#### Overview

The Department of Military and Veterans Affairs is responsible for the training and administration of Army and Air National Guard forces, providing combat-ready military forces during times of national emergency, and performing civil relief operations under the command of the governor during state emergencies. The Department's budget includes administrative and maintenance costs associated with these responsibilities as well as several National Guard-related programs such as the Challenge Program and the National Guard Education Assistance Program. The Department has oversight over the following veterans-related programs: state-licensed nursing care at veterans homes in Grand Rapids and Marquette, grant funding to veterans service organizations, and the Michigan Veterans Trust Fund.

<b>5. Military Training Sites and Support Facilities</b>				
Exec. Rec. increases \$2.0 million in federal revenue for various maintenance and support projects; decreases \$1.5million in restricted funds by removing the Regional Training Institute Fund, which was the Department's fund for collecting rental fees for use of the Regional Training Institute in Battle Creek. Federal funds will now be used in place of these rental fees for maintenance of the Regional Training Institute. Also decreases \$350,000 GF/GP for the National Guard Education Assistance Program to reflect actual expenditures. Senate concurs and decreases an additional \$400,000 GF/GP for the National Guard Education Assistance Program. <i>House concurs but decreases \$1,100,000 GF/GP from the Exec. Rec. for administrative efficiencies.</i>

**Major Boilerplate Changes From FY 2008-09**

**Sec. 203. Definitions/Acronyms - New House Language**

*House adds a subsection (j) adding the VSO acronym.*

**Sec. 236. Department Expenditure Transparency - New House Language**

*House adds this new section allowing the department to use no more than \$10,000 to develop, post, and maintain expenditure information on a publicly accessible Internet site.*

**Sec. 236. FTE Report - New House Language**

House adds this new section requiring the department to provide a report on the number of FTEs in pay status by civil service classification.

**Sec. 501. Veterans Service Organizations - Modified House Language**

Senate deletes this entire section. House retains Sec. 501 with additional provisions for the VSOs

**Sec. 233. GF/GP Lapse Estimates - New Senate Language**

Senate adds this new section requiring the department to provide a report showing GF/GP lapse estimates at the close of the fiscal year. House concurs.

**Sec. 234. Unused GF/GP - New Senate Language**

Senate adds this new section requiring any lapsed GF/GP funds to be transferred to the Special Maintenance - State line item for repairing and maintaining armories. House does not concur.

**Sec. 604. Grand Rapids Veterans' Home Feasibility Study - New Senate Language**

Senate adds this new section requiring the department to prepare a feasibility study for converting state employee resident care aid positions to contractual positions. House does not concur.

**Sec. 707. Benefits Counseling - New Senate Language**

Senate adds this new section for the department to develop and operate benefits counseling and representation for veterans. House does not concur.

**Sec. 205. Hiring Freeze**

Exec. Rec. deletes hiring freeze directive for all state agencies. Senate does not concur. House does not concur.

**Sec. 207. Privatization**

Exec. Rec. deletes privatization project plan requirement. Senate concurs. House does not concur.

**Sec. 211. Reports and Records Retention**

Exec. Rec. deletes reports and records retention requirements. Senate does not concur. House does not concur.

**Sec. 212. Michigan National Guard Education Assistance Program - MODIFIED**

Exec. Rec. changes the amount available for this program from \$1.1 million to \$750,000 to reflect actual expenditures. Senate eliminates this entire section. House retains current year language but changes amount to \$100 as a placeholder.

**Sec. 213. Armory Closures**

Exec. Rec. deletes requirement for the Department to consult with both appropriations subcommittees on planned closures of National Guard armories. Senate does not concur. House does not concur.

**Sec. 214. Military Cemeteries**

Exec. Rec. deletes legislative intent for funding state military cemeteries in Crawford and Dickinson counties. Senate does not concur. House does not concur.

**Sec. 223. Information Technology Work Projects**

Exec. Rec. deletes allowing information technology projects for work project designation. Senate does not concur. House does not concur.

**Sec. 226. Employee Disciplinary Action**

Exec. Rec. deletes requirement for the Department not to take disciplinary action for an employee that communicates with the Legislature or legislative staff. Senate does not concur. House does not concur.

**Sec. 227. Sale of Department Property**

Exec. Rec. deletes notification requirement for the sale of any Department property. Senate does not concur. House does not concur.

**Secs. 229 and 230. Regional Training Institute**

Exec. Rec. deletes these two sections for the Regional Training Institute and its revolving account. Senate concurs. House concurs.

**Sec. 231. Policy Change Reporting Requirement**

Exec. Rec. deletes requirement for the Department to report specific policy changes. Senate concurs. House concurs.

**Sec. 232(1). Federal Contingency Funds**

Exec. Rec. changes federal contingency amount from \$5.0 million to \$10.0 million. Senate concurs. House concurs.

**Sec. 233. County Veteran's Counselor**

Exec. Rec. deletes legislative intent for the Department to create incentives for counties to fund at least one veterans counselor. Senate does not concur but renumbers this to Sec. 705. House concurs.

**Sec. 234. Federal Benefits Claims Status**

Exec. Rec. deletes legislative intent for the Department to investigate methods for allowing veterans to check their federal benefits claims. Senate concurs. House concurs.

**Sec. 237. Employee Travel Restrictions**

Exec. Rec. deletes Department travel restrictions for employees. Senate concurs. *House concurs.*

**Sec. 301. Armory Rental Fees**

Exec. Rec. deletes allowing Department to charge rental and equipment usage fees for armories. Senate does not concur. *House does not concur.*

**Sec. 601. Veterans Home Appropriations**

Exec. Rec. deletes requirement for appropriations to both veterans' homes to be used only for veterans and their families. Senate does not concur. *House does not concur.*

**Sec. 602. Annual Veterans' Homes Report**

Exec. Rec. deletes requirement for an annual report on various information for the two veterans' homes. Senate does not concur. *House does not concur.*

**Sec. 604. Post and Posthumous Funds Spending Plan**

Exec. Rec. deletes reporting requirement for the Department prior to altering the spending plan for the post and posthumous funds. Senate concurs. *House does not concur.*

**Sec. 704. County Veterans Counselors Training**

Exec. Rec. deletes requirement for county veterans counselors to receive training. Senate does not concur. *House does not concur.*
