HOUSE BILL No. 5161

September 5, 2007, Introduced by Reps. Melton and Condino and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1999 PA 94, entitled

"Michigan merit award scholarship act,"

by amending sections 7b and 8 (MCL 390.1457b and 390.1458), as amended by 2006 PA 478.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 7b. (1) In addition to the requirements set forth in
- 2 section 7(2) or section 7a(1), to be eligible for the award of a
- 3 Michigan merit award scholarship under this act, the board must
- 4 find that a student satisfies all of the following:
- (a) The student has graduated from high school or passed the
 general educational development (GED) test or other graduate
 equivalency examination approved by the state board.
 - (b) The student graduated from high school or passed the general educational development (GED) test or other graduate

- 1 equivalency examination approved by the state board within 1 of the
- 2 following time periods:
- 3 (i) If the student graduated from high school or passed the
- 4 test or examination before March 1, 2002, within the 7-year period
- 5 preceding the student's application to receive his or her Michigan
- 6 merit award scholarship money.
- 7 (ii) If EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (iii), IF the student
- 8 graduated from high school on or after March 1, 2002 and before the
- 9 2006-2007 school year, within the 4-year period preceding the date
- 10 of the student's application to receive his or her Michigan merit
- 11 award scholarship money, or if the student becomes a member of the
- 12 United States armed forces or peace corps during this 4-year period
- 13 and serves for 4 years or less, the 4-year period is extended by a
- 14 period equal to the number of days the student served as a member
- 15 of the United States armed forces or peace corps. The board may
- 16 also extend the 4-year period if the board determines that an
- 17 extension is warranted because of an illness or disability of the
- 18 student or in the student's immediate family or another family
- 19 emergency.
- 20 (iii) IF THE STUDENT GRADUATED FROM HIGH SCHOOL ON OR AFTER
- 21 MARCH 1, 2002 AND BEFORE THE 2006-2007 SCHOOL YEAR, AND BEFORE JULY
- 22 26, 2002 RECEIVED WRITTEN NOTIFICATION FROM THE BOARD OR THE
- 23 DEPARTMENT OF TREASURY THAT INDICATED THAT HE OR SHE HAD 7 YEARS TO
- 24 RECEIVE HIS OR HER MICHIGAN MERIT AWARD SCHOLARSHIP, WITHIN THE 7-
- 25 YEAR PERIOD PRECEDING THE DATE OF THE STUDENT'S APPLICATION TO
- 26 RECEIVE HIS OR HER MICHIGAN MERIT AWARD SCHOLARSHIP MONEY.
- 27 (c) The student is enrolled in an approved postsecondary

- 1 educational institution. For students who qualify under section
- 2 7(2)(c), the student is enrolled in a vocational or technical
- 3 education program at an approved postsecondary educational
- 4 institution.
- 5 (d) The student has not been convicted of a felony involving
- 6 an assault, physical injury, or death.
- 7 (e) The student satisfies any additional eligibility
- 8 requirements established by the board.
- 9 (2) For a middle school assessment test or high school
- 10 assessment test administered after January 1, 2000, the board shall
- 11 not use that assessment test to determine eligibility for a
- 12 Michigan merit award scholarship under this section for a
- 13 particular year unless the board has reviewed and approved that
- 14 assessment test before it was administered for that year.
- 15 (3) The board shall provide each pupil written notice of
- 16 whether or not the pupil is eligible for the award of 1 or more
- 17 Michigan merit award scholarships described in this act. If the
- 18 pupil is eligible, the written notice shall also contain the
- 19 Michigan merit award scholarship amount for which the pupil is
- 20 eligible, how the pupil applies for payment of Michigan merit award
- 21 scholarship, and any other information the board considers
- 22 necessary regarding qualification requirements or conditions
- 23 relating to the use of the Michigan merit award scholarship.
- 24 (4) It is the intent of the legislature that the level of
- 25 pupil performance required to achieve qualifying results in a
- 26 subject area of an assessment test remains approximately the same,
- 27 and that the board not reduce the required level of pupil

- 1 performance as a means of increasing the number of Michigan merit
- 2 award scholarships awarded.
- 3 (5) A pupil who does not initially receive qualifying results
- 4 shall be extended an opportunity to achieve the requisite
- 5 qualifying results by taking a subsequent assessment test.
- 6 (6) A nonpublic school pupil or home school pupil may take,
- 7 and the board shall administer if requested, an assessment test at
- 8 a site designated by the board.
- 9 Sec. 8. (1) Michigan merit award scholarship money shall be
- 10 used only to pay for eligible costs.
- 11 (2) The board shall determine the manner and form of
- 12 application for payment of a Michigan merit award scholarship by a
- 13 student eligible under this act and the procedure for payment to
- 14 the student or to an approved postsecondary educational institution
- 15 on the student's behalf, subject to 1 of the following, as
- **16** applicable:
- 17 (a) As determined by the board, upon the request of a student
- 18 or parent or legal guardian of a minor student, the board may pay a
- 19 Michigan merit award scholarship in 2 consecutive annual
- 20 installments rather than 1 lump sum for a student who graduates
- 21 from high school or passes the general educational development
- 22 (GED) test or approved graduate equivalency examination before
- 23 March 1, 2003.
- 24 (b) For each student who graduates from high school or passes
- 25 the general educational development (GED) test or approved graduate
- 26 equivalency examination on or after March 1, 2003 and before March
- 27 1, 2004, the board shall pay a Michigan merit award scholarship in

