**OVERVIEW**

The Executive recommended supplemental for Capital Outlay projects totals \$35,658,500. Of that total, \$35,658,200 is state restricted revenue from the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund for projects recommended by the Trust Fund Board, and \$300 is state GF/GP for capital outlay construction projects. The construction projects were approved for planning in Public Act 278 of 2008. Construction authorization in this supplemental bill will allow the projects to move to the final design and construction phase. The state share of construction costs will be funded through the State Building Authority.

**NATURAL RESOURCES**

**1. Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund**

Includes an additional \$35.7 million for 25 land acquisition projects and 42 land development projects supported with revenues from the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund (MNRTF). The MNRTF provides financial assistance to local units of government and to the Department of Natural Resources for the purchase of lands for outdoor recreation, for protection of natural resources and open space, and for development of land for public outdoor recreation. The MNRTF is supported with revenues from state-owned oil and gas mineral resources. These projects were approved by the MNRTF Board on December 2, 2009. **2. Michigan Technological University - Great Lakes Research Center**

The project received planning authorization in Public Act 278 of 2008. The total authorized project cost is \$25,337,000, to be financed \$18,750,000 by the state and \$6,587,000 by the university. The 49,466 sq. ft. building will include aquatic research laboratories, coastal research instrumentation, computational research center, research vessel deployment and maintenance facilities, offices, and meeting rooms for extension/coordination activities. The estimated completion date is November 2011. (11/2/09 SBO letter)

**3. Oakland University - Human Health Building**

The project received planning authorization in Public Act 278 of 2008. The total authorized project cost is \$61,748,100, to be financed \$40.0 million by the state and \$21,748,100 by the university. The new 160,260 sq. ft. building will provide state-of-the-art instructional, research, and practice space for the School of Nursing and School of Health Sciences. The building will feature clinical laboratories, computer labs, simulation labs, distance learning, an interactive media center, classrooms, seminar rooms, and faculty and administration space. The estimated completion date is May 2012. (11/2/09 SBO letter)

**4. Washtenaw Community College - Skilled Trades Training Program Renovations**

The project received initial planning authorization for construction of a new complex in Public Act 278 of 2008 for a total project cost of \$16.0 million. The project's scope and cost authorization were revised to instead provide for renovations and building system upgrades to two existing instructional buildings in PA 64 of 2009. The new authorized project cost is \$14.8 million, to be financed \$7.4 million by the state and \$7.4 million by the college. Renovations to the Occupational Education Building include a new green roof, which will enable upgrades to the mechanical, electrical, lighting, and ceiling systems of the building. Also, renovations to interior space will allow expansion of the radiography and HVAC programs. The estimated completion date is August 2011. The Skilled Trades Annex will be renovated to provide new classroom and lab instructional space including hydraulics, pneumatics, advanced manufacturing, and tensile strength labs, classroom spaces, and faculty offices. Requires appropriations for projects not spent by fiscal year-end to continue to be available for the projects for up to three years. After the three years, unexpended balances are required to revert back to the MNRTF and to be made available for appropriation. (1/6/10 SBO letter)

**3. Bay City State Police Post - Cost Increase**

The project was authorized for construction in Public Act 278 of 2008 with an estimated total project cost of \$2,889,000. Additional project site costs were identified at the time construction was authorized, and an increase is necessary to provide for site development expenses including excavation, utility connections, drainage, asphalt paving, and perimeter fencing. This boilerplate section increases the authorized cost of the project by \$311,000, bringing the total project cost to \$3,200,000. (6/10/09 SBO letter)
