Overview

Article VI of the State Constitution of 1963 forms the basis for Michigan's judicial branch of government, which receives funds appropriated through the budget act for the Judiciary. The Judiciary budget provides operational funding for the Michigan Supreme Court, Court of Appeals, and related judicial agencies. The budget also funds the salaries of justices of the Supreme Court and judges of the appeals, circuit, probate, and district courts according to constitutional and statutory requirements. Assistance for local court operations is provided through a variety of grant programs. The largest of these, the Court Equity grant program, reimburses counties for trial court operations based on a statutory formula that recognizes circuit and probate caseloads and the numbers of judgeships.

Executive recommended two percent administrative reduction from FY 2008-09 enacted appropriation (prior to negative supplemental reductions) spread to various line items. Senate reduced current FY 2008-09 YTD (with negative supplemental included) by an additional \$3.1 million spread to various line items. House reduced current FY 2008-09 YTD (with negative supplemental included) by an additional \$3.2 million spread to various line items: Supreme Court Administration (\$228,200); Judicial Institute (\$45,800); Supreme Court Administrative Office (\$125,500); Judicial Information Systems (\$54,100); Foster Care Review Board \$16,400; Drug Treatment Courts \$31,500; Court of Appeals (\$2,100); Judicial Tenure Commission (\$18,200); Appellate Public Defender Program \$91,900; Appellate Assigned Counsel \$17,900; Court Equity Fund (\$2,907,600). Both House and Senate GF/GP funding reduction figures assume a \$2.5 million transfer from the juror compensation reimbursement fund to the general fund to mitigate Judiciary budget general fund reductions. Conference concurred with the Senate reductions, with the exception of the Court Equity Fund reduction being \$233,000 lower than the Senate version. The conference reductions did not assume the \$2.5 million Juror Compensation Reimbursement Fund transfer assumed in the Senate reductions. Alternatively, the Conference assumed a lesser transfer of \$1,352,100 from the Juror Compensation Reimbursement Fund to the State General Fund.

Major Boilerplate Changes From FY 2008-09

Sec. 204. Employee Contact with Legislature - MAINTAINED

Building occupancy increase: \$12,600 gross, \$14,400 GF/GP

Prohibits disciplinary action against a judicial employee for communicating with a Legislator or his or her staff. <u>Executive</u> deleted. <u>Senate</u> retained current-year language. <u>House</u> retained current-year language. <u>Conference</u> retained current-year language.

Sec. 212. Retention of Reports - MAINTAINED

Directs the judicial branch to comply with federal and state guidelines for short-term and long-term retention of reports funded through appropriations. <u>Executive</u> deleted. <u>Senate</u> retained current-year language. <u>House</u> deleted. <u>Conference</u> concurred with the Senate.

Sec. 215. Travel Restrictions - MAINTAINED

Restricts out-of-state travel for judicial branch employees. <u>Executive</u> removed section allowing chief justice to grant exceptions on out-of-state travel restrictions. <u>Senate</u> retained current-year language. <u>House</u> retained current-year language.

Major Boilerplate Changes From FY 2008-09

Sec. 216. Report Requirement - MAINTAINED

Requires judicial branch to report by April 1, 2008, on each policy change made to implement enacted legislation; prohibits funding for regulatory plans or for rules that fail to reduce economic impact on small businesses. Executive deleted. Senate retained current-year language. House deleted. Conference concurred with the Senate.

Sec. 218. Out-of-State Professional Development Conference Travel – MAINTAINED

Limits travel to out-of-state professional development conferences to one judicial employee unless conference is funded by federal or private funding source and requires more than once person to attend. <u>Executive</u> deleted. <u>Senate</u> retained current-year language. <u>House</u> retained current-year language.

Sec. 219. General Fund Lapses - NEW

Requires a report on General Fund lapses. <u>Senate</u> adds as new language. <u>House</u> did not include. <u>Conference</u> concurred with the Senate.

Sec. 220. Satellite Offices - NEW

Intent language stating that the Supreme Court shall retain their satellite offices. <u>House</u> added as new language. Conference concurred with the House.

Sec. 221. Transparency - NEW

Requires the judicial branch to develop and maintain, on a publicly accessible Internet site, all expenditures made by the judicial branch within the fiscal year. House added as new language. Conference concurred with the House.

Sec. 304. Auditor General - MAINTAINED

Requires judicial branch to cooperate with the auditor general in audits of judicial branch. <u>Executive</u> deleted. <u>Senate</u> retained current-year language. House retained current-year language. Conference retained current-year language.

Sec. 305. Expenditure and Revenue Reports - MAINTAINED

Requires quarterly financial reports on judiciary budget revenue and expenditure. <u>Executive</u> deleted. <u>Senate</u> retained current-year language. <u>House</u> retained current-year language.

Sec. 309. Pilot Mental Health Courts - REVISED

Requires State Court Administrative Office to work with the Department of Community Health to develop guidelines for the operation and evaluation of pilot mental health courts. Local courts may apply for funding based on community need and local commitment. Executive deleted. Senate revised to require an update on the status of the pilot courts by April 1, 2010. House concurred with Senate. Conference concurred with the Senate and House.

Sec. 312. Parental Rights Restoration Act Report - MAINTAINED

Instructs state court administrator to report total number of petitions filed by minors seeking court-issued waiver of parental consent under Parental Rights Restoration Act, and total number of petitions granted. <u>Executive</u> deleted. <u>Senate</u> retained current-year language. House deleted. Conference concurred with the Senate.

Sec. 314. Standardized Risk Assessment - NEW

Requests the State Court Administrative Office to conduct a survey of trial courts to determine best practices for standardized risk assessment. <u>Senate</u> added as new language. <u>House</u> did not include. <u>Conference</u> concurred with the Senate.

Sec. 318. Intensive Probation Pilot Program - NEW

Establishes an intensive probation pilot program with an IDG from the Department of Corrections. <u>Senate</u> added as new language. <u>House</u> revised section to intent language instructing the judiciary and department of corrections to cooperate in the development and implementation of a pilot project for high-risk, high-need probationers. <u>Conference</u> concurred with the Senate.

Sec. 319. Juvenile Training Pilot Project - NEW

Establishes a pilot project to train criminal defense attorneys who accept court-appointed cases concerning juvenile delinquency, abuse, neglect, and protective services. <u>Senate</u> added as new language. <u>House</u> concurred with Senate. <u>Conference</u> concurred with the Senate and House.