- 1 2 consecutive annual installments, beginning in the state fiscal
- 2 year for which the student is otherwise eligible. The first
- 3 installment shall not exceed 50% of the award amount, and the
- 4 second installment shall consist of the remaining award amount.
- 5 Verification that the student has met the enrollment criteria under
- 6 section 7b(1)(c) is required before payment of the second
- 7 installment.
- 8 (c) For each student who graduates from high school or passes
- 9 the general educational development (GED) test or approved graduate
- 10 equivalency examination on or after March 1, 2004 and before the
- 11 2006-2007 school year, the board shall pay a Michigan merit award
- 12 scholarship in 2 consecutive annual installments, beginning in the
- 13 state fiscal year that begins after the beginning of the academic
- 14 year for which the student is otherwise eligible. The first
- 15 installment shall not exceed 50% of the award amount, and the
- 16 second installment shall consist of the remaining award amount.
- 17 Verification that the student has met the enrollment criteria under
- 18 section 7b(1)(c) is required before payment of the second
- 19 installment.
- 20 (3) An approved postsecondary educational institution shall
- 21 not consider a Michigan merit award scholarship in determining a
- 22 student's eligibility for a financial aid program administered by
- 23 this state. It is the intent of the legislature that an approved
- 24 postsecondary educational institution not reduce institutionally-
- 25 funded student aid because of the Michigan merit award scholarship
- 26 program.
- 27 (4) Before payment of a Michigan merit award scholarship to a

- 1 student or an approved postsecondary educational institution, the
- 2 student shall certify or affirm in writing to the board each of the
- 3 following:
- 4 (a) That the student is enrolled at an approved postsecondary
- 5 educational institution.
- 6 (b) The name of the approved postsecondary educational
- 7 institution in which the student is enrolled.
- 8 (c) That the student agrees to use the Michigan merit award
- 9 scholarship only for eligible costs.
- 10 (d) That the student has not been convicted of a felony
- 11 involving an assault, physical injury, or death.
- 12 (e) That the student graduated from high school or passed the
- 13 general educational development (GED) test or approved graduate
- 14 equivalency examination within 1 of the following time periods:
- 15 (i) If the student graduated from high school or passed the
- 16 test or examination before March 1, 2002, within the 7-year period
- 17 preceding the date of the student's application to receive his or
- 18 her Michigan merit award scholarship.
- 19 (ii) If EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (iii), IF the student
- 20 graduated on or after March 1, 2002 and before the 2006-2007 school
- 21 year, within the 4-year period preceding the date of the student's
- 22 application to receive his or her Michigan merit award scholarship,
- 23 or within a period equal to 4 years plus the number of days the
- 24 student served as a member of the United States armed forces or
- 25 peace corps if the student became a member of the United States
- 26 armed forces or peace corps during this 4-year period and served
- 27 for 4 years or less. The board may also extend the 4-year period if

- 1 the board determines that an extension is warranted because of an
- 2 illness or disability of the student or in the student's immediate
- 3 family or another family emergency.
- 4 (iii) IF THE STUDENT GRADUATED FROM HIGH SCHOOL ON OR AFTER
- 5 MARCH 1, 2002 AND BEFORE THE 2006-2007 SCHOOL YEAR, AND BEFORE JULY
- 6 26, 2002 RECEIVED WRITTEN NOTIFICATION FROM THE BOARD OR THE
- 7 DEPARTMENT OF TREASURY THAT INDICATED THAT HE OR SHE HAD 7 YEARS TO
- 8 RECEIVE HIS OR HER MICHIGAN MERIT AWARD SCHOLARSHIP, WITHIN THE 7-
- 9 YEAR PERIOD PRECEDING THE DATE OF THE STUDENT'S APPLICATION TO
- 10 RECEIVE HIS OR HER MICHIGAN MERIT AWARD SCHOLARSHIP.
- 11 (5) The board shall not begin disbursing funds for a Michigan
- 12 merit award scholarship to a student or an approved postsecondary
- 13 educational institution on behalf of the student unless it receives
- 14 the request or application for payment, including the written
- 15 certification or affirmation described in this section, from the
- 16 student on or before 1 of the following dates, for disbursement in
- 17 that academic year:
- 18 (a) In the 2002-2003 academic year, January 15.
- 19 (b) In the 2003-2004 academic year, September 15 if the
- 20 student received notification of eligibility prior to August 1.
- 21 (c) In the 2003-2004 academic year, November 15 if the student
- 22 received notification of eligibility on or after August 1.
- (d) In the 2004-2005 academic year, December 15.
- (e) In any other academic year, November 15.
