THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 159g. As used in this chapter, "racketeering" means committing, attempting to commit, conspiring to commit, or aiding or abetting, soliciting, coercing, or intimidating a person to commit an offense for financial gain, involving any of the following:
 - (a) A felony violation of section 8 of the tobacco products tax act, 1993 PA 327, MCL 205.428, concerning tobacco product taxes, or section 9 of former 1947 PA 265, concerning cigarette taxes.

- 17 (jj) An offense committed within this state or another state
- 18 that constitutes racketeering activity as defined in section
- 19 1961(1) of title 18 of the United States Code, 18 U.S.C. USC 1961.
- 20 (kk) An offense committed within this state or another state
- 21 in violation of a law of the United States that is substantially
- 22 similar to a violation listed in subdivisions (a) through (ii).
- 23 (ll) An offense committed in another state in violation of a
- 24 statute of that state that is substantially similar to a violation
- 25 listed in subdivisions (a) through (ii).
- 26 Sec. 273. Fraudulently obtaining signature to note, etc. Any A
- 27 person who shall, by representing that he is the agent of any

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- 1 person, company, firm or corporation, or by any other means,
- 2 fraudulently obtain OBTAINS the signature of any person with the
- 3 intent to cheat and defraud such THAT person , to any promissory
- 4 note, bill of exchange, due bill, order, contract or any paper
- 5 writing whatever, shall be IS guilty of A felony, punishable by
- 6 imprisonment in the state prison FOR not more than 10 years or by A
- 7 fine of not more than 5,000 dollars \$5,000.00, OR BOTH.
