HOUSE BILL No. 4734

May 9, 2007, Introduced by Rep. Gaffney and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending section 8325 (MCL 324.8325).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 8325. (1) The director shall promulgate rules for
- 2 implementing this part, including, but not limited to, rules
- 3 providing for the following:
- 4 (a) The collection, examination, and reporting the results of5 examination of samples of pesticides or devices.
- 6 (b) The safe handling, transportation, storage, display,7 distribution, and disposal of pesticides and their containers.
 - (c) The designation of restricted use pesticides for the state or for specified areas within the state. The director may include

- 1 in the rule the time and conditions of sale, distribution, and use
- 2 of restricted use pesticides.
- 3 (d) The certification and licensing of applicators and the
- 4 licensing of restricted use pesticide dealers.
- 5 (e) The maintenance of records by certified commercial
- 6 applicators with respect to applications of restricted use
- 7 pesticides.
- 8 (f) Good practice in the use of pesticides.
- 9 (g) Notification or posting, or both, designed to inform
- 10 persons entering certain public and private buildings or areas
- 11 where the application of a pesticide, other than a general use
- 12 ready-to-use pesticide, has occurred.
- 13 (h) Use of a pesticide in a manner consistent with its
- 14 labeling including adequate supervision of noncertified applicators
- 15 if appropriate.
- 16 (i) Prenotification by the building manager upon request for
- 17 affected persons regarding the application of a pesticide at
- 18 daycare centers and schools.
- 19 (j) Responsibility of a building manager to post signs
- 20 provided to him or her by the commercial applicator.
- 21 (k) Designation of posted school bus stops as sensitive areas.
- 22 (1) The establishing of a schedule of civil fines for violation
- 23 of local ordinances as described in section 8328(3).
- 24 (2) By December 27, 1989, the director shall submit rules to
- 25 the joint committee on administrative rules pertaining to all of
- 26 the following:
- 27 (a) The development of a training program for applicators who

- 1 apply pesticides for private agricultural purposes on the use of
- 2 appropriate procedures for the application of pesticides; safety
- 3 procedures for pesticide application; clothing and protective
- 4 equipment for pesticide application; the detection of common
- 5 symptoms of pesticide poisoning; the means of obtaining emergency
- 6 medical treatment; hazards posed by pesticides to workers, the
- 7 public health, and the environment; specific categories of
- 8 pesticides; and the requirements of applicable laws, rules, and
- 9 labeling.
- 10 (b) The development of training programs for integrated pest
- 11 management systems in schools, public buildings, and health care
- 12 facilities.
- 13 (c) The duty of commercial applicators to inform customers of
- 14 potential risks and benefits associated with the application of
- 15 pesticides.
- 16 (3) By June 27, 1990, the director shall submit rules to the
- 17 joint committee on administrative rules pertaining to the
- 18 protection of agriculture employees who hand harvest agricultural
- 19 commodities regarding all of the following:
- 20 (a) The establishment of field reentry periods after the
- 21 application of agricultural pesticides.
- 22 (b) The posting and notification of areas where pesticides
- 23 have been applied.
- 24 (c) The use of protective clothing, safety devices, hand
- 25 washing, or other methods of protection from pesticide exposure.
- (d) Notification of agricultural workers of poison treatment
- 27 facilities.

- 1 (4) If the EPA at any time adopts and publishes agricultural
- 2 worker protection standards, the federal standards shall supersede
- 3 rules promulgated under subsection (3).
- 4 (5) By December 27, 1989, the director shall submit rules to
- 5 the joint committee on administrative rules. These rules shall
- 6 include all of the following:
- 7 (a) Minimum standards of competency and experience or
- 8 expertise for trainers of certified and registered applicators.
- 9 (b) The development of a training program for applicators on
- 10 the use of appropriate procedures for the application of
- 11 pesticides; safety procedures for pesticide application; clothing
- 12 and protective equipment for pesticide application; the detection
- of common symptoms of pesticide poisoning; the means of obtaining
- 14 emergency medical treatment; hazards posed by pesticides to
- 15 workers, the public health, and the environment; specific
- 16 categories of pesticides; and the requirements of applicable laws,
- 17 rules, and labeling.
- 18 (c) The number of directly supervised application hours
- 19 required before a registered applicator may apply each category of
- 20 restricted use pesticide without direct supervision.
- 21 (6) BEGINNING THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE AMENDATORY ACT THAT
- 22 ADDED THIS SUBSECTION AND NOTWITHSTANDING R 285.637.5 OF THE
- 23 MICHIGAN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE, AN APPLICANT FOR INITIAL OR RENEWAL
- 24 REGISTRATION AND INCLUSION ON THE PESTICIDE NOTIFICATION REGISTRY,
- 25 ESTABLISHED IN R 285.637.5, IS NOT REQUIRED TO OBTAIN AND SUBMIT A
- 26 PHYSICIAN'S CERTIFICATE WITH THE APPLICATION. THE APPLICANT MAY
- 27 ALSO DESIGNATE AN ADDITIONAL PROPERTY, THAT IS NOT ADJACENT TO HIS

- 1 OR HER PRIMARY RESIDENCE, THAT IS SUBJECT TO THE NOTIFICATION
- 2 REQUIREMENT IMPOSED IN THAT RULE.
