SECTION 764A SHALL BE INCLUDED WITH EACH BALLOT
13	FURNISHED TO AN ABSENT VOTER UNDER THIS SECTION.
14	(2) THE ABSENT VOTER BALLOT APPLICATION USED PURSUANT TO THIS
15	SECTION SHALL BE IN SUBSTANTIALLY THE FOLLOWING FORM:

12	(3) AN ABSENT VOTER UNDER THIS SECTION, AFTER RECEIVING AND
13	VOTING THE BALLOT IN THE CLERK'S OFFICE, SHALL SUBMIT THE BALLOT IN
14	THE RETURN ENVELOPE PERSONALLY TO THE CLERK OR AN AUTHORIZED
15	ASSISTANT CLERK. AS SET FORTH IN SECTION 761(4), AN ABSENT VOTER
16	UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL SIGN AND DATE THE RETURN ENVELOPE IN THE
17	PLACE DESIGNATED.
18	(4) A PERSON WHO MAKES A FALSE STATEMENT IN AN ABSENT VOTER
19	BALLOT APPLICATION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR. A PERSON WHO FORGES
20	A SIGNATURE ON AN ABSENT VOTER BALLOT APPLICATION IS GUILTY OF A
21	FELONY.
22	(5) IF A CITY, TOWNSHIP, OR VILLAGE CLERK'S OFFICE DOES NOT
23	MAINTAIN REGULAR BUSINESS HOURS DURING THE 7 DAYS PRECEDING AN
24	ELECTION, AND THE CITY, TOWNSHIP, OR VILLAGE CLERK ENTERS INTO AN
25	AGREEMENT WITH THE COUNTY CLERK THAT ALLOWS ABSENT VOTERS TO VOTE
26	AT THE COUNTY CLERK'S OFFICE, A QUALIFIED AND REGISTERED ELECTOR
27	MAY APPLY AND VOTE PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION AT THE COUNTY CLERK'S

- 2 (6) EACH CITY, TOWNSHIP, OR VILLAGE CLERK MAY MAKE 1 VOTING
- 3 MACHINE AVAILABLE THAT ALLOWS AN ABSENT VOTER UNDER THIS SECTION TO
- 4 CHECK HIS OR HER BALLOT FOR ERRORS WITHOUT TABULATING THE BALLOT.
- 5 THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES TO EACH COUNTY CLERK WHO AGREES TO ALLOW
- 6 ABSENT VOTERS TO VOTE AT THE COUNTY CLERK'S OFFICE PURSUANT TO
- 7 SUBSECTION (5).
- 8 Sec. 764b. (1) An EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 763, AN absent
- 9 voter ballot shall be delivered to the clerk only as authorized in
- 10 the instructions for an absent voter provided in section 764a.
- 11 (2) The clerk of a city, township, or village may accept
- 12 delivery of absent voter ballots at any location in the city,
- 13 township, or village.
- 14 (3) The clerk of a city, township, or village may appoint the
- 15 number of assistants necessary to accept delivery of absent voter
- 16 ballots at any location in the city, township, or village. An
- 17 appointment as assistant to accept delivery of absent voter ballots
- 18 shall be for 1 election only. An assistant appointed to receive
- 19 ballots at a location other than the CLERK'S office of the clerk
- 20 shall be furnished credentials of authority by the clerk. If an
- 21 absent voter's ballot is received by an assistant at any location
- 22 other than the clerk's office the assistant, upon request, shall
- 23 exhibit the credentials to the absent voter before the assistant
- 24 accepts an absent voter ballot. An assistant, before entering upon
- 25 the discharge of duties, shall take and subscribe to the oath of
- 26 office as provided in section 1 of article XI of the state
- 27 constitution of 1963. An assistant shall perform only the duties

- 1 assigned by the clerk. A person shall not be appointed as an
- 2 assistant to accept delivery of absent voter ballots who is a
- 3 candidate or a member of the immediate family of a candidate whose
- 4 name appears on the ballot at that election.
- 5 (4) A clerk who receives a request from an absent voter under
- 6 section 764a for assistance in returning his or her absent voter
- 7 ballot shall make arrangements to collect the ballot from the voter
- 8 either personally or by sending an authorized assistant, if all of
- 9 the following conditions are satisfied:
- 10 (a) The clerk's office issued the absent voter ballot to that
- 11 absent voter.
- 12 (b) Upon the clerk's request, the absent voter states that he
- 13 or she is unable to return the absent voter ballot by the other
- 14 means specified in instructions (a), (b), or (c) of Step 5 under
- **15** section 764a.
- 16 (c) The absent voter telephones the appropriate clerk for
- 17 assistance on or before 5 p.m. on the Friday immediately preceding
- 18 **BEFORE** the election.
- 19 (d) The absent voter is requesting the clerk to pick up the
- 20 absent voter ballot within the jurisdictional limits of the city,
- 21 township, or village in which the absent voter is registered.
- 22 (5) Notwithstanding subsection (4), a clerk who receives a
- 23 request from an absent voter under section 764a for assistance in
- 24 returning his or her absent voter ballot may make arrangements to
- 25 collect the ballot from the voter either personally or by sending
- 26 an authorized assistant, if all of the following conditions are
- 27 satisfied:

- 1 (a) The clerk's office issued the absent voter ballot to that
- 2 absent voter.
- 3 (b) Upon the clerk's request, the absent voter states that he
- 4 or she is unable to return the absent voter ballot by the other
- 5 means specified in instructions (a), (b), or (c) of Step 5 under
- 6 section 764a.
- 7 (6) The clerk shall maintain a list open to the public that
- 8 contains the names and addresses of all authorized assistants
- 9 appointed under this section who are available to collect absent
- 10 voter ballots on or before election day in that city or township.
- 11 (7) An absent voter ballot received by the clerk before the
- 12 close of the polls on election day shall not be invalidated solely
- 13 because the delivery to the clerk was not in compliance with
- 14 section 764a or this section, however the ballot shall be
- 15 considered challenged and shall be marked and processed as provided
- 16 in section 745.
